In this section of the township, in the early eighteen hundreds, some of the people attended the Irville Church called the "Congregation of Licking". George Welsh and David Pierson donated land for a school, church and burial grounds in 1814. No doubt they were using the burial grounds, as there is a marker eligible in the cemetery dated 1810. The first death occurring in the Welsh family was a son, Robert, of Samuel and Rachel Welsh Cole.

The first church and school were primitive log structure erected about 1818. It was called the Muskingum Meeting House. In 1819 Irville's congregation attended, organized and called it "the Congregation of Muskingum Township." Besides the WELSH's and the PIERSON's families other early members included, ADAMS, BAIRD, BROWN, COLE, MCDONALD, MCCAN, and TRIMBLEY families.

MRS. SYLVANIA WELLS SCHAUS-The Times Recorder, Wednesday December 27,1950 FUNERAL TODAY FOR WOMAN 92

Mrs. Sylvania Wells schaus, 92, widow of Charles F. Schaus, former resident of Duncan Falls, died Sunday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Albert H. Hansen, Upper Arlington, Columbus. She had been ill for several months and seriously ill since last November.

Mrs. Schaus, the former Sylvania W. Cooley, was born December 10, 1858, in a log cabin on the prairie near Hampton, la., and was one of a family of seven children. Her parents were

Loring Hosea and Mary Ann (Mead) Cooley, and they had located in the west from Granville.

Shortly before the Civil War, they returned to Granville by covered wagon and Mrs. Schaus' father joined Co. H., of the 76th Regiment of the Ohio Volunteer Infantry of the Union Army in 1861. He died in Mississippi in 1863. Her grandfather, Hosea Cooley, was one of the pioneers of Granville, having gone there from Granville, Mass., in the spring of 1806, and her great grandfather Captain Daniel Cooley III, was a soldier of the American Revolutionary War.

Mrs. Schaus was married December 14, 1884, in Granville to Charles Frederick Schaus of Duncan Falls, who for more than thirty years was engaged in business in Newark. Mr. Schaus died

December 13,1934 on the eve of their golden wedding anniversary.

Mrs. Schaus, the last of her generation, had resided in the homne of her daughter in Columbus the past 16 years. Besides her daughter, the former Mary Elizabeth Schaus, she leaves two sons, George Lee Schaus, Sr. of Newark and Karl Loring Schaus of Temple, Arizona.

She was a member of the Frist Baptist Church of Newark for 63 years.

For several years past a thoroughly broken down man, an ex-soldier and one of the survivors of the Andersonville Prison has gone about our streets an object of universal commiseration, for it was evident to everyone that he was a great sufferer.

James H. Platt was a member of Company G, 34th Kentucky Infantry and was captured in Sept. 1864 and taken to Andersonville. There he contracted a disease of the lungs which had its final culmination in fatal hemorrhage last night at 10 p.m. James left his home on Market Street between Seventh and Underwood last evening after he ate his supper and spent three hours talking with his friends, a few minutes before 10 o' clock he returned to his residence, and as he entered the door was attacked with bleeding at the lungs. Before help could be summoned by his faithful wife, Mr. Platt was dead.

Mr. James H. Platt was 42 years old, and resided in Zanesville 20 years and was formerly employed at the B & O Railway. He was a man of kindly disposition and great hearted in his friendships. He leaves a wife and two children to mourn his sudden decease. The funeral will take place Wednesday at 3 o'clock from the South Street AME Church. Interment in Greenwood Cemetery.

CLAYTON TOWNSHIP by Teresa L.M. Klaiber, C.G.R.S., R.G.

Thomas and Mary Clayton left the flow of the Cacapon of Hampshire County, Virginia behind and traveled to Muskingum County, Ohio early in 1805. Thomas settled in Range 15, township 16, then described as Madison Township, Muskingum County, Ohio along with eight children who had reached adulthood: John Calvin, Joseph, Mary, Martha, William, Elizabeth, Samuel and Rachel.

Even though the family apparently had funds from previous land transactions in Hampshire County, Thomas chose to purchase patents, taking advantage of the offered Credit System. The first recorded payment is dated 20 December 1805 paid to Isaac VanHorne, in the Zanesville Land Office for \$15.65 for land described as the southeast guarter of section 7, township 16, range 15. (Ref.:OHS Register of Monthly Reports, call 1996, Y17 6 D.) This particular patent was finalized in son William Clayton's name on 2 October 1812. Thomas also purchased the northeast quarter of Section 18 in his own name while John received a patent in section 29 along with brother Joseph. (Joseph also purchased, a patent in Section 13, Range 17, township 17.)

On 1 June 1812, inhabitants of MADISON TOWNSHIP requested to strike into a separate township by the name of CLAYTON. On June 11th the Muskingum County Commissioners granted the formation along with an election to be held at the house of James RUSH for township officers. (Ref.: Muskingum County Commissioners Journal 1808-1819.) The inhabitants approached the Commissioners again 8 December 1812 to request a viewer for a road beginning near the southern township boundary northeast to intersect the Great Road leading from Lancaster to Springfield near the house of Thomas Dolson.

Thomas Clayton lived to see a Township honoring his family. He died August 1813 (Ref.: Musk. Co. WB A p.224) and may be buried in Unity Presbyterian Church Yard in an unmarked gjfavQ'. 'near stohm. | (Burther research is needed to verify burial.)

On March 1, 1817 Clayton Township joined in the formation of Perry County, Ohio.

May 20, 1861

Jessie John was born in Vincent Township, Chester
County, Pennsylvania, March 14th, 1770.

May 30, 1861



We are just informed that as DANIEL STILLWELL Esq. of Madison Tp. was crossing the Muskingum River at Robinson's Ford about 4 miles below Coshocton, yesterday, in a wagon, in company with a granddaughter, the river being much swollen by the recent rains, they got out of their depth and were borne down by the rapid current and both perished. "BURIED TREASURE"

by Malvine B. Zol-lars

I am a member of the Washington Street United Methodist Church of Waynesburg and have chosen to write about the man responsible for organizing our church. He is Cornelius Springer and ours is just one of several churches in southwestern Pennsylvania and West Virginia that were organized by him.

I especially want to learn the location of his grave. I have found more than one date for his death and thought the tombstone inscription might be a deciding factor. The following article includes most of the information I have about him. Please write to me at 47 E. Lincoln Street, Waynesburg, PA 15370 if you can help me.

CORNELIUS SPRINGER

December 29, 1790 - August 17, 1875

Cornelius Springer, founder of the Washington Street Methodist church of Waynesburg, was a descendant of an esteemed and honorable Swedish family that settled in Delaware. His birth occurred December 29, 1790, near Wilmington. He was the son of John and Rebecca Springer and was one of ten children born to this family. In 1798 they moved to western Virginia and settled in the forests below Wheeling. They resided there for eight years and then moved westward near Zanesville, Ohio, where they spent the remaining years of their lives.

Schools were few and not always conveniently located, but Cornelius yearned for knowledge and found ways to improve his life. In 1808, he joined the Methodist Episcopal Church, having been converted under the ministry of Rev. Robert Manly.

At the age of twenty-one years, he engaged in school-teaching. He believed it to be a good profession, one that would bring him in contact with books that would be beneficial in his life. His teaching career was interrupted by the War of 1812 in which he served with distinction as a lieutenant in his company, when his enlistment was completed, he resumed his teaching career.

In 1816, he left a position in the academy at Putman, located opposite Zanesville, to enter the itinerant ministry of the Methodist Episcopal church. He continued to preach in that denomination for the next thirteen years. As early as 1822-23. he wrote a series of articles on the subject of reform in the M. E. Church. They were published in the church

WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP ~ BAPTIST CHURCH DESTROYED BY FIRE

The Washington Township Baptist Church one and one-quarter miles east of Gilbert was destroyed by fire shortly after noon last Wednesday. The building and all its furnishings were consumed. It was a large one room frame structure. The loss was estimated between \$2000 and \$3000, and no insurance was carried.

The fire was discovered by the minister, Rev. James H. Burt, who was painting the window frames inside the church. It had just been redecorated in preparation for evangelistic services which were to start November 8.

The fire broke out in the lighting plant which was housed in the base of the belfry. The plant had been purchased only / two months ago. Rev. Burt was attracted from his work by the smell of smoke and rushed to its source and attempted to extinguish the small blaze with water, but he did not have enough. No other supply * of water was available near there, and the blaze soon spread rapidly up the belfry, blocked the doors on each side, and made it impossible to carry out any of the furnishings. It was said that had there been just a gallon more of water handy the building could have been saved. Rev. Burt was the only person at the church at the time of the blaze.

The church was built in 1874 but had been kept in good repair. Members of the <=> congregation have arranged to hold services at each other's homes until plans can be made to erect a new building.

SUNDALE

In 1847 The Central and Ohio Railroad was incorporated in 1847. Authority was given the incorporators and their successors to construct a single or double track railroad from Columbus through Newark to Zanesville and Norwich to the Ohio River. Construction on the railroad started at Newark, Ohio and by Jan. 26, 1852 railroad traffic was opened between Newark and Zanesville.

By 1854 the railroad had reached Cambridge, Ohio. In building the railroad between Zanesville and Cambridge, about 200 Irishmen were hired for the construction. The Irish set up a community along the railroad line just south of Norwich. This settlement became known as Sundale.

Sundale was also known as Sun Dale and Norwich Station. August 26, 1852 a riot broke out in Sundale, probably the result of two much liquor. At daybreak the next day, the county sheriff arrived with a posse and rounded up the ring leaders and took them to the county jail.

JAMES H. PLATT-Zanesville Daily Courier, Tuesday Sept. 6, 1887

One of the most familiar figures on the streets of Zanesville was suddenly removed last night, and today the wife and children of James H. Platt are sore bereavement. For several years past a thoroughly broken down man, an ex-soldier and one of the survivors of the Andersonville Prison has gone about our streets an object of universal commiseration, for it was evident to everyone that he was a great sufferer.

James H. Platt was a member of Company G, 34th Kentucky Infantry and was captured in Sept. 1864 and taken to Andersonville. There he contracted a disease of the lungs which had its final culmination in fatal hemorrhage last night at 10 p.m. James left his home on Market Street between Seventh and Underwood last evening after he ate his supper and spent three hours talking with his friends, a few minutes before 10 o' clock he returned to his residence, and as he entered the door was attacked with bleeding at the lungs. Before help could be summoned by his faithful wife, Mr. Platt was dead.

Mr. James H. Platt was 42 years old, and resided in Zanesville 20 years and was formerly employed at the B & O Railway. He was a man of kindly disposition and great hearted in his friendships. He leaves a wife and two children to mourn his sudden decease. The funeral will take place Wednesday at 3 o'clock from the South Street AME Church. Interment in Greenwood Cemetery.

Authority was given the incorporators and their successors to construct a single or double track railroad from Columbus through Newark to Zanesville and Norwich to the Ohio River. Construction on the railroad started at Newark. Ohio and by Jan. 1852 traffic 26. railroad was opened between Newark and Zanesville.

By 1854 the railroad had reached Cambridge, Ohio. In building the railroad between Zanesville and Cambridge, about 200 Irishmen were hired for the construction. The Irish set up a community along the railroad line just south of Norwich. This settlement became known as Sundale.

Sundale was also known as Sun Dale and Norwich Station. August 26, 1852 a riot broke out in Sundale, probably

the result of two much liquor. At daybreak the next day, the county sheriff arrived with a posse and rounded up the ring leaders and took them to the county jail.



"BURIED TREASURE"

by Malvine B. Zol-lars

I am a member of the Washington Street United Methodist Church of Waynesburg and have chosen to write about the man responsible for organizing our church. He is Cornelius Springer and ours is just one of several churches in southwestern Pennsylvania and West Virginia that were organized by him.

I especially want to learn the location of his grave. I have found more than one date for his death and thought the tombstone inscription might be a deciding factor. The following article includes most of the information I have about him. Please write to me at 47 E. Lincoln Street, Waynesburg, PA 15370 if you can help me.

CORNELIUS SPRINGER

December 29, 1790 - August 17, 1875

Cornelius Springer, founder of the Washington Street Methodist church of Waynesburg, was a descendant of an esteemed and honorable Swedish family that settled in Delaware. His birth occurred December 29, 1790, near Wilmington. He was the son of John and Rebecca Springer and was one of ten children born to this family. In 1798 they moved to western Virginia and settled in the forests below Wheeling. They resided there for eight years and then moved westward near Zanesville, Ohio, where they spent the remaining years of their lives.

Schools were few and not always conveniently located, but Cornelius yearned for knowledge and found ways to improve his life. In 1808, he joined the Methodist Episcopal Church, having been converted under the ministry of Rev. Robert Manly.

At the age of twenty-one years, he engaged in school-teaching. He believed it to be a good profession, one that would bring him in contact with books that would be beneficial in his life. His teaching career was interrupted by the War of 1812 in which he served with distinction as a lieutenant in his company, when his enlistment was completed, he resumed his teaching career.

In 1816, he left a position in the academy at Putman, located opposite Zanesville, to enter the itinerant ministry of the Methodist Episcopal church. He continued to preach in that denomination for the next thirteen years. As early as 1822-23. he wrote a series of articles on the subject of reform in the M. E. Church. They were published in the church

part of our immigration history just a few years ago, and now are proposing what could, as I see it, undo all that work. Remember, the Ellis Island National Monument was only opened to the Xpublic in the fall of 1990, at a cost of over) \$156 million^.

Than, renovation, I recognize, covered only the northern half of the tiny island, and the area being considered for "development" into commercial use comprised the southern half, which X was not included in the museum complex restoration.X

The preservation League of New York proposed that if development of the non-museum portion of Ellis Island is necessary, that the work should be consistent with the overall Ellis Island immigration experience and interpretation. That sounds logical to ine, and I hope it does to you.

One of the attractions of Ellis Island is its isolation, a genuine isle on which the future Americans were truly isolated until their immigration processing was completed. Then a short ferryboat ride carriecy them across the bay to New York City or New Jersey and to/freedom. That trip itself today gives a faint vicarious imp/ession of the immigrants' anticipation at finally arriving/in America.

If a bridge is ever built tra connect the island with New Jersey, there will be an end 'to' the isolation of the site. There will also be the modernYlague of automobiles, limited parking and all the other pro) 61tems of the 20th and 21st centuries.

Yes, as I see it, the Planned restoration/restructuring of Ellis Island seems to by a realXnightmare threatening American history and culture.

Although the Decembe/ meeting has passed, there may still be time to get the /National Park Service to scrap their plans for the island or /co change thenkfor a more suitable use.

If you're concerned about the desecration of such an important site to Americans and their immigrant forebears, write or call your congressman and/or senator in Washington as well as the National Park Service.

WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP BAPTIST CHURCH DESTROYED BY FIRE

The Washington Township Baptist Church one and one-quarter miles east of Gilbert was destroyed by fire shortly after noon last Wednesday. The building and all its furnishings were consumed, it was a large one room frame structure. The loss was estimated between \$2000 and \$3000, and no insurance was carried.

The fire was discovered by the minister, Rev. James H. Burt, who was painting the window frames inside the church. It had just been redecorated in preparation for evangelistic services which were to start November 8.

The fire broke out in the lighting plant which was housed in the base of the belfry. The plant had been purchased only two months ago. Rev. Burt was attracted from his work by the smell of smoke and rushed to its source and attempted to extinguish the small blaze with water, but he did not have enough. No other supply of water was available near there, and the blaze soon spread rapidly up the belfry. blocked the doors on each side, and made it impossible to carry out any of the furnishings. It was said that had there been just a gallon more of water handy the building could have been saved. Rev. Burt was the only person at the church at the time of the blaze.

The church was built in 1874 but had been kept in good repair. Members of the congregation have arranged to hold services at each other's homes until plans can be made to erect a new building.

CLAYTON TOWNSHIP

by Teresa L.M. Klaiber, C.G.R.S., R.G.

Thomas and Mary Clayton left the flow of the Cacapon of Hampshire County, Virginia behind and traveled to Muskingum County, Ohio early in 1805. Thomas settled in Range 15, township 16, then described as Madison Township, Muskingum County, Ohio along with eight children who had reached adulthood: John Calvin, Joseph, Mary, Martha, William, Elizabeth, Samuel and Rachel.

Even though the family apparently had funds from previous transactions in Hampshire County, Thomas chose to purchase patents, taking advantage of the offered Credit System. The first recorded payment is dated 20 December 1805 paid to Isaac VanHorne, in the Zanesville Land Office for \$15.65 for land described as the southeast guarter of section 7, township 16, range 15. (Ref.:OHS Register of Monthly Reports, call 1996, Y17 6 D.) This particular patent was finalized in son William Clayton's name on 2 October 1812. Thomas also purchased the northeast guarter of Section 18 in his own name while John received a patent in section 29 along with brother Joseph. (Joseph also purchased, a patent in Section 13, Range 17, township 17.)

On 1 June 1812, inhabitants of MADISON TOWNSHIP reguested to strike into a separate township by the name of CLAYTON. On June 11th the Muskingum County Commissioners granted the formation along with an election to be held at the house of James RUSH for township officers. (Ref.: Muskingum County Commissioners Journal 1808-1819.) The inhabitants approached the Commissioners again 8 December 1812 to reguest a viewer for a road beginning near the southern township boundary northeast to intersect the Great Road leading from Lancaster to Springfield near the house of Thomas Dolson.

Thomas Clayton lived to see a Township honoring his family. August 1813 (Ref.: Musk. Co. WB A p.224) ; and may be buried in Unity Presbyterian Church Yard in an unmark0\T gjfave near son John | F(Burther research is needed to verify burial.) GENEAI (JGICML SOCIETY

The History of St. John's Lutheran Church

Continued from April 1992

During the 1869, Rev. G. W. Mechling from Lancaster hear the **ch**urch in Zanesville.

1870 an unknown pastor took over the Zanesvi congregation and was given \$500 for his support membersh **\partial** increased to 39 in 1871.

At a \mathbf{c} onvention helped by the District Syn \mathbf{cd} of Ohio in 1872, the **St**. John's Evangelical Lutheran Chur **th** of Brush Creek Townshiip was united with the Zanesvill & congregation During this ti me a proiject for a new church building was suggested. A wealthy member con tributed \$5000.

1876 saw the church and com gregation reorganized, adopt a new constitution and I amend the charter. The women of the church also helped by raising momey to buy a parsonage,

The last -service on the old building was held on Easter in April 1878. the fallowing da \mathbf{Y}' the old building was demolished and a new building began. December 1, 1878 the new building was dedicated and enjoyed by all members,

In July 1882, a parsonage was purchased at 85 South Seventh Street for \$3000. Member, John Bowman gave \$2000. In 1904 St. John's s parated from The Brush Creek Church

as each wanted their own pastor.

The present building on Market Street was dedicated in 1914. By 1915, \$40,000 had been raised, however, it was not until March 30, 1919 the church purchased the present lot. The Church was f inally finished and dedicated on September 12, 1927. It is an example of Gothic architecture. The oak furnishings were are by the Americ an Seating Co. of Grand Rapids, Michigan and the wood carvings by a skilled craftsman from Obera mmergau, Germany.

Fresh meats—beef—fore quarter, \$4.00 to \$4.50; hind quarter \$5.00 to \$6.00 per CWT; lard 6 14; retail 6 to 8 cents; fresh fish 10 cents a pound; chuck steaks, 8 cents; sirloin and round 10; boiling 4 to 6 cents, roasts 6 to 8 cents, cured hams 12 to 13 cents; bacon 7 to 9 cents per pound; dressed pork by the carcass \$2.75 per hundred; by the quarter 3 14 to 5 cents a pound, sausage 7 to a cents.

Irish potatoes 50 to 60 cents a bushel; sweet potatoes 50 to 60 cents a bushel; cabbage 3 to 8 cents a head; apples 25 to 35 cents a bushel, 10 cents a peck. Onions 40 to 50 cents a bushel; 15 cents a peck; corn 30 to 35 cents a bushel; corn meal 50 to 60 cents a bushel; oats 25 cents a bushel.

Cider vinegar 20 cents a gallon; honey 15 to 20 cents a pound; cider 10 to 15 cents a gallon, sorghum 40 cents a gallon, apple butter 40 to 50 cents a gallon. Peaches from 2 54 to 3 14 per pound at wholesale; retail 4 to 6 cents. Applesl % to 2 at wholesale; retail 2/12 to 3. Dull.

Cherries 10 cents a pound. Dull Tallow 5 cents Beeswax, 15 to 18 cents

Beans very scare, price nominal; worth more here at retail than foreign markets justify; some sold as high as \$1.60 per bushel.

Hay is offering at from \$5.60 to \$6.00 per ton, and fair sale.
