WHERE SLEEP THE BRAVE
Who Sank to Rest, by All Their Country's Wishes Bless'd?

The United States government has made arrangements to provide headstones for all soldiers who died during and since the war who are not now provided with anything durable to mark their last resting places; but to do this it is necessary to have the cooperation of friends of the deceased, Superintendents of cemeteries and all who can contribute any information for the proper marking of the stones. It is desired that the name be given in full, the regiment and the company of which the soldier was a member, the date of his death and the cemetery in which he is buried. A partial list has already been made (which we give below) of the soldiers of Cuyahoga county, but it is incomplete in many respects and any person, whether personally interested or not, is earnestly requested to send any information within his or her knowledge on the subject and also correct any errors in the list given herewith. The list from Middleburgh township does not give the company or date of death and the Erie street Cemetery list is lacking in all points except name. And on all others where space is left blank information is desired. The lists of Woodland Cemetery and Monroe street Cemetery are being prepared but the Cemetery Superintendents are unable to give all the information required. Therefore let each one who can aid in this laudable work give it a little attention immediately and send anything pertaining to the subject to M. R. Hughes, County Auditor's office.
