State of North Carolina } At a County court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions began
Burke County { and held for said County at Morganton on the third
Monday of January Anno Domini 1789 and XIIIth year of our Independence.

Present the worshipfull Joseph McDowell Esquire and his associate Justices of Said County. The attorney for the State in the aforesaid County prefered a Bill of Indictment against James Allen Ross in the following words. To wit:

Burke County January Session 1789

The Jurors for the State and County aforesaid upon their Oath Present that James Allen Ross late of said County (labourer) on the tenth day of June in the Year 1899 with force and arms in the County aforesaid one bit made of iron and crop of Six pence value the property of Isaac Frik then and there being found feloniously did steal, take and carry away to the injury of the Said Frik and against the peace and dignity of Said State.

The foreman returned thereon a True Bill Signed James Lacke Foreman -----
Upon this Indictment the defendant James Allen Ross was called and after being charged Plead Not Guilty ---- when the Court ordered the Sheriff to Summon a Jury to try the said Issue----

And after being duly sworn do find the defendant James Allen Ross Guilty of the petit Larceny in manner and form as charged in the Bill of Indictment. Upon which the Court Ordered that the said James Allen Ross receive thirty nine lashes on his bare back and that the Sheriff put the same in Execution Between the hours of three and four this afternoon. Upon which the defendant James Allen Ross being dissatisfied with the judgement of the said Court Prayed an appeal to Morgan Superior Court of Law and Court of Equity to be held on the first Day of March next which was granted and gave Bond with approved Security.



William A. Hoke, the son of John Franklin Hoke and Catherine Wilson Alexander, was born at Lincolnton on October 25, 1851; educated at private schools; he studied law and was admitted to the bar in 1872. He was State Senator in 1889, and Judge of the North Carolina Superior Court 1891-1904; elected to the North Carolina Supreme Court, taking his seat on January 1, 1905, and re-elected in 1912. William A. Hoke, Democrat, of Lincoln County, was born at Lincolnton, North Carolina on October 25, 1851.

Hoke was also a member Society of the Cincinnati. LLE from the University of North Carolina. Married Mary McBee on December 16, 1897.²

- (2) **Rev. R.Z. Johnston** a local Lincolnton minister. Rev. R.Z. Johnston was the father of Rufus Zenas Johnston (June 7, 1874 – July 4, 1959) His son was born in Lincolnton, North Carolina. He graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1895. He received the Medal of Honor for actions at the United States occupation of Veracruz, 1914. He is buried in Arlington National Cemetery. Johnston is also a recipient of the Navy Cross served in the Battle of Santiago de Cuba, Boxer Rebellion, Philippine-American War and World War I.³
- (3) **Alfred Nixon** (1856-1924) Alfred Nixon held positions as Superintendent of Public Instruction and Clerk of Court for Lincoln County. He was the featured speaker at many dedications, commemorations, festival, and special events in Lincoln County from the 1880s to the 1920s. He recorded from 1877 to 1899 many of this experiences, thoughts, and day-to-days responsibilities as Sheriff, County Surveyor, and Historian in diaries. In addition, he was a prolific researcher and writer who published manuscripts on the history of Lincoln County, Lincoln County's Confederate Veterans and their contributions to the southern war effort, numerous Lincoln County families such as the Finger family and Hager family, and a myriad of speeches and addresses he delivered before the United Daughters of the Confederacy, United Confederate Veterans, and the Anna Jackson Club.⁴
- (4) **Oliver Max Gardner** March 22, 1882 – February 6, 1947 was an American politician who served as the 57th Governor of the U.S. state of North Carolina from 1929 to 1933. A member of the Democratic Party, Gardner worked in the administrations of President Franklin Delano Roosevelt and Harry S. Truman.

Born in Shelby, North Carolina, Gardner was orphaned at a young age. His parents were Oliver Perry and Margaret Young Gardner. He attended North Carolina State University on a scholarship, where he majored in chemical engineering, was involved in ROTC, played on the football team, managed the baseball team, served as the senior class president, and maintained active membership in Sigma Nu Fraternity. He later taught organic chemistry on campus after graduating in 1903. He then enrolled at

the University of North Carolina School of Law, where he also played football. Gardner distinguished himself off the football field as well, becoming one of the most respected members of The Dialectic and Philanthropic Societies at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.⁵

GRANDSON OF VET '76 DIES IN THE COUNTY

George T. (W.) Heafner, Grandson of a Soldier of The Revolution Passes
at Age of 94 Years-Confederate Veteran and Farmer

George T. (W.) Heafner, one of this county's oldest citizens, died at his home four miles west of Lincolnton Monday evening at 7 o'clock. He lacked only ten days living 94 years, his 94th anniversary being on January 27th. He was a well-known Lincoln County, North Carolina farmer, and was born and reared in Lincoln County. For a number of years he lived in Cleveland County, North Carolina, where he engaged in farming. He engaged for a few years in contracting work for the G.C. & N. Railway. He served in the Confederate Army in Capt. A.S. Haynes Company.

The deceased was one of the few surviving grandsons of a Revolutionary War soldier in this county, he being the grandson of Nicholas Heafner, patriot in the Revolutionary War.

He was married Dec 4, 1856, to Miss Louisa Carpenter of Cleveland County, North Carolina. To this union were born five sons and two daughters, the surviving sons are C.M. Heafner, of this County. J.M. Heafner, Crouse; daughters, Mrs. Sarah Sain, Mecklenburg County; Mrs. Ida Sain, Crouse. Three deceased sons are John, Theodore and Pink Heafner. There are 45 grandchildren and 12 great grandchildren.

The funeral services were conducted Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, from Pleasant Grove Methodist Church of which deceased was a member, by Rev. J.E.B. Houser and Rev. Mr. Fitzgerald. Burial was in the Pleasant Grove Cemetery.

The pallbearers were the following grandsons, D.H. Johnson, Lloyd Saine, Hugh Heafner, Charlotte; S.Q. McCraw, Mt Holly; Yates Heafner, Winston Salem; Byron Heafner, Crouse.

NOTE: G.W. was the son of Teter and Elizabeth "Betsy" Farmer Heavner, residents of Cleveland County North Carolina from 1850 until their deaths prior to 1900. The Teter Heavner family resided in District 6, NW of the city of Shelby on the banks of the First Broad River and Harris Creek in the Double Shoals area. Teter Heavner died in January of 1886 and Elizabeth Betsy died est. 1900. Teter and Betsy had 5 sons who served in the Confederate Army.



The Jurors of the State and County aforesaid upon their Oath present that John Snowden Late of Said County Labourer on the [marked out with dark ink] being a seditious Man and a person of a depraved disposition and conversation and continuing practising and falsly and seditiously intending the peace of said State to molest and disturb on the fourth day of October in the Eleventh Year of American Independence Anno Dommini 1786 With force and arms in the County aforesaid having discourse then and there concerning our State and the Laws and authouraty Established therein within hearing of Divers Citizens of this state then and there being present Maliciously and Seditiously of our State and the Laws and authoureyty Established in the same did say and pronounce these melicious seditious and Aprobatons (English Words) following (that is to say) the said John Snowdon was a Tory meaning that he was an Enemy to the independence of the United States and the Laws and Authourities Established in the same and that he the said John Snowden would always suport that Cause Meaning the cause of Great Britain and Enemies to the United States and the Jurors further present that John Snowden in further prosecutions of his Malice towards the Establishment of our Independence (to wit) on the year and day aforesaid in the County aforesaid Melitiously and seditiously and with a loud voice did pronounce these English words I am a Tory and will ever maintain the Tory Cause to the Evil Example of all others in the Like case offending and against the peace and dignity of said state.

And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their Oath aforesaid, Present, that Thomas Buchannan, late of the County of Lincoln aforesaid, wheelwright, on the first Day of January in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty five, with Force and Arms in and upon one Nicholas Gosnell, being in the Peace of God and of said State, and being a Deputed Constable and then and there being in the actual Execution of his said office did make an assault, and then and there forcible and against the will of him the said Nicholas did rescue and take from and out of the possession of him the said Nicholas being a Deputed Constable so as aforesaid, one Rifle Gun and two feather Beds executed at the Suit of Stephen Senter. ----- by him the said Nicholas being a Deputed Constable as aforesaid and then and there other Wrongs to the said Nicholas, being a Deputed Constable as aforesaid, did to his great damage and against the Peace and Dignity of said State.
