CHURCH HILL CHRISTIAN CHURCH CEMETERY
ELKRUN TOWNSHIP

The Church Hill Christian Church Cemetery is located in Section 9 of Elkrun Township, 1/4 mile due east of the intersection of Township Road #795 (Scroggs Rd) and Twp. Rd. #895 (Churchhill Rd.) The cemetery is maintained. Adjacent church building, although in need of repairs, is still being used by a small congregation. A sign there says "Churchhill Christian Church, A.D. 1871." The cemetery is approximately 180' x 180' in size.

History: Mack's History, page 136, tells of "the Bible-Christian Church of Elk Run. Services of this denomination were first held in Fairfield Twp. in 1822, but without forming a permanent society. Four years later, Rev. John Adams began preaching at the house of Joseph Paxson, at what is now known as Chamberlain's mills. In 1828 the Society built a meeting house, on what is now called Church Hill, on Section 9. It was a log building with no inside lining when first used. It had a loose floor, but no stove or fireplace. The room was warmed by a mass of charcoal set aglow in Joseph Paxson's iron kettle, around which the members sat on slab seats. In 1835 a frame house was built on the old foundation and was in use until 1872 when the present edifice was erected. The church has at present (1879) 125 members."

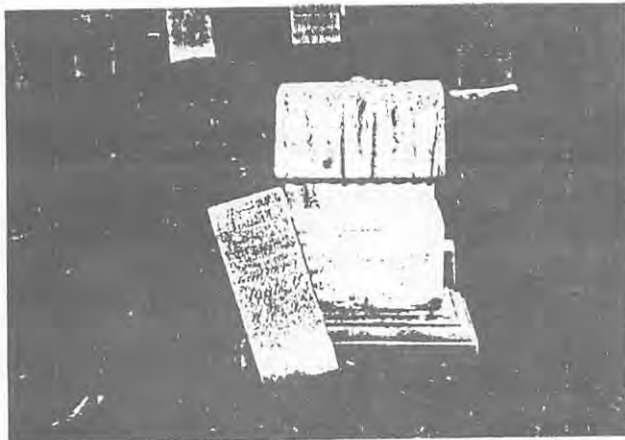

CHURCH HILL CONGREGATION TO MARK 128TH ANNIVERSARY

The 128th anniversary of the Church Hill Christian Church, located off Route 154 near Elkton, will be celebrated with special services Sunday. The principal services will be held at 2:30pm when former ministers are expected to attend. The speakers will include the Rev. W.A. HEWITT, pastor of the Calvary Methodist Church, and the Rev. JOHN Q. CALL of Wellsville, pastor of the Anderson Methodist Church. Sunday School will be at 10am and there will be preaching services at 11am by the Rev. LOUIS KLESLY of Columbiana, pastor. A coverdsh dinner will be served on the church lawn at 1pm. The historic church, established in 1826, was reopened about 5 years ago after having been abandoned for 21 years. Originally, it was operated by the Christian Church but since its reopening in 1949 has been conducted as a non-denominational organization. MRS. A.C. LANG of East Liverpool headed the movement for the reopening of the church. She was assisted by Mr. & Mrs. JESS CHEDISTER and other persons living in the community. Broken windows were replaced, new furnishings installed and other repairs were made to make the structure usable again. The present building is the third to occupy the site, the first having been a log structure. Painters started this week on the exterior of the building but scores of holes made by woodpeckers had to be closed. The Ladies Aid Society plan to redecorate the interior later. Officers of the church elected recently include JOHN ABEL, president; DON FRANKLIN, Sunday School superintendent; JOSEPH CHEDISTER, assistant superintendent; MRS. JOSEPH CHEDISTER, secretary; VERN JACKSON, treasurer, and JOHN WINTERS, custodian. The church cemetery which adjoins the building contains the graves of five Civil War veterans. Prison site will cover abandoned cemetery

WARREN — Carol Bell, genealogist at the Warren Public Library, said a piece of her ancestral history could be destroyed if a federal prison planned for Columbiana County is built.

Bell said her distant relatives are buried there, relatives she shares with Columbiana County Treasurer Ardel Strabala.

"They're just waiting and hoping that nobody comes forward and says anything," she said. "I just feel that they'll be wiping out a part of the history of the county."

Bell said she learned of the planned 900-acre site of the prison through newspaper articles. At first, Bell said, she believed the original boundaries didn't reach the Church Hill Cemetery on Church Hill Road.

Later maps, Bell said, showed the prison land would extend to and cover the cemetery.

"When I read it I get so mad," Bell said.

Columbiana County Commissioner William Gotschall said the commissioners have been assured by U.S. Bureau of Prisons officials that the cemetery will not be disturbed.

"We have told them we don't want the cemetery involved in the construction and the prison bureau has always been willing to accommodate in situations like that in the past," Gotschall said.

He said he wouldn't know the exact boundaries of the site until an environmental impact study is completed. However, he said he was certain the prison would be set "hundreds of yards" away from the cemetery.

Gotschall said the study will be completed within six to nine months.

Some residents have voiced concern over the possible disturbance of the cemetery, but he said "it hasn't been a major concern."

Strabala, Bell's distant cousin, said he plans no action until he sees whether the cemetery will be disturbed.

"There is nothing set in stone," he said. "Until those boundaries are set I haven't really done anything about it."

He said he was aware that his great grandparents are buried at Church Hill, but he would wait until an environmental impact study was done.

"This is the only position I can take at this time until the area is determined," he said.

Bell said she doesn't believe that Church Hill cemetery will be safe.

She said the site was supposed to be 900 acres and then the acreage was increased.

"Initially (officials) said 900 acres then later 1,800 acres. Where are they going to take it from?" she asked.

She said a state mandate regarding abandoned cemeteries require township officials have the bodies removed and reburied at township expense. It also requires that all next of kin have to be notified and reply within 30 days.

Strabala said the expense had been anticipated.

"With the county purchasing the property to donate to the federal government for the prison, there may be money from a state grant to remove those bodies," he said. Since the cemetery had been allowed to fall into disrepair — the church beside it burned in 1988 and gravestones have been overturned — moving the graves may not be so bad, he added.
