REMEMBER WHEN

Warren Tribune Chronicle, Nov. 7, 1943

RATION BOOK CALENDAR

MEATS, FATS, ETC. - Three Brown Stamps G, H, J, K valid thru Dec. 4. Stamp L also valid now, thru Jan. 1; Stamp M, good Nov. 28; N, Dec. 5; P, Dec. 21; all expire Jan. 1.

PROCESSED FOODS - Book Four Green Stamps A, B and C valid thru Dec. 20.

SUGAR - Stamp 29 in Book 4 good for five pounds thru Jan. 15, 1944.

SHOES - Stamp 18 in Book 1 good for one pair until further notice. No. 1 "Airplane" stamp in Book 3 good for one pair until further notice.

GASOLINE - Stamp A-9 good for three gallons thru Jan. 21. B and C stamps good for two gallons until used.

TIRES - Next inspection due: A Book vehicles by March 31, 1944; B's Feb. 29; C's by Nov. 30; Commercial vehicles every six months or every 5,000 miles, whichever is first.

FUEL OIL - Period 1 coupon for new season good for 10 gallons in all zones thru Jan. 3, 1944. All change-making coupons and reserve coupons are now good.

STOVES - Certificates to purchase most heating and cooking stoves that burn coal, wood, oil or gas must now be obtained from local board.

LIQUOR - Sixth period lasts until Dec. 1 and includes bonus of rum, brandy or cordials.

Deed of Emancipation

James H. Tanner

To

Isaac Coles

Know all men by these presents that I James H. Tanner of the City of Richmond in the State of Virginia have manumitted emancipated and set free and by these presents do manumit emancipate and set free a negro Man named Isaac Coles a shoemaker by trade who was sold and delivered to me by Archibald Vaughn trustee for James M. Jackson as by his bill of sale of the 30th May 1846 with the assent of the said James M. Jackson thereon written more fully appears and I do hereby declare him the said Isaac to be entirely liberated from Slavery and entitled to all the rights and privileges of a free person with which it is in my power to vest him. He the said Isaac Coles hereby emancipated is of dark complexion about five feet eight inches in height and will be 41 years old the 1st April next.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13th day of April 1847.

Venable of the County of Prince Edward and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and fifty Dollars to me in hand paid by Isaac Coles of Pennsylvania (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Manumitted and set free and emancipated and do hereby Emancipate and set free from Slavery my negro Woman Icey Coles (wife of said Isaac Coles) aged about forty years And I do hereby give grant release unto the said Icey Coles all my right title and claim of in and to her person labor and services and of in and to all the estate and property which she may hereafter acquire or obtain.

Witness my hand and seal this thirty first day of July in the year Eighteen Hundred and fifty one.

Venable, of record in the clerks office of this county dated 21st July 1851 and entered of record the same day, this day appeared in court and is registered: She is aged about forty five years complexion brown with a scar on the left arm near the elbow occasioned by a burn, and a slight scar on the corner of the left elbow, five feet six inches high No. 425.

I Branch I Worsham clerk of the county court of Prince Edward in the Sate of Virginia do certify that the foregoing is a true copy from the records of the said court, made upon this original deed.
