

On this 7 day of July, AD 1902, personally appeared before me, W. J. Mode, JP, in and for the State and County aforesaid, J. W. CONNOR, age 58 years, and a resident of Uree post-office in said County and State, and who being duly sworn, makes the following declaration in order to obtain the pension under the provision of an act entitled "An Act to amend chapter 198 of the Laws of 1889, for the relief of certain Confederate Soldiers and Widows," ratified March 2, 1901: That he is the identical J. W. Conner, who enlisted in Co. F, 62 Reg. NC State Troops, on or about the 1 day of Oct, 1862, to serve in the armies of the Confederate States, and that while in said service at _____, in the State of _____, on or about the _____ day of _____, 186__, he received a wound or wounds, etc.

(Applicant will here state the nature and extent of his wounds and disability, so that a proper classification can be made under the new Pension Law passed by the General Assembly of 1901. Read said section of said law carefully, and to accomplish the classification therein called for, let statement here as to nature and extent of wounds, disability, etc., be very full and explicit).

Applicant states that he is unable to do manual labor by reason of Infirmities.

*Obituary of James Carson Elliott***Joined Army**

When Mr. Elliott was only 18 years old, he enlisted in the confederate Army and served until he was captured at Fort Stedman in March 1865. He served at New Bern, Plymouth and Petersburg and was wounded in one of the battles. His interesting book, "A Southern Soldier Boy," tells of his war experiences. He remembered the events of the war very clearly and enjoyed telling other people about them.

Mr Elliott has been a teacher in Gaston County where he became the first mayor of Cherryville. His death leaves ten other Confederate veterans in the county.

He was married on Dec. 5, 1872 to Miss Biddie Gettys, who died 38 years ago. To this union was born five sons and 4 daughters of whom the following survive; Plato J. Elliott of Polkville, Misses Lottie and Eugenia Elliott of Polkville, Mrs. David A. Beam of Lawndale, and Mrs. Rufus Bingham of Fallston. Also 14 grandchildren and 4 great grandchildren, a brother, W. D. Elliott lives at Lyons, GA, and a sister Mrs. M. L. White, lives at Polkville.

James Carson Elliott wrote what amounted to 'letters to the editor' to several area newspapers. The Charlotte Observer had a column called "The Open Forum: An Editorial Pad for the People" which accepted letters of not more than 500 words. Letters of more than 500 words were not printed quickly. 500 or less were "assured of expeditious publication."

Mr. Elliott also wrote to the Gastonia Gazette, the Cleveland Star, the Forest City Courier and others. The next time you visit BRGS's Archives be sure to read a few of his articles. They are collected in a bound book located in the family history section. JFS



Eric Emory born May 5, 1939 in N. Buncombe County has spent his entire life here with the exception of the four years he attended Brea College in Kentucky receiving his degree in Psychology. He retired from the County Health Department after thirty years of service. As a young man he had a dream and interest in the Civil War and the men who served from this area. He started in 1957 with some notes on the Civil War and he soon realized there was work to be done to honor the men who died. He decided, it was long past time that the dead be identified and honored with a memorial. He started a memorial fund and researched for over three years and finally in the month of November 2001, his dreams were realized and a memorial was put into place at the Smith McDowell Museum in Asheville. Mr. Emory has given his permission for us to publish the following list of the fallen soldiers from this area. His book has additional and detailed information including the cause of death of the soldiers. This book is for sale at the OBCGS Library.

Military records are an important source of information about our ancestors and their service to their state or nation. The NC State Archives is the best repository for military information in the state. Most of the military records are financial in nature and do not give much genealogical information. The collection is divided into the following war and dates:
