Know all men by these presents that I James H. Tanner of the City of Richmond in the State of Virginia have manumitted emancipated and set free and by these presents do manumit emancipate and set free a negro Man named Isaac Coles a shoemaker by trade who was sold and delivered to me by Archibald Vaughn trustee for James M. Jackson as by his bill of sale of the 30th May 1848 with the assent of the said James M. Jackson thereon written more fully appears and I do hereby declare him the said Isaac to be entirely liberated from Slavery and entitled to all the rights and privileges of a free person with which it is in my power to vest him. He the said Isaac Coles hereby emancipated is of dark complexion about five feet eight inches in height and will be 41 years old the

Mary E. Venable Know all men by these presents that I Mary E. Venable of the County of Prince Edward and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and fifty Dollars to me in hand paid by Isaac Coles of Pennsylvania (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Manumitted and set free and emancipated and do hereby Emancipate and set free from Slavery my negro Woman loey Coles (wife of said Isaac Coles) aged about forty years And I do hereby give grant release unto the said Icey Coles all my right title and claim of in and to her person labor and services and of in and to all the estate and property which she may hereafter acquire or obtain.

Witness my hand and seal this thirty first day of July in the year Eighteen Hundred and fifty one.


Prince Edward County court derks office July 31st 1851: This deed of emancipation of Icey Coles was acknowledged by Mary E. Venable party thereto to be her act and deed and admitted to record D.Clerk Francis N Wathen (Code 512)/12

Virginia: At a court held for Prince Edward county the 19th day of August 1851 Icey Coles a person of colour emancipated by deed from Mary E. Venable, of record in the clerks office of this county dated 21st July 1851 and entered of record the same day, this day appeared in court and is registered: She is aged about forty five years complexion brown with a scar on the left arm near the elbow occasioned by a burn, and a slight scar on the corner of the left elbow, five feet six inches high No. 425.

I Branch I Worsham derk of the county court of Prince Edward in the Sate of Virginia do certify that the foregoing is a true copy from the records of the said court, made upon this original deed. Given under my hand with the seal of the court annexed this 19th day of August 1851. B.I. Worsham Cle.

Both these "Deeds of Emancipation" were brought into the Mahoning County Recorder's Office on Feb 17th 1858 and were recorded on Mar 9th 1858 by A.P. Flaugher, Recorder.
