Most of these people were the *HEADS* of families in Licking County by 1820, but were not listed on the 1820 Federal Census. Their names were found in Hill's History of Licking County, Utter's "Granville", and some early Land and Marriage records, and completed "Pioneer Forms." The Pioneer File is used to provide information on the Pioneers of LC.

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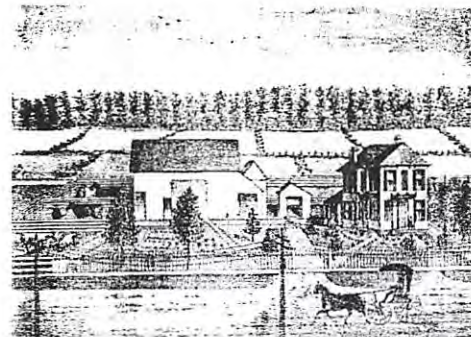

and never put any in my ears afterwards. It was very hard for me to give them up, as I did not care for any jewelry so much as ear-rings.

Sometime after that Brother Mitchell was sent to Newark. I happened to be there one day when he was going to have a wedding at the parsonage. I was invited to remain to see it. In due time the party drove up to the door in a spring-wagon. They came in carrying a band-box. The lady asked if she could have a room in which to dress. She had on a calico dress and a sun-bonnet, but when she was ready to be married she was dressed in a black silk dress, trimmed in narrow white lace, and a bonnet all trimmed in white ribbon and flowers. Mrs. Mitchell's sister Olive, was visiting there at the time, and we were both very much amused at the performance. They marched out and stood in front of Brother Mitchell while he said the words that made them one for life. Then when he made the little prayer they both dropped on their knees before him. 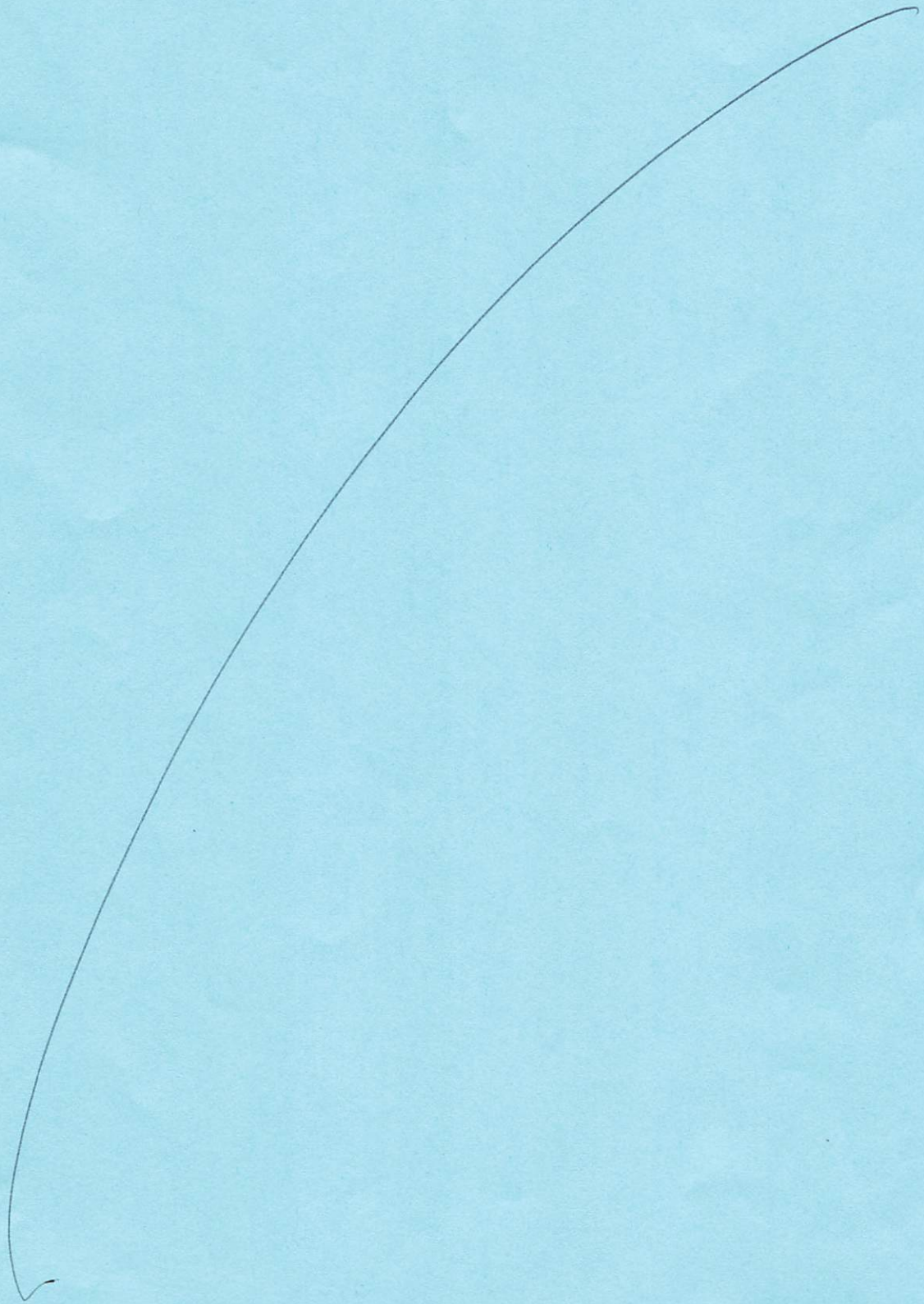

C. C. Weakley Shoots Self
Resident of near Fallsburg dies of
Bullet Wound

Clement C. Weakley, 30 son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles W. Weakley of near Fallsburg, died Saturday afternoon of a self-inflicted gunshot wound in the head, according to an investigation made by Dr. G. W. Sapp, corner, and L. D. Hague, sheriff.

Weakley, ill for some time but able to be about, had been hunting rabbits with three Priest boys, all brothers. Returning, they parted near Weakley's home, two of the boys taking the road to go to their home and Everett J. Priest, 13, deciding to cut across a field to bring in the cows. Shortly after he walked away he saw a rabbit on a stump and just as he was about to fire at it he heard the report of a gun, and looking back he saw Weakley fall. He summoned help but death had been instantaneous. The charge from a .22 caliber long rifle had entered the right side of his head above the ear.

His parents, six brothers and three sisters survive; Clarence and Clifford of Centerburg; Carl of Newark; Clyde of Black Run; Cary and Clair of Fallsburg; Mrs. Wilbur Stricker and Miss Martha Weakley of Newark, and Mrs. Albert Houman of Fallsburg; Mrs. Sarah Priest of Fallsburg is the grandmother of the deceased.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday at 2 p.m. in Fallsburg church and burial will be made in Fallsburg cemetery.
