

The ledger is arranged by township with individual entries listed alphabetically by the first letter of the surname. The information given includes: name; age; amount paid before Sept. 16, 1865; paid or collected after Sept. 15, 1865, with penalty; and commission allowed for collecting. To conserve space, the columns have been meshed into two: Name and Remarks. All payments of \$4.00 were made before Sept. 16; payments of \$5.20 were made after after Sept. 15; and commissions collected were \$0.80.

## Memorial Resolutions of the Society of the Army of Tennessee

Report of the Proceedings of the Society of the Army of the Tennessee, at the Eighth Annual Meeting, Held at Springfield, Illinois, October 14th and 15th, 1874, pp. 234-235.

Major W. E. Peck was born in Chatham, Licking County, Ohio, June 19th, 1841, from which place his father, Doctor D. Peck, removed to the Territory of Iowa when Warren was yet a child, and from thence with his father and family came to Missouri and settled in Ironton, Iron County. On the breaking out of the rebellion he entered the army as a private and was promoted for meritorious conduct. At the close of the war he returned to his home at Ironton, was commissioned Major on the Governor's Staff, and was for a considerable time employed in the office of the Adjutant-General of the State, was married on 27th July, 1865, at the Arcadia College, to the daughter of Rev. J. C. Berryman, President of the College. On his return to Ironton he was elected Assessor of the County, and was acting as deputy Sheriff and collector, and was in the performance of his official duties at the time of his tragic death which occurred on the 12th of September, 1868. He had been spending a week in the western portion of the county, attending to his official duties, and returning homeward late Saturday afternoon in a buggy with Sheriff Mace they came to a small mountain stream, which had been suddenly swollen by a heavy rain. Not knowing the depth of the stream, nor calculating the rapidity of its current, and both being anxious to reach home that night, they drove into the turbulent water, only to have their buggy literally dashed and crushed to atoms in an instant, his companion. Captain Mace, barely saving his life, while Major Peck, the noble hearted gentleman, the devoted young husband and father, sank beneath the maddened waters of that usually harmless mountain rivulet from which his body, mangled and lifeless, was recovered and borne by friendly hands to the home of his sorrowing widowed wife and orphan children.



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### Some Mahoning County, Ohio Civil War Graves Registrations

The Grave Registrations of Mahoning County are found in 5 x7 file boxes in the lower level of the Recorder's Office in the Mahoning County courthouse, Youngstown, Ohio. The cards are arranged alphabetically under the names of the cemeteries in which the veterans are buried.

The WPA compiled the original file in the 1930s. Information on the cards varies, older cards include places of birth and death, sometimes the cause of death and/or the next of kin, and details of military service. All information on the cards is reproduced here including dates of enlistment and discharge if given. Some of the information appears to have been gleaned from readily accessible sources such as state rosters, the Henry Baldwin records, county histories, etc. Occasionally the town or township of burial is given, with no cemetery name. These files are not complete of course, especially for veterans of early wars. Some veterans whose tombstone inscriptions attest to military service are not represented in the files. Many of the dates given do not match the inscriptions on the stones; and in cases where the dates obviously came from the stone, the inscription was sometimes read incorrectly.

The cards of the men listed below are filed in a box labeled "Unknown," indicating that the cemetery was not known when the card was filled out.

Order of Information: Name, address, birth date, burial date, place, unit of service, enlistment and discharge dates, rank if given and next of kin. A double asterisk (\*\*) indicates no death date was recorded.

#### Newell E. Orcutt and James W. Foley, 9<sup>th</sup> Independent Battery, Ohio Volunteer Artillery

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General Orders, No. 6
Hdqrs. Dept. of the Cumberland, Chattanooga, Tenn., January 6, 1864

It having been reported to these headquarters that, between 7 and 8 o'clock on the evening of the 23d ultimo, within 1 ½ miles of the village of Mulberry, Lincoln County, Tenn., a wagon which had become detached from a foraging train belonging to the Unites States was attacked by guerrillas, and the officer in command of the foraging party, First Lieutenant PORTER, Company A, Twenty-seventh Indiana Volunteers, the teamster, wagon-master, and two other soldiers who had been sent to load the train (the latter four unarmed), captured. They were immediately mounted and hurried off, the guerrillas avoiding the roads until their party was halted, about 1 o'clock in the morning, on the bank of Elk River, where the rebels stated they were going into camp for the night. The hands of the prisoners were then tied behind them, and they were robbed of everything of value about their persons. They were next drawn up in line, about 5 paces in front of their captors, and one of the latter, who acted as leader, commanded, "ready," and the whole party immediately fired upon them. One of the prisoners was shot through the head and killed instantly and three were wounded. Lieutenant PORTER was not hit. He immediately ran, was followed and fired upon three times by one of the party, and find, that he was about to be overtaken, threw himself over a precipice into the river, and succeeding in getting his hands loose, swan to the opposite side, and, although pursued to that side and several times fired upon, he, after twenty-four hours of extraordinary exertions and great exposure, reached a house, whence he was taken to Tullahoma, where he now lies in a critical situation. The others, after being shot, were immediately thrown into the river. Thus the murder of 3 men, Newell E. ORCUTT, Ninth Independent Battery Ohio Volunteer Artillery; John W. DROUGHT, Company H, Twenty-second Wisconsin Volunteers, and George W. JACOBS, Company D, Twenty-second Wisconsin Volunteers, was accomplished by shooting and drowning. The fourth, James W. FOLEY, Ninth Independent Battery Ohio Volunteer Artillery, is now lying in hospital, having escaped by getting his hands free while in the water.
