**An Elopement.** Flint, a little village bordering on the Delaware and Franklin county line, was the scene last Friday of a sensational elopement. Last summer a

young man named Russell Sellman hired out as a farm hand to a German farmer named Schneider. He had not been at work long until an attachment which culminated in love, sprang up between a young daughter of the family and Sellman. Matters went on smoothly for a while, until the parents noticed the growing attachment, and not being favorably impressed with it, discharged the man. This, however, did not have the effect desired for Sellman immediately went to Columbus, and after securing work, managed to keep up a secret correspondence with the object of his affections, and the result was tha (sic) an elopement was planned. Last Friday Sellman drove to Flint where he met the girl, and the two by rapid driving soon reached the friendly shores of the Ohio River, after crossing which they were soon made one by an accommodating J.P. in Covington. The enraged father on learning that his daughter had fled, at once went to Columbus to enlist the help of the police in hunting down the truants. A detective went to Flint Saturday to get some clue to work on, but when he got there found that the couple had returned and were happily under the paternal roof. (August 2, 1887 - pg. 4 col 5)

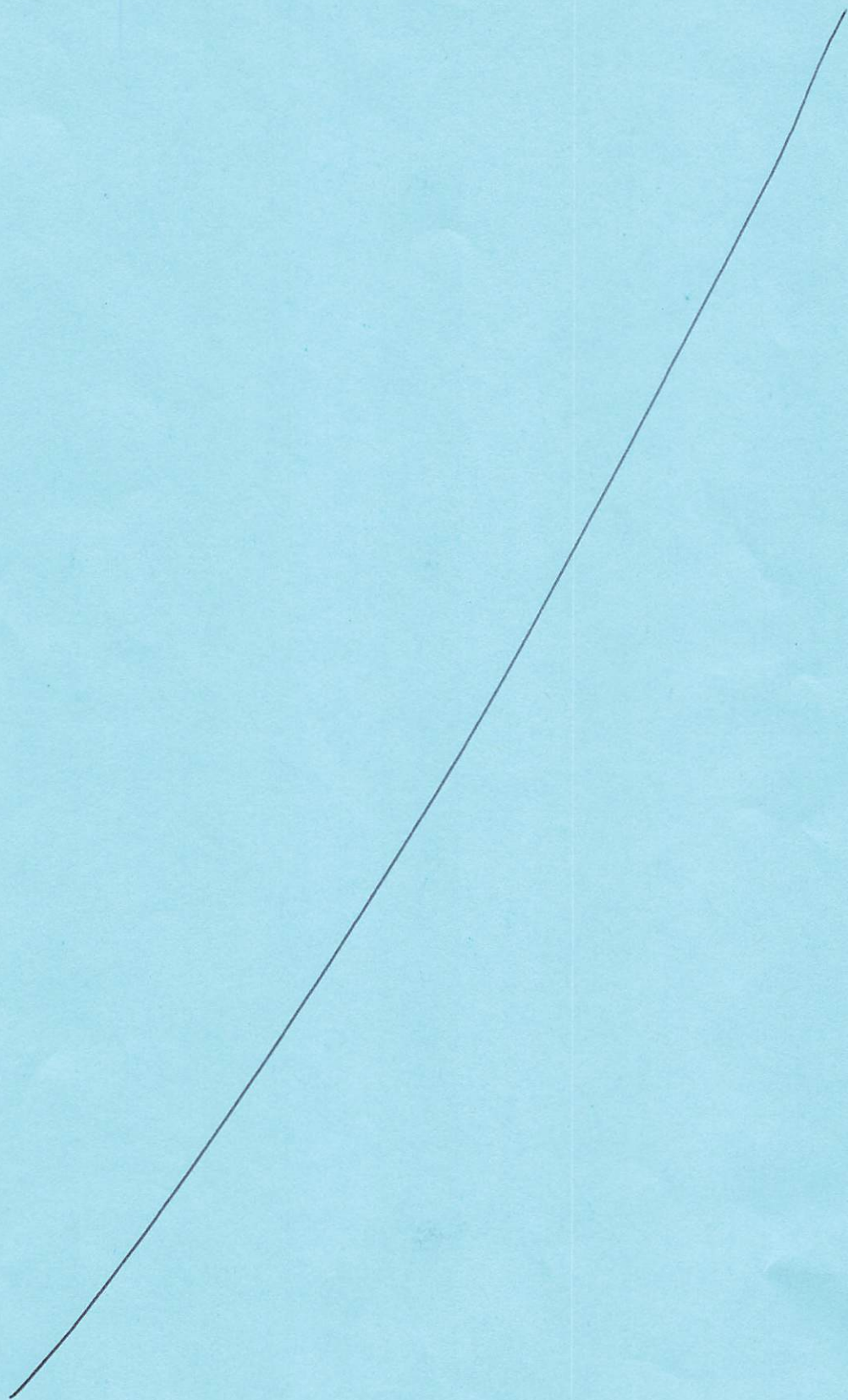

Pierse one of the subscribing witnesses to the (writing) and foregoing Last Will and Testament of Daniel Thomas late of said county deceased, personally appeared before the Clerk of the Common Pleas of Madison County in the State of Indiana and being duly sworn by the Clerk of said Court upon his oath declared and testified as follows that is to say: that on the 7th day of January 1865 he saw Daniel Thomas sign his name to said instrument in writing as and for his Last Will and Testament, and that this deponent at the same time heard the said Daniel Thomas declare the said instrument in writing to be his Last Will and Testament and that the instrument in writing was at the same time at the request of the said Daniel Thomas and with his consent attested and subscribed by the said W. R. Pierse and N. L. Wickersharn in the presence of the said testator and in the presence of each other as subscribing witnesses thereto, and that the said Daniel Thomas was at the time of the signing and subscribing of said instrument in writing as aforesaid of full age. (That is more than twenty one years of age and of sound and disposing mind and memory and not under any coercion or restraint as the said deponent verily believes and further deponent says not.

Editor's note: In Esther Weygandt Powell's book, Tombstone Inscriptions and other Records of Delaware County, Ohio, 1972, p. 296, the entry for Daniel Thomas reads d. Jan. 8, 1865, aged 24y 8m. He is listed next to Griffith Thomas, d1 Feb. 15, 1864, aged 73y and Sarah, wife, d. Arpil 2, 1857, aged 68 y. This is in Troy Township, Marlborough Churchyard. (Daniel calls it Coles Cemetery in his will.)

According to Powell's book, "Marlborough Baptist Church was originally located just south of the present line of Troy Township, and about 1¼ miles west of the northeast corner of the township. Because the location comes within the area affected by the Delaware dam on the Olentangy, the church and graveyard have been moved to a point farther south and are now located at the northeast corner of the cross-road about ¼ mile west of the township line between Troy and Oxford Townships. This is a large cemetery, with many modern stones, and is still in active use. The oldest stones are just east of the church and all stones are said to be located in relatively the same positions as in the original plot."
