## WENTWORTH MONUMENT, TURNPIKE

- WENTWORTH, Elder William. Founder of the family in North America; baptized, Alford Lincoln, England, 1615; arrived Boston, 1636, died Dover, 1697. His farm granted in 1652, extended to Garrison Hill. His unmarked grave is in cemetery 800 yards west of this monument. From him came the Royal Governors: John Wentworth, Lieutenant Governor, 1717-1730; Benning Wentworth, Governor, 1741-1767; and John Wentworth, Governor, 1767-1775; also, John Wentworth, Speaker of the House, 1771-1775.



## A List of Cemetery Records in the New Hampshire Historical Society

WILLIAM COPELEY\*

Since the early years of the present century, the New Hampshire Historical Society has been collecting gravestone inscriptions from cemeteries throughout the state. These stones often bear information not available from any other source. Aside from obtaining names and dates of birth and death, one can frequently infer other facts, such as place of residence and the names and dates of other family members. Genealogists, local historians, and demographers alike can profit from the field work represented by these compilations.

While cemetery records ordinarily tell little about the gravestones themselves, such records may prove useful in leading researchers to particular stones. Gravestones are increasingly recognized as important artistic documents, representing one of the earliest forms of American sculpture and revealing, through their symbolism, religious and social attitudes of the American people.

The list which follows is an inventory of the New Hampshire cemetery records at the New Hampshire Historical Society. Each individual cemetery or burial plot for which inscriptions have been copied is included. The arrangement is by towns, according to the present town boundaries. In general, the cemetery records themselves provide a more detailed location for each burial ground. Towns for which the Society has no records are not included.

In most cases, the name given to each cemetery is the same as that found in the compiled records. The only deviation from this rule is in the case of family plots, for example "Cate family" or "Clark

15. Mrs. George St. Loe (Anne Browne) (1738-c.1819) Daughter of Rev. Arthur Browne of Queen's Chapel. Dated 1758. Probably painted in Boston. *Munson Proctor Institute, Utica, New York*.

The following portraits were examined by Messrs. Morgan and Foote in 1937 and were affirmed to be by Blackburn. Their present locations are unknown.

16. Mrs. Nathaniel Barrell. Wife of a prominent merchant. Dated 1761.
17. Elizabeth Browne (1741-1813). Daughter of Rev. Arthur Browne, and wife of Major Robert Rogers of Rogers' Rangers. Dated 1761.
18. Mrs. Samuel Cutts (Anna Holyoke) Wife of merchant Samuel Cutts. Probably 1762 or 1763 (see No. 14 above).
19. George Jaffrey (1717-1802). Merchant and loyalist.
20. Mrs. George Jaffrey (Lucy Winthrop) (1721-1776).



(two stones)." A listing following either of these forms indicates that only members of the given family are buried at that location. To save space, the word "cemetery" has been omitted from most names. Synonymous terms such as "yard" and "burying ground" have been retained.

The New Hampshire Historical Society accepts cemetery records from a variety of sources — genealogists and members of patriotic societies as well as interested citizens trying to preserve a bit of the past. With this in mind, the user of these records will do well to be alert to possible errors in transcription. Also, the fact that a cemetery is listed here does not necessarily mean that all gravestones in it have been copied. Weathering of the stones, overgrown vegetation and vandalism have undoubtedly resulted in many omissions.

This list was originally prepared at the request of officers of the Association of Historical Societies of New Hampshire for the interest of Association members and in the expectation that it would encourage contributions of unrecorded inscriptions to the Society's library. Additions to and corrections of this compilation will be gratefully received by the Society.

## Reviews of Books

*The Battle of Bunker's Hill.* John R. Elting. (Monmouth Beach, N. J.: Philip Freneau Press, 1975. Pp. 56, \$10.95)

Another book about Bunker Hill? That subject has stimulated countless monographs and articles — so many, in fact, that the contest on the Charlestown Peninsula is probably the most-written-about battle of the Revolutionary War. Much of the nineteenth-century literature was parochial and partisan. Historical conflicts flared over the respective contributions of Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New Hampshire troops, and over the respective achievements of Joseph Warren, Israel Putnam, and William Prescott in that famous encounter. More recent investigators, especially Harold Murdock and Allen French, have risen above the pedantry and provided us with clearer, more accurate accounts of Bunker Hill. Even so, as the late Bernard Knollenberg wrote in 1960, there remain unanswered questions about the battle.

Consequently, there is ample room for this new study by John R. Elting, who has not only a scholarly background but a long professional military career. Colonel Elting is not unmindful of the controversies, nor does he pretend to have resolved them all. What he does, however, is to point out in very readable prose what we do know and what continues to be uncertain.

Probably the biggest mystery will always be why the patriot forces from General Artemas Ward's command halted and entrenched on Breed's Hill rather than on Bunker Hill, which would have been more defensible and more easily evacuated. The evidence is contradictory. Although the Massachusetts Committee of Safety had specified Bunker Hill as the objective to be occupied, Colonel Prescott
