

**BURIALS IN
THE HIGH STREET CEMETERY,**

Circleville, Ohio

Recorder's Office and the County Recorder's Office. Working from a xeroxed copy of the typescript, we have made an alphabetical list of the inscriptions, which we shall publish in the Quarterly this year. This issue carries letters A through J. The copy is as accurate as we know how to make it. Every spelling is identical with the typescript. We have noted discrepancies, but did not alter any spelling, even when we were reasonably certain that the word was misspelled.

We think you should know that we have been told that this list is not complete. Some of the stones were so broken that nothing could be copied and the faces of other stones were so eroded by the effects of time and the weather that they were partially illegible. Consequently if the reader knows positively that an ancestor is buried in old High Street Cemetery but his name is not on this list, please consider that the stone may have been one of those stones too broken or defaced to be read in March, 1963.

Since we started on this project we have learned of several persons who have more knowledge of the old cemetery. In later issues we shall publish their observations.

The following letter is self-explanatory as preface to the listing:

"March 1, 1963

To the Recorder of Pickaway County, Ohio

Re: High Street Cemetery

There apparently is no written record available of the burials in the High Street Cemetery, except for the occasional lot deed and the Veterans Grave Registration in your office. At the date of this writing, the grave markers at the cemetery were providing less information of burials each passing year due to weathering, breakage, and unauthorized removals of the markers. Consequently, it was deemed essential that a written listing be made for posterity of the grave markers which could be found at the cemetery at the time of this writing. The attached listing is the result of an effort to make such a record.

above the kitchen and a stairway connected the two rooms. The stairway is no longer in use. The room is approximately 12 x 14 feet in size.

In one corner stands a beautiful four-poster child's bed, loaned to us by Mr. and Mrs. John Beck of Circleville. Nearby is a baby cradle with a spring which can be wound up to keep the cradle swinging. This is a gift of Mrs. Vause Blake of Harrison Township. A baby carriage from Mrs. Blake is also on display.

The plat of High Street Cemetery showing the graves of all veterans of American Wars was prepared sometime in the 1930's by the WPA. The graves are located by range and lot number. The numbers on the map indicates the war in which the veteran fought, the first being the American Revolution and the last, the Civil War. The bottom of the map is the south side, which is High Street. Here is the key to the map:

L-R stands for Lot or Row
 G Grave
 W War

* Position unknown, arbitrary grave numbers
 1 Revolutionary War
 10 War of 1812
 16 Mexican War

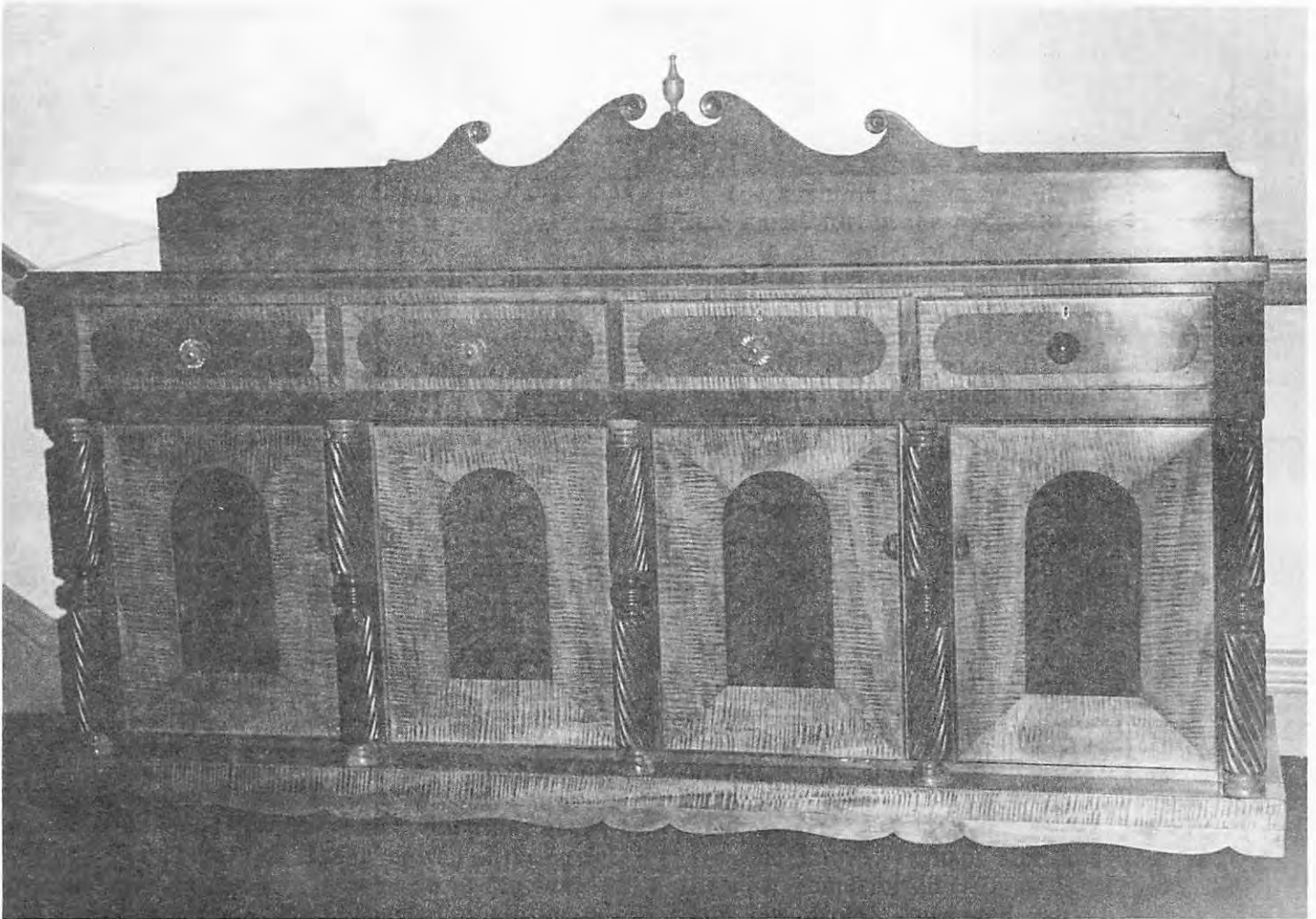
John Dreisbach is not known. Rev. Dreisbach came from Pennsylvania to Pickaway Township, Pickaway County in 1831. He lived at one time at 303 Franklin Street (S. E. corner) and the sideboard was in his possession at that time. Rev. John Dreisbach was Mrs. Charles Naumann's maternal grandfather and the Olds and Dreisbach families were related.

The sideboard passed from father to son in the next two generations and was bought in 1917 by Mrs. Robert Dreisbach from Mrs. Reuben Dreisbach, who lived on the farm now owned by Mrs. Paul Adkins of Circleville.

The sideboard is of wood with four panels, and Sandwich (?) glass knobs on the four drawers. It is a typical example of the country cabinet maker's art of that era, the early, or first third, of the nineteenth century.

Note: Wood – cherry, Burl Walnut, or Maple – Sandwich glass knobs – Country cabinet maker, possibly local.

Note: The Third National Bank now stands on the site of the former Marfield home.

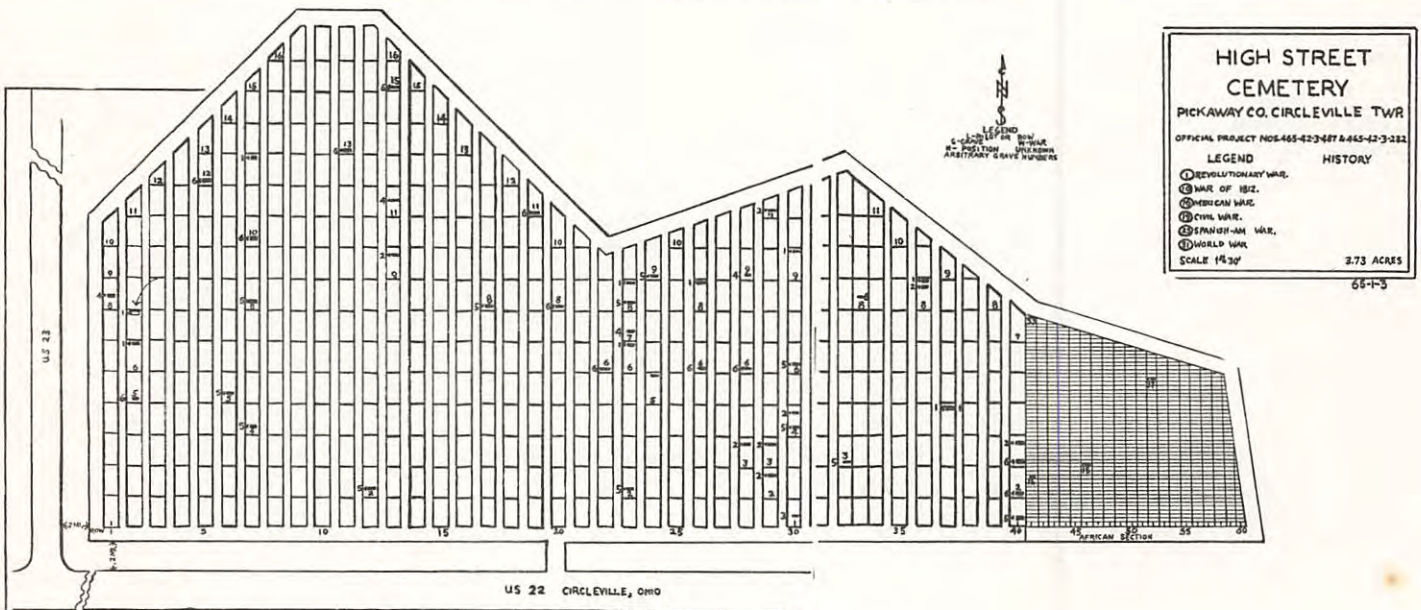

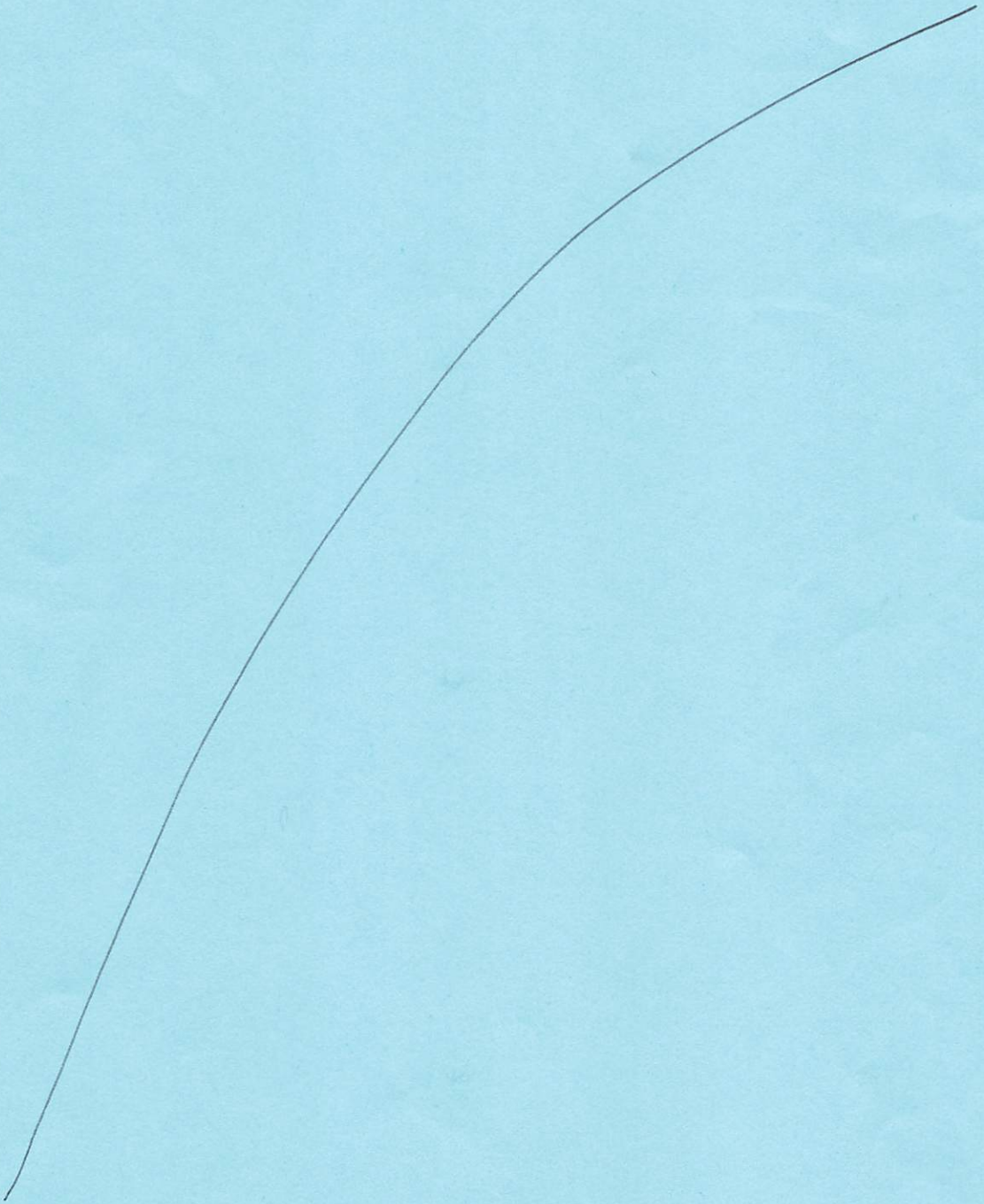

RECORD OF BURIALS IN OLD CHRISTIAN CEMETERY WILLIAMSPORT 1803-1886

Recordings of burials in the Christian Cemetery, located on the west side of North Main Street, Williamsport, were made in 1910 by Mr. and Mrs. Tom H. Tipton, who resided at the property, joining the cemetery on the south. Mr. Tipton, publisher of The Williamsport News, published the list in the News, and it's from these files that the list is re-printed.

Aforeward of the list by Mr. Tipton states:

"The first recorded burial was made in 1803, when Mrs. Edward Davidson died shortly after reaching here with her husband from Bourbon County, Kentucky.

Ten years afterward, in 1813, John Redin set fire to his cabin, killed himself, in an attempt to cremate his remains. Neighbors were attracted by the blaze, however, and rescued his body. Later it was buried in this cemetery. There is no stone to mark the site of the grave.

Of the 267 tombstones in this old cemetery, the one recording the earliest death is that of Jacob Mitts, who died Oct., 1810 not quite 100 years ago.

The early records of the transfers of land in Williamsport, it is said, cannot be found, but this old graveyard was in the original plot of the village, and this plot was recorded March 9, 1818.

The last burial was that of Mrs. Polly Shade, wife of George Shade, Sr. She died of dropsy at the age of 65 years, and was buried here July 8, 1886. There is no stone at this grave."

RECORD OF BURIALS IN WILLIAMSPORT METHODIST CEMETERY 1847 - 1880

From the Williamsport News-Esta Tipton, Editor

The following is a reprint from the files of the *Williamsport News*, 1911, recording the burials in the Methodist Cemetery, North Main Street, 1847 to 1880. "Burials were made in a plot in the churchyard, north of the present building. Members of nineteen families sleep the last sleep in the churchyard, among them three boys who died in the Civil War."

There are several persons buried there who organized the Methodist Church here .

"The earliest burial in this plot of ground, according to the inscriptions, was that of Maris, first wife of James Colwell, in 1847. And the last, that of Alexander Tripp, the blind broom-maker, in 1880."

These recordings of burials were made by Mr. and Mrs. Tom H. Tipton and published in their paper, the *News*. Many persons who are searching for records of their ancestry refer to these records (probably the only records.) In May, 1958, a number of the stones on the graves in the front were moved without authorization and piled behind the church. Since then all but the obelisk have been removed!

THREE GRAVESTONES IN THE EVANS FAMILY BURYING-GROUND

By John Frericks

The first gravestone of interest to historians in the old graveyard is undoubtedly that of Caleb Evans, first settler in Pickaway Township. The stone, which is still intact, has these facts incised on the face of the stone:

CALEB EVANS
Died August 14, 1836
77 years, 5 months, 2 days.

6 12 MAR 1759

Caleb Evans was the first permanent settler in Pickaway Township. His farm lay along the old Kingston Pike, one of the first roads in the county, at one time a toll road. He was born in Pennsylvania, then moved to Kentucky, where he resided until 1796 or 1797, when he came to Ohio and settled on Scippo Creek on the fertile Pickaway Plains. The first white child born in the township and possibly the first white child in Pickaway County was Mary Evans, daughter of Caleb and Elizabeth Evans. She was born on June 8, 1798.

Fire destroyed the first cabin home of the Evans family and with it four hundred dollars in silver coins.

Caleb Evans was married twice. His first wife bore him two sons, Jonas and Joseph. His second wife, Elizabeth Wiggins, was the mother of nine children, William, David, John, Archibald, Caleb, Samuel, Ruth, Mary and Elizabeth.

The subsequent history of the Evans children was as follows: Jonas went to Indiana, where he died; Joseph

remained in Pennsylvania; William and John settled in Licking County, Ohio; David went South and nothing more was learned of him; Archibald died young; Caleb II died in Mexico as a soldier; Samuel was married twice, first to Susannah Hitler, then after she and her two children died, he married her sister, Elizabeth Hitler; Mary married her cousin Archibald Wiggins and moved to Kentucky.

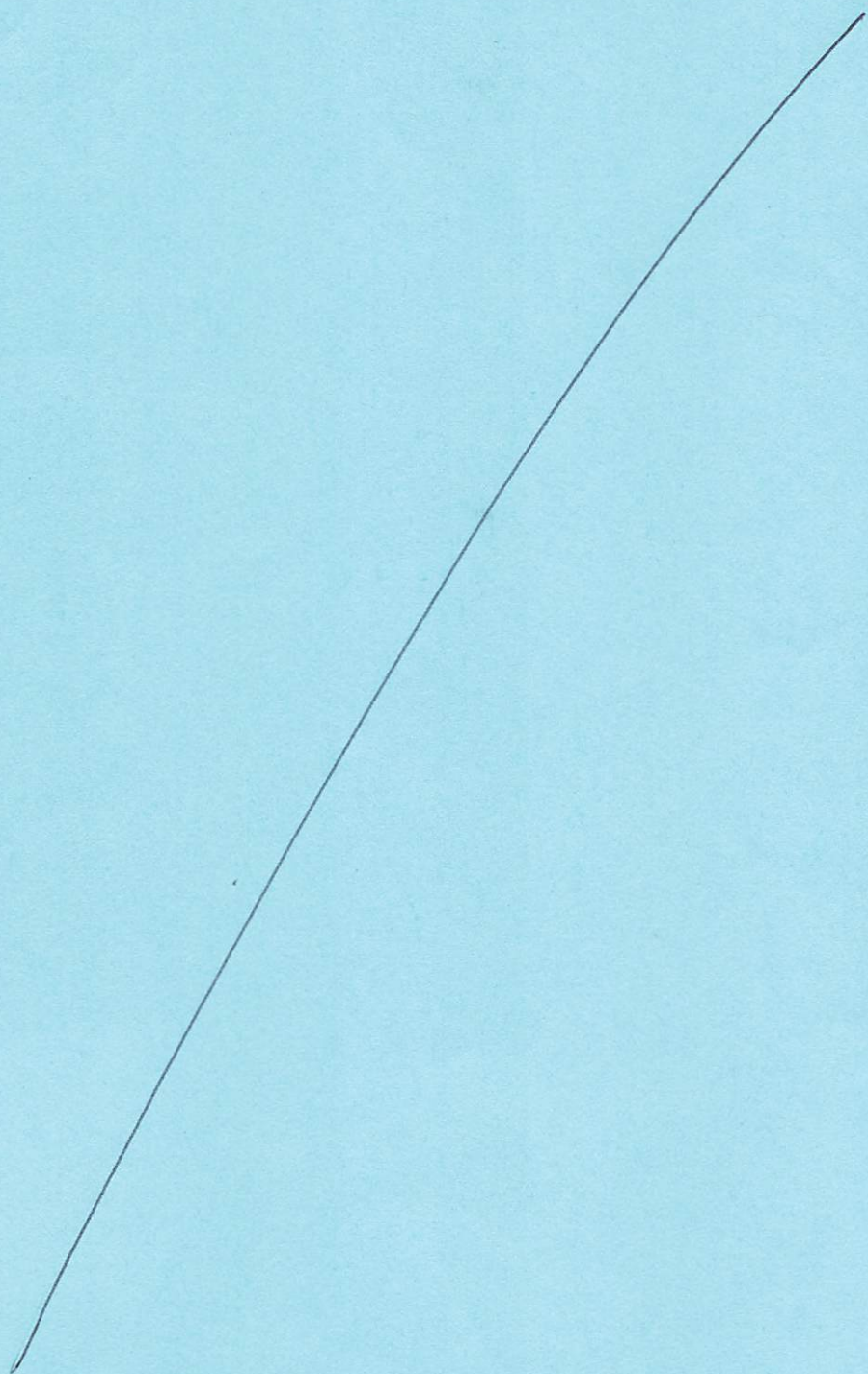


The stone of George Hitler, incised in German script, was translated by Richard Billman, who made all the photographs.

The second tombstone of interest is that of George Hitler, Sr. The engraving on the stone is in old German script, testifying to a German heritage. He was born on March 15, 1763 and died April 2, 1818.

In April 1799, George Hitler, Sr. emigrated from Somerset County, Pennsylvania to Ohio. His family made the journey down the Ohio on a flatboat to the mouth of the Scioto River. Mr. Hitler brought along a number of horses for himself and others' use. From the mouth of the Scioto, the journey northward to the Pickaway Plains was made with team and wagons. Their wagon is said to have been the second wagon that ever came up the Scioto Valley.

At time time there were but two log cabins in Chillicothe and country was almost a complete wilderness. The family settled first on the lower plains in Pickaway Township, but later located on Scippo Creek. In 1804, George Hitler bought land and settled in Washington Township, section 33, where he died April 2, 1818 and his wife, Susanna on September 16, 1848.

CEMETERY LISTS

George Robinson, Jr. of Washington C. H. has sent us for use in the *Quarterly* a book listing three graveyards in Pickaway County - all found along the old Zane Trace. They are Tarlton Cemetery, Stumpf or Jerusalem Cemetery and Imler Cemetery - all old, all important to genealogists interested in this county. We shall publish all three in subsequent issues, beginning with the Stumpf Cemetery. We would like to start with a tribute to these sisters whose work continued through many years - a true labor of love.

We wish also to thank Maisie Griner for her cheerful acceptance of the boring and time-consuming task of transcribing the cemetery lists which she performs with great care and efficiency.

THE MISSES CLARA AND MARY LOUISE MARK

These ladies were Ohio-born and Ohio-interested. Their father was born in Fayette County, Ohio, where he had many relatives and connections. When he became a Methodist minister he was given charges all over southern Ohio and this made his family well-versed in southern Ohio geography. Among these charges were Tarlton, western Hocking County, New Salem, Rushville, Bloomingburg, Sedalia and Harrisburg.

Clara was always interested in history and as her major was geology she was interested in all that these fields could touch. She became an authority on French and Indian War history, especially as it touched the South Branch of the Potomac and Western Pennsylvania and was well-versed in all the places in Ohio where forts had once been. She had heard many stories second-hand from her elders about doings in these eras of our history and had almost total recall. So she was in a very well-schooled situation to begin copying old cemeteries, especially the ones' way back off the roads and neglected by the present day population.

Louise was a statistician and taught the subject at Ohio State. She also was with the Indian Affairs Bureau for many years and could tell fascinating stories of the Indians in the American Southwest and the mistreatment they got from almost everyone. She was not particularly interested in history but as Clara didn't drive and she did, she was the chauffeur and gradually the helper.

Sometime in their middle lives they decided that they should begin copying the old cemeteries in Delaware County. They got into some unusual places and had difficulties galore but they copied the oldest stones in presently used cemeteries, except the big one in Delaware City, and all the stones available in all the old abandoned ones. Clara had this typed and organized but not quite to her satisfaction when her health became worse and she had to give it up. She wanted Esther W. Powell to use her material and Mrs. Powell did publish it with some additions and enlargements. Unfortunately Clara didn't live to see it but Louise did. Louise had helped do much of the copying and she was good at it too.

However they loved Tarlton and did it as a labor of love. They also loved the territory in Salt Creek Twp. and never seemed to tire of driving thru it and the adjacent parts of Ross and Hocking County. They had known many of the people whose tombstones they copied and like those of us who are left soon began to know more people in the cemetery than those yet unburied.

They were two most unusual ladies. They were 5 feet tall but they had minds as keen as any one could meet in a lifetime. I think we should be very grateful for their interest in history and genealogy and the fruit that it bore. So a tip of the hat to their memory.

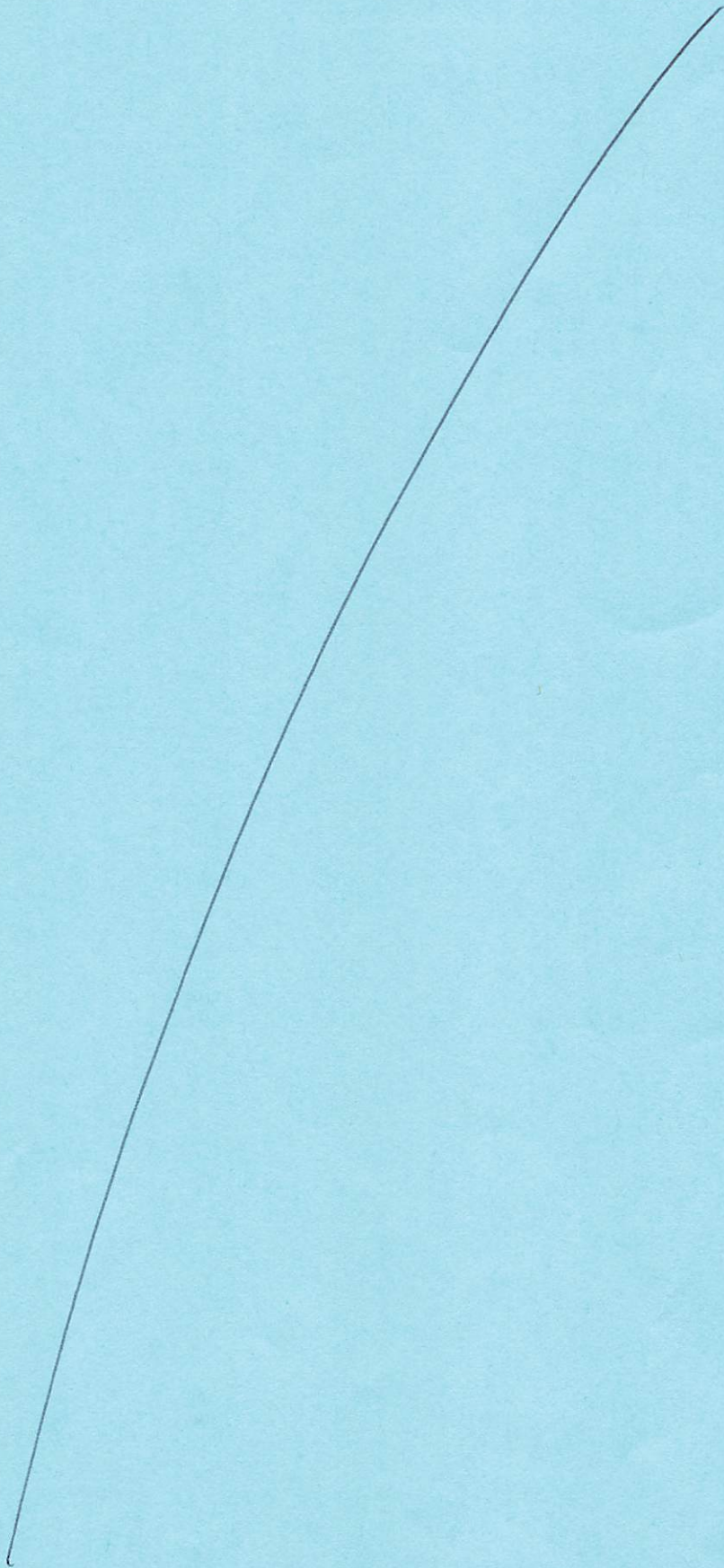

LIFE WITH FATHER

(With apologies to Lindsay and Crouse)

My very first recollection of life was that of being rocked to sleep by my father, Fred B. Brunner, to the tune of "Twenty One Blue Bottles a Hangin' on the Wall." When the last bottle fell, I was usually gone. He did everything he could to save my mother extra work. If I wanted a drink in the night, he was the one who brought it. Up first in the morning, he prepared breakfast for the rest of the family, and I mean oatmeal and bacon! This he did for at least 35 years, until he began to lose his eyesight. Then his duties were confined to washing and drying the dishes. How many fathers can boast of such a record?

He adored my mother, who was fourteen years younger than he and, I'm afraid, he was guilty of spoiling her. I remember her throwing herself on the bed and pouting if she couldn't have something she wanted. This did not seem

to bother father in the least. I guess he felt her many virtues outweighed this childish trait. Only once did I ever hear him reprimand her and that was when I was being punished by her. (something he never did). He said, "Be careful you don't break her spirit." It was the first I knew that I had a spirit!

However, I was brought up in a happy atmosphere, as my parents were very congenial--with keen senses of humor and always laughing or singing. My mother sang while she worked and I learned "Bicycle Built for Two," "Two Little Girls in Blue," "Down on the Brandywine," and many other songs from her.

Dad was always practicing for some "home talent" show in the making. There were many; usually sponsored by a lodge or church society. I remember all the singing and learning of lines and coaching by mother. We lived Gilbert and Sullivan! The part of the comedian was usually handed to Dad, because his singing voice was not too powerful.

Many of these productions were before my time, and the first one I remember, was **Chimes of Normandy**. Dad was the old miser and after the performance, he came out front to see us. His make-up scared me so, that I screamed and cried, but after he spoke, everything was all right.

The Mikado, Pirates of Penzance and Little Tycoon followed. All of these took place in the dear old Opera House, just four doors from my home. To me, it was the glamorous land of dreams and make-believe. When it was destroyed, I thought I never could walk up that street again!

My grandfather, whom I never knew, owned a jewelry business which he had founded. He had hopes for an 18-year-old son, Ned, to become a partner--hence the sign T. K. Brunner & Son was made and hung. However, Ned was denied the privilege, since he died of some dread disease like meningitis. My father had to step in and fill Ned's place, although his heart was not in it. He wanted very much to pursue his first love--the theatre.

Grandfather sent him to New York city to buy merchandise. This gave him the chance to make the rounds of theatrical producers to whom he had been referred. Their answer was always the same, "No experience!" Just how does one get experience without first having a job?? He never gave up and the New York trips became more frequent than necessary. I am sure grandfather would have sent him to an acting school had there been any in those days (1888). The store did make an ample living and my father's interest in it grew.

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MT. PLEASANT CEMETERY

We are again most grateful to Esta Tipton, editor and publisher of *The Williamsport News*, for sharing this cemetery list with *Quarterly* readers. Mrs. Tipton's parents-in-law are responsible for the preservation of many such cemetery lists in the Williamsport area. Realizing that stones in these early burial grounds were deteriorating and disappearing, Mr. and Mrs. T. H. Tipton spent many long hours recording the burials and publishing the lists in the *News*. They originally appeared in 1910. Recently republishing them in the same newspaper, Esta Tipton has kindly supplied the Publications Committee with copies to be preserved in the *Quarterly*.

Mt. Pleasant churchyard is located southeast of Williamsport on Route 138. Quoting from the *News* in 1910: Just when the Mt. Pleasant Cemetery was established is not known. The earliest death on a monument therein was in 1825. The first church to be erected on the plot of ground now including the cemetery was a frame building completed in 1839, but a society of Methodists was holding class meetings 13 years before that alternately at the homes of Jacob Rector and Jacob Terwilliger. There are 183 inscriptions on the stones standing in this cemetery."

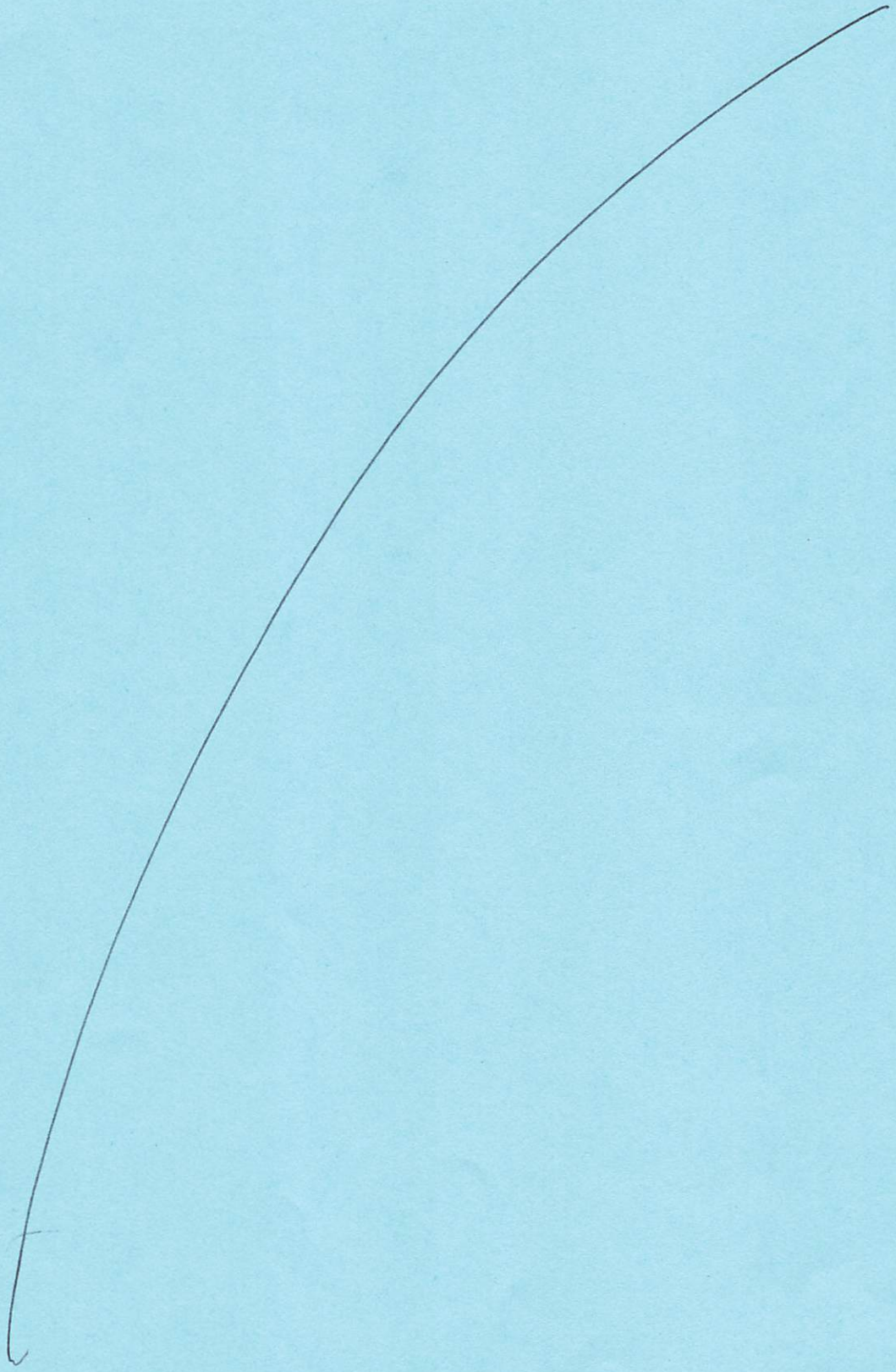

Until Ruth Morris Macklin's death in 1970, she and Harriet shared a joint antique business-hobby in a tiny shop back of the main house. They began the venture in the 1950's. Ruth carried on during the winter months and Harriet joined her in the summers when school was not in session. The two-room shop was one of the original buildings on the farm and Harriet believes that it was a dwelling for servants or farm workers. One room has a fireplace and the original plaster. The other room is smaller and has brick walls. Since Ruth's death, Harriet has continued to buy and sell antiques and has also added to her personal doll collection, which is a delight to behold!

In 1928, Charles Morris donated land on which to erect a monument commemorating the Camp Charlotte treaty. The DAR placed the stone originally on the south side of Route 56. It proved to be an inconvenient stopping place for traffic. When the road was improved in 1970, the monument was moved to its present location adjacent to the Morris's driveway.

A VISIT TO REDLANDS

(Editors Note: If Pickaway county has a claim to fame other than being the home of Ted Lewis and the site of some of the finest farmland in the world, it has to be noted for the plethora of fine old brick homes which exist within the borders. Some of these beautiful structures are in a fine state of repair; others are slowly decaying to a point of no return. It is a distinct pleasure to visit one in the former category! T.R.Y.)

Mrs. Carson Horton's farm home "Redlands" is in Circleville township just to the east of old State Route 23, north of Circleville. It is in township 11, Range 21, section 7 of the Worthington survey. The approach -- a gentle rise by a long lane -- is picturesque and allows a fine perspective of the home and the huge old trees which surround it.

The house is red brick, fashioned in the common bond construction (headers every seven rows). It is built in the late Federal style circa 1850, with a five window front, an elegant entryway with side lights and sandstone lintels over the windows.

The downstairs consists of a spacious entry hall with winding stairway, a formal parlor, library, dining room, kitchen and downstairs bedroom, which used to be the old smoke house. There are three fireplaces on this floor, including one in the kitchen. Every inside door is transomed and every twelve light window is paneled to the floor.

There are four large sunlit bedrooms upstairs and a hall area equal in size to that on the first floor.

The back part of the house, consisting of the smoke house (bedroom) summer kitchen, kitchen and a room

above could have been built much earlier than 1850 and may well have dated from 1815, as legend has indicated. Although Mrs. Horton did dismantle the smoke house to provide a downstairs bedroom and attached bath, she did so with the utmost care. The room could easily be reconstructed in its former state by removing paneling and returning the cast iron fireplace accoutrements which have been carefully saved. An interesting outdoor appendage to this portion of the house is a sturdily constructed brick dog house, which hugs the large smoke house fireplace on the outside wall and must have provided excellent warmth for the hunting hounds on cold winter nights.

Mrs. Horton has twice favored Redlands. First of all, she has kept the property in superb repair and second, she has decorated and furnished it with supreme good taste and attention to period detail. The oriental rugs, satiny smooth antique furniture, delicate porcelain and family portraits look as if they are where they belong -- and, indeed, have always been. Appearances deceive, however. The Hortons bought the property in 1941, and so have only occupied it for thirty-eight of its one hundred and twenty nine years.

Redlands was built by Jacob Z. Valentine, the son of John and Margaret (Zeiger) Valentine. Margaret was the daughter of Jacob Zeiger, one of the foremost pioneer land owners in Pickaway county. Jacob Z. Valentine and his brother, Israel, were outstanding 19th century agriculturalists and accumulated large land holdings in this area. The Titus Atlas of Pickaway County (1871), shows the location of the Valentine residence.

Jacob Z. Valentine owned Redlands until 1897, when he willed it to his grandchildren: Mabel Valentine (Eby) and Jacob M. Valentine. Jacob left his nephew, Joseph, in charge of the farm until the grandchildren were of age. They inherited it on Nov. 15, 1900. Mabel subsequently sold her half interest to her brother, Jacob M.

On April 7, 1905, Jacob M. Valentine sold the farm to Florence Haas Rife (Vol. 80, p. 272). On Nov. 7, 1918, Mrs. Rife sold to Daniel and Cora Dunkel (Vol. 97, p. 75). It was the heirs of Daniel Dunkel who sold Redlands to Carson and Helen Renick Horton on June 18, 1941 (Vol. 128, p. 49) (Deed Records: Recorder's Office.)

Since Carson Horton's death, Helen has almost decided to sell Redlands and move into town. The spacious room which once were the scene of frequent entertaining now seem too silent and unnecessarily large. The quaint lane has become a formidable adversary when covered with snow and ice and the road to grocery

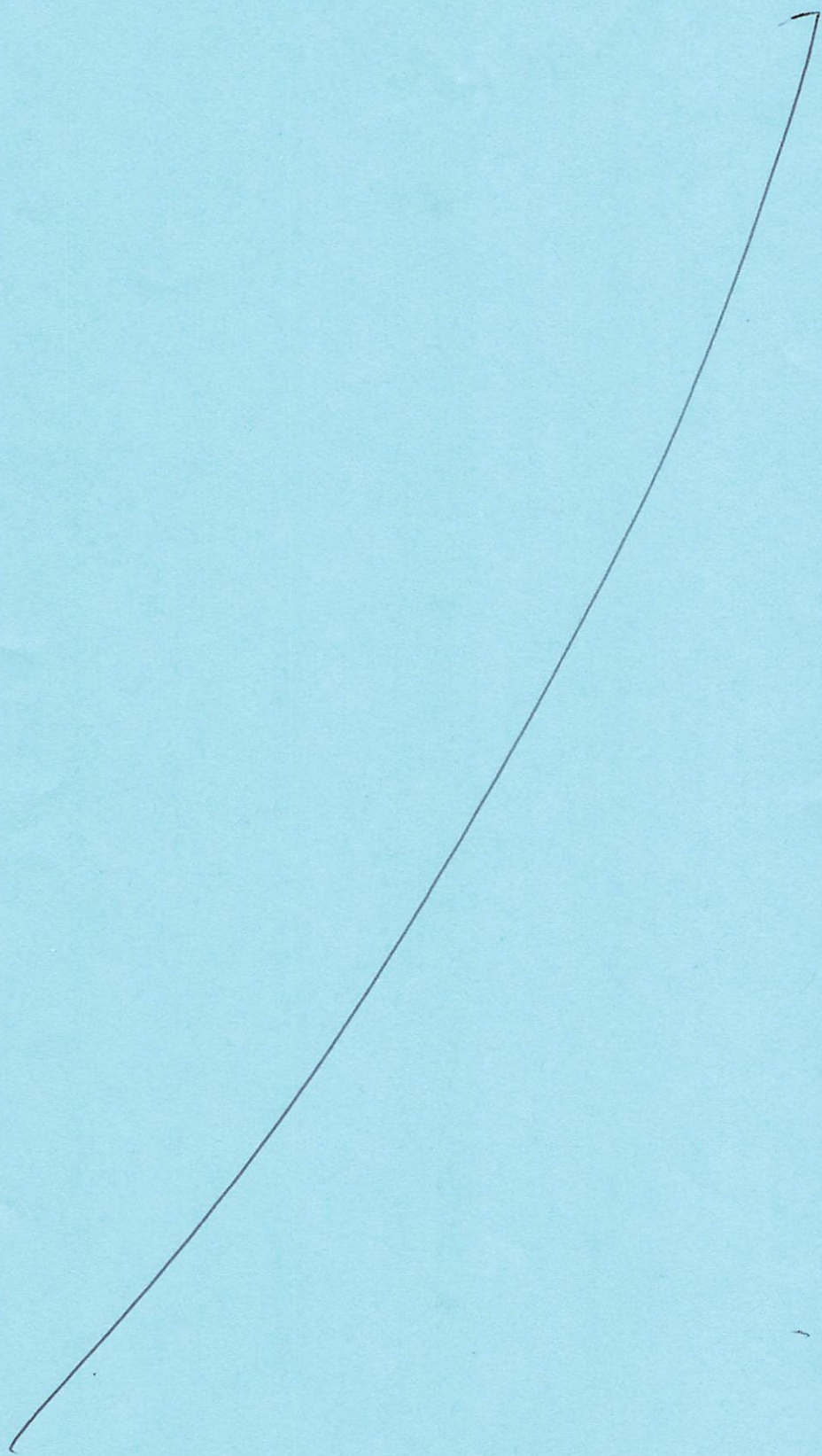

As the years progressed between 1870 and 1905, the community began to provide more and more activities for its residents. Most of the leisure-time activities were created by the participants themselves; the lodges, church socials, baseball teams, drama clubs and community bands. The only commercial amusements were shows presented at the opera house and the tent shows. The state sponsored the annual Farmers' Institute.

After 1905, mechanization altered leisure-time activities in Asheville. The citizens began to expect more and more from outside the town and relied less on their own creativity.

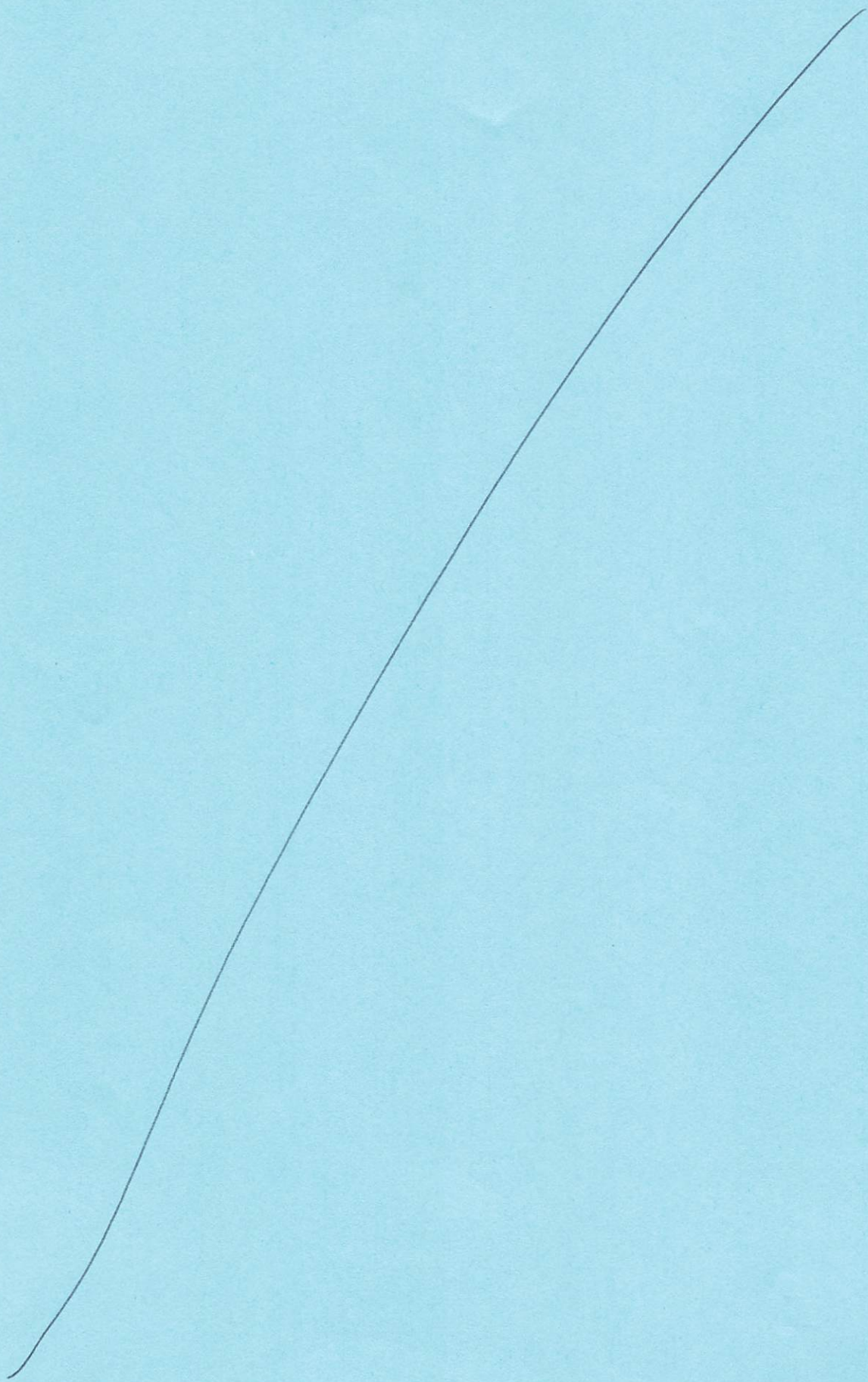

EBENEZER CHURCH CEMETERY

Ebenezer Church Cemetery is located five tenths of a mile east of the Kingston Pike on corner of Gay-Driesbach and Hayesvilles Roads.

This cemetery was established on the grounds of the Evangelical Church, first known as Albright and later Ebenezer Evangelical. Rev. John Dreisbach, who formed the church class in 1835, donated the land for a church and cemetery in 1846. The site of the church, which was built in 1850 and torn down in 1948 or 1949, is marked by a memorial monument which was dedicated on August 13, 1950. The land was deeded to the township trustees in 1949.

Strong words, William, but oh, so true! What's in a name, indeed - whether one is referring to reputation or "good" name as the Bard most certainly was or simply to the spelling or pronunciation of our revered "handles." Mr. Shakespeare addressed the subject again in *Romeo and Juliet* and softened his approach considerably when he decided that roses smelled just as fragrant whatever they were called. R. and J. was, however, a romantic drama which appealed to the emotions rather than the intellect. In the business of history and genealogy, the correct name and the spelling thereof cannot be over stressed. Nothing is more insulting to an individual than to misspell or mispronounce his name! I've done it and I know!!

In the *Quarterly* we sincerely try to be meticulous about identifying our subjects. We spend a great deal of time proofing the cemetery lists in which the correct spelling of the name shares importance with precise dates.

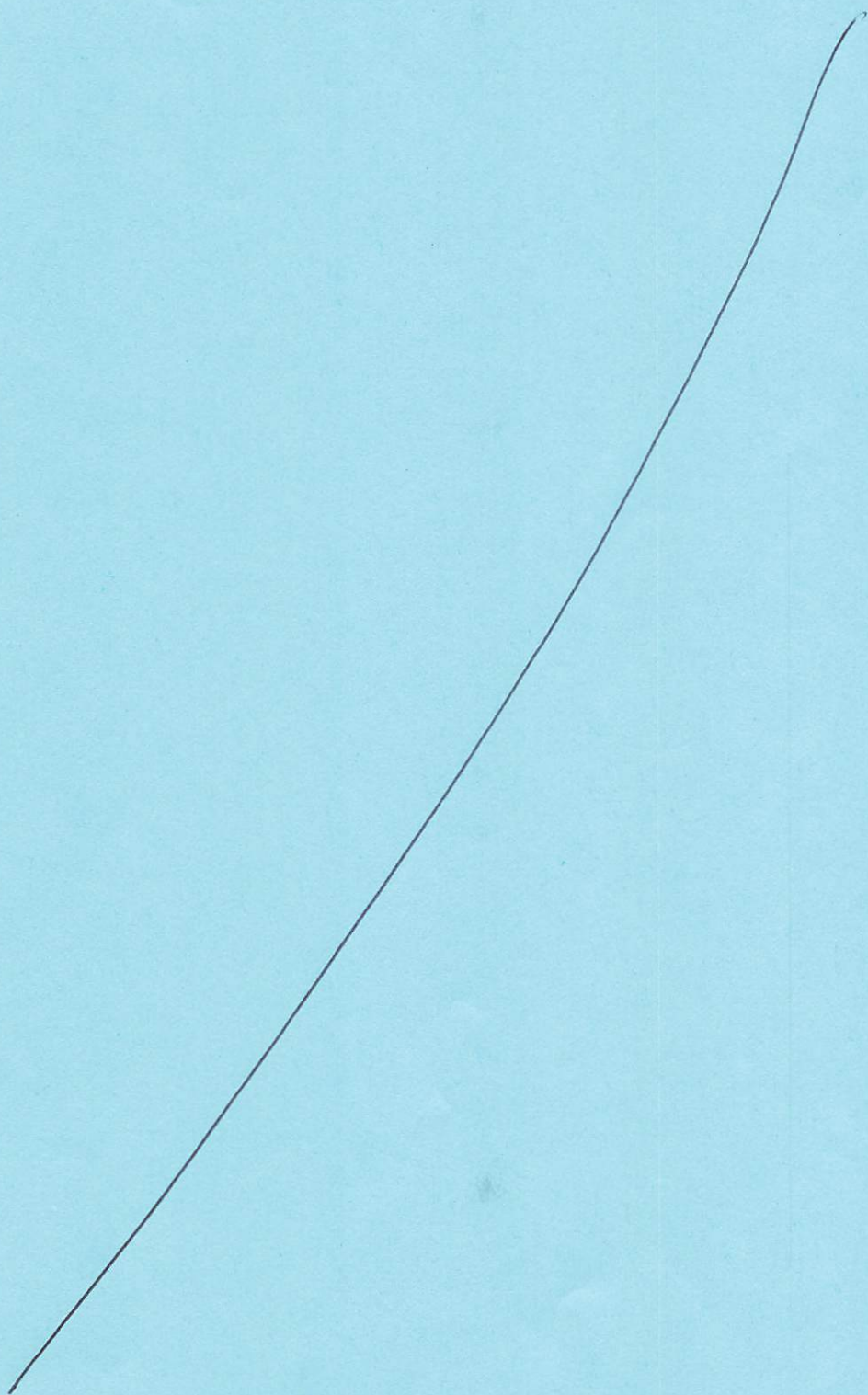
In 1978, I carried on a spirited argument by mail with Mr. Amos J. Loveday of Columbus when the Masonic Lodge marked the historic ZIEGER house on Scioto Street with a huge sign honoring the first session of court held there in August of 1811. The sign proclaims the family as the *Zeiglers*, which is an absolute,

unadulterated mistake and cannot be explained away--no matter how hard Mr. Loveday tried. I wonder how he would like to called Mr. Lovejoy!!? After the dedication of the marker, several descendants of the family were extremely irritated and we tried to prevail upon the Masons to change the sign. It was never done and, I imagine, that those descendants have now programed themselves, as I have, to ignore the sign completely. This is too bad and, to my thinking, almost worse than not marking the site at all.

I mention the subject of names in this issue because my article on Tate Dreisbach is such an excellent case in point. Careful readers will note three spellings of Dreisbach in the text. This is not sloppy journalism but it does need to be explained. Daniel Dreisbach, illustrious early citizen of Circleville, spelled his name with the ei. His son, James Denny, who removed to Alabama in the mid 19th century, retained the same spelling. His daughter, Maria Louise Dresbach Olds, seems to have dropped the i, for in all of the family references to her that I have found, the name is spelled Dresbach. Tate Dreisbach, the young Confederate soldier buried on the Olds lot, lay in an unmarked grave until 1938 when his grandniece, Carrie Olds Kindler, prevailed upon the government to set a small monument in his memory. The stone cutter misspelled his name and it appears as Tate Driesbach. I used all three spellings in my story.

As we were proofing the copy for this *Quarterly*, it was also necessary to remove the o from David Pontius' name. We have an equal number of families in the Circleville phone book spelled with the o and without it. It is important to know the difference.

My point is that your *Quarterly* editors do not assume anything when it comes to names. If we make mistakes, it isn't because we didn't try!

Located in Scioto Township on the west side of Walker Road, six-tenths mile south of State Route 762.

John Mundell, born March 4, 1794, Parish of Hulton, Scotland, came to Virginia in 1820. He married Miss Jannett McIntosh, their sons John David and Walter McIntosh Mundell were born there. They moved to Scioto Township in 1835, where James Grieve and Emily Thompson were born.

Bought 524 acres of forest land, of which he and Jannett sold two acres to the Trustees of the Presbyterian Church, on which was built a meeting house, the remainder used for a burying ground.

Walter Mundell mustered in Co. A. 114th Reg't September 10, 1862 at Camp Circleville, came home after the war broken in health and died Jan. 14, 1866; aged 34 years, 11 months. John died March 6, 1868; aged 74 years. Wife Jannett born 1801 in Virginia, died 1875. John's niece, Miss Jannett Filcomb, buried with the family, as well as John's mother-on-law, Margaret Shannon.

The first burial 1835, oldest tombstone 1840, latest 1977. Oldest person 103 years, 9 days.

Over the years many tombstones were broken or not legible. These were located in an unused part of cemetery.

This old cemetery has many war veterans buried here. 1812 veterans noted thus §, Civil War *, W.W.I †, W.W.II ‡.

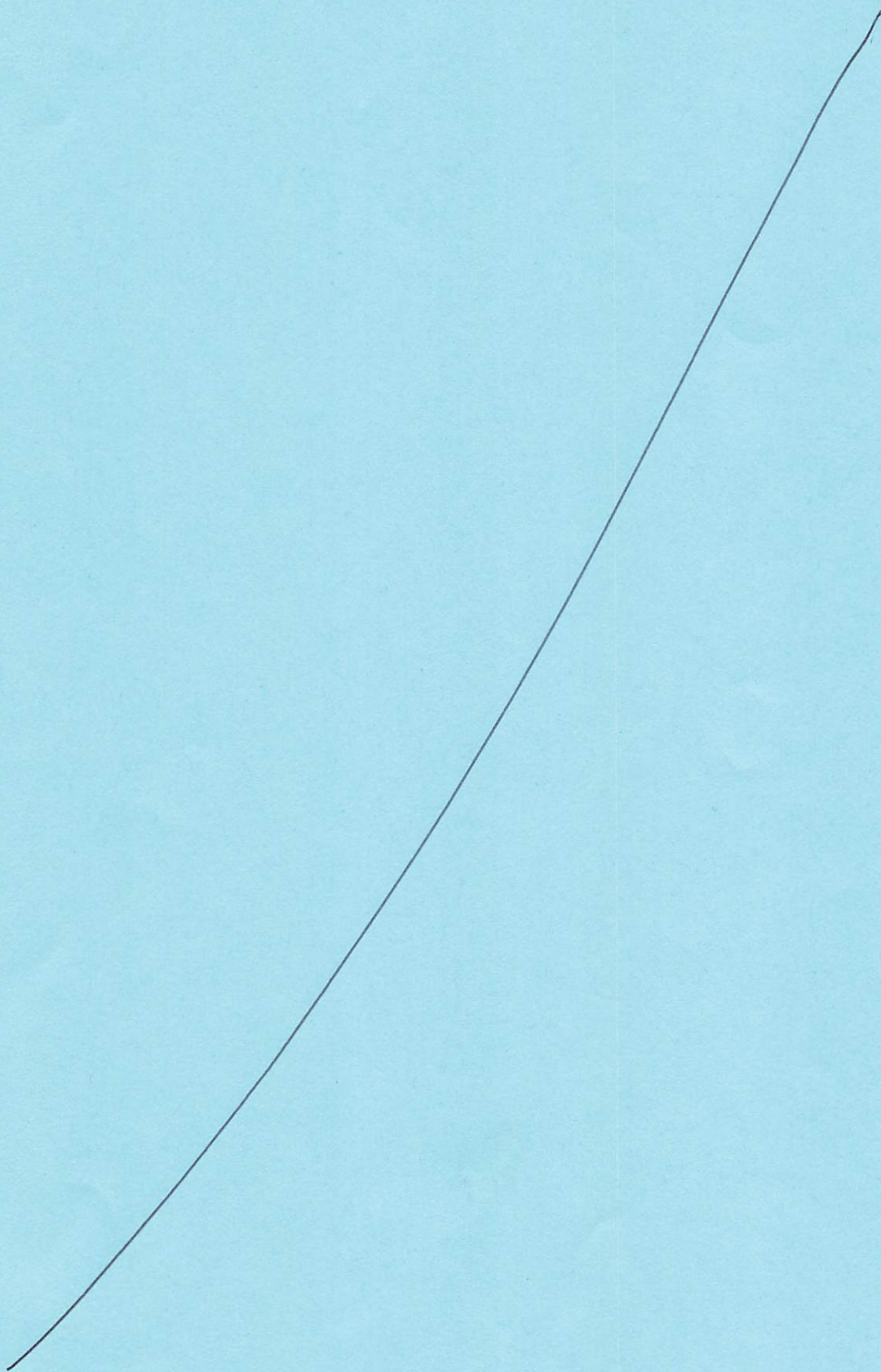

CEMETERY LISTS

Mr. and Mrs. Tom H. Tipton of Williamsport spent many hours and their spare time visiting burial grounds in Deercreek Township copying inscriptions on tombstones in 1910. Mr. Tipton, publisher of the *Williamsport News*, printed the lists in his paper. Since that time, these old burial grounds have disappeared or are in a very neglected state. These lists complete the reprint of their works in the *Pickaway Quarterly*. The list of the old Christian Church Cemetery was printed in Fall 1975; the Methodist Churchyard, Spring 1976, and Mt. Pleasant Churchyard, Winter 1977.

These lists were furnished by Esta M. Tipton, daughter-in-law of Mr. and Mrs. Tipton and last editor of the *Williamsport News*.

[Editor's Note: We have omitted the list of burials in Peck's burying ground, since that list was given by George Robinson, Jr. in the Spring 1977 issue. The two lists vary slightly. They are both available at the Genealogical Library. —JTD]

JOHNSON GRAVEYARD

The commentary preceding the listing of graves in this graveyard stated: "The Johnson graveyard takes its name from Robert C. Johnson, aged 101 years, who, with a number of his descendants, is buried therein." It is located on the S. G. Hunsicker farm, a good half mile northeast of Williamsport, and about one-third of the distance (due south) from the Lewis Manly homestead to the Circleville and Washington Pike. It was in the midst of a large wheat field in 1910. There were eight cedars growing in the plot 30 feet square. A large elm stands at the southwest corner and a large wild cherry at the southeast corner of the lot. There is no fence. Of the 17 stones in the lot, eight were standing. The others were scattered about in such a manner that the exact site of the graves could not be determined excepting those of Jonathan Hoagland and Robert C. Johnson. These are obelisks about 30 inches high. They had fallen over, but were dug out of the ground and set upon their bases before we (Mr. and Mrs. Tom H. Tipton) came away. It would cost about \$10.00 to put a fence around these graves. (The farm is now, 1982, owned by Mrs. Edna Newhouse.)

SCHLAGER CEMETERY

"There are three graves on the Andrew Schlager farm in the southern part of Deercreek Township. Some years ago a number of bodies were removed from the lot to Brown's Chapel graveyard. Those remaining are:

Schlager, Mary, wife of Jacob, died September 28, 1866; aged 27 years, 3 months, 26 days.

Schlager, Clara J., daughter of Jacob and Mary, died December 28, 1866; aged 9 months, 26 days.

Sumer, Matthew, died April 15, 1870; aged 66 years.

TAYLOR CEMETERY

"The Taylor Cemetery in the southern part of Deercreek Township has but one headstone in it. This one is down. The lot is enclosed in a wire fence.

Taylor, Elijah, died September 1, 1833; aged 29 years, 1 month, 19 days.

SNYDER CEMETERY

"The old burial ground on the Smith Ater land has had no care taken of it. The stones are down and in a pile. The lot is not enclosed; it is in an open field. Two headstones only remain; one of these is broken. The inscriptions are: Snyder, John, died September 9, 1840; aged 56 years, 8 days.

Snyder, Elizabeth, wife of John, died December 18, 1852; aged 62 years, 11 months, 24 days.

ALKIRE CEMETERY

"Established about 1820. Oldest legible inscriptions record deaths that occurred in 1823. Stones were dressed out and engraved in a very crude way. The Alkire Cemetery is on lands owned by F. D. Alkire. It is on the west bank of Deercreek, a short distance north of the house (1910) now occupied by Will Stevenson and a few hundred yards south of the C & M. V. railroad bridge. It has been surrounded by a board fence 16 × 18 panels (95 × 108 feet). The north, west and south fence is in bad shape, a portion of it lying flat; and some of the monuments have fallen down and are broken."

"In this cemetery there are four homemade stones, the inscriptions being very crudely cut. The two that are legible show that deaths occurred in 1823. The inscriptions are: Alkire, Michael, died February 12, 1843; aged 71 years, 1 month, 6 days.

Alkire, Dolley, wife of Michael, died May 11, 1854; aged 82 years, 1 month, 10 days. Maiden name was Phebus.

Alkire, Mary M., wife of B. F., died February 22, 1864; aged 29 years, 2 months, 15 days (down and broken in four pieces).

Alkire, Mary, wife of William M., died November 26, 1851; aged 40 years, 5 months, 8 days.

Alkire, Elizabeth, daughter of Wm. M. and M., died December 22, 1843; aged 3 years, 2 months, 7 days.

Alkire, William, son of William and Mary; died (nothing more can be read, stone worn away).

Alkire, Madason, died August 31, 1823; aged 10 years, 6 months, 10 days. (Homemade stone).

Another on south, tops touching, all that is legible, "aged" and "5 days." The third grave, headstone gone, footstone "D. A." The fourth, ten feet south, nothing legible on headstone, footstone "S. A."

Cade, Phineas, died January 12, 1845 in 39th year of his age.

Champ, Elizabeth Ann, daughter of Joseph, died March 15, 1824; age not given (down).

Gill, Elizabeth, wife of S. E. Gill, died January 24, 1855; aged 38 years, 11 months, 16 days.

Gill, Elizabeth J., daughter of L. and E. A., died March 22, 1861; aged 3 days (down).

Gill, Emily A., daughter of L. and E. A., died January 21, 1862, aged 2 years, 1 month, 9 days.

Hallstead, Michael, died September 14, 1823; aged 8 months, 17 days (homemade stone).

Hallstead, Amanda Ann, daughter of J. N. and M. J., died January 29, 1852; aged 1 year, 8 days.

Hurst, Alexander Watts, died January 21, 1844; aged 72 years, 3 months, 2 days.

Lukens, John, died the 4th month, the 24th day, 1863; aged 72 years, 3 months, 2 days.

Lukens, Alexandreu, died September 15, 1870; aged 49 years, 11 months, 11 days.

Lukens, Mary C., wife of Alexander; died January 12, 1876, aged 52 years, 4 months, 12 days. (On stone above the husband's name is Alaxandreu.)

Joseph P., died March 18, 1852, aged 29 days.

Phebus, D_____, died March ____, 1823; aged 22 years, 11 months, ____ days. (First name supposed to be Daniel. Stone scaled badly.)

Phebus, Martha, died November 2, 1873; aged 68 years, 7 months, 29 days (down and broken).

Phebus, George, died October 9, 1837; aged 75 years, 2 months, ____ days.

Phebus, Mary, wife of George, died June 9, 1858; aged 93 years, 3 months.

Phebus, Gabriel, died October 16, 1859; aged 51 years.

Phebus, Margaret, daughter of G. and M., died September 30, 1863; aged 16 years, 11 months, 28 days (down).

Phebus, Mattie A., daughter of G. and M., born April 19, 1853, died June 2, 1871 (down).

Wolfe, Millard C., son of R. and A. E., died December 19, 1858; aged 2 years, 10 months, 11 days.

HANSON GRAVEYARD

"The Hanson graveyard is on the John Bennett farm at the top of the pike leading to Bazore's Mill" wrote T. H. Tipton, in 1910. "It is surrounded by a substantial board fence. Inside of this is an iron fence, surrounding the graves of Daniel Hanson, Ruhe Ann Gilmore and Joseph Chany. This is a well-kept country graveyard." (In 1982, this graveyard is still there on the corner of Chillicothe Pike and St. Rt. 138.)

THE INSCRIPTIONS ARE:

Champ, Joseph, died February 10, 1838; aged 40 years, 1 month, 5 days.

Gilmore, Ruhe Ann, daughter of H. and M. Gilmore, died January 12, 1870; aged 27 years, 8 months, 5 days.

Hanson, Daniel, died June 2, 1838; aged 50 years, 5 months, 28 days.

Hastings, Scioto E., daughter of E. P. and M. Hastings, died July 10, 1853; aged 1 year, 11 months, 4 days.

There is another cemetery on the John Bennett farm. It is on the east side of the road between the pike and the house, now occupied by R. B. Blacker (1910). There is no fence around this plot, but the fencing material is on the ground ready for the workman.

THE INSCRIPTIONS ARE:

Landon, Mary, died February 15, 1871; aged 86 years, 9 months, 9 days.

Smith, Jonas H., died March 1, 1821; aged 45 years.

Cannon, Mary Ann, daughter of Sylvester and Ketury Cannon; died October 9, 1825; age 2 years.

There is still another burying ground on the Bennett land, but some years ago the bodies, including those of early Bennetts, were removed to Forest Cemetery at Circleville.

YATES BURYING GROUND

"The Yates burying ground is on the land owned by W. A. Bazore" wrote T. H. Tipton in 1910. (The land in 1982 is owned by Russell Timmons.) "It is on the south side of the Clarksburg Pike, nearly half a mile west of Bazore's Mill. It is not fenced and is so situated that it would seem wise to remove the bodies and inter them elsewhere, in some cemetery that is likely to be perpetuated. There are only three stones on the plot, only one of which is now standing. We are informed the two others never were placed in position.

THE INSCRIPTIONS ARE:

Yates, Davis, died March 13, 1840; aged 65 years, 5 months, 21 days.

Yates, Resin, died January 17, 1851; aged 44 years, 1 month, 7 days.

Yates, Marquis L., son of D. and N. Yates; died September 26, 1852; aged 1 year, 8 months, 2 days.

SMITH GRAVEYARD

"The Smith graveyard is on the farm of Charles O. Smith, south of the road leading from the Chillicothe Pike to the creek. It is surrounded by an iron fence and as well kept as many public cemeteries."

THE INSCRIPTIONS ARE:

Smith, Alexander, born July 4, 1817, died November 5, 1886; aged 69 years, 4 months, 1 day.

(This is a massive Barre granite obelisk, resembling that on the Cyrus Hornbeck lot in Springlawn); On the eight-foot marble obelisk, there is on the west side:

Smith, James, died in the 45 year of his age.

Smith, Phebe, wife of J. Smith, died April 16, 1872; aged 85 years, 4 months, 14 days.

On the South Side:

Anderson, Marie, wife of William Anderson, died January 23, 1843; aged 22 years, 7 months, 23 days.

Anderson, Margaret, daughter of Wm. and M. Anderson, died August 18, 1844; aged 2 years, 9 months, 27 days.

(Small head stones bearing the initials of the deceased mark the location of each grave.)

HALSTEAD GRAVEYARD

"The Halstead burial ground is east of Yellowbud Run and south of Circleville pike. It is in very bad shape. There is no fence or enclosure of any kind to protect the gravestones. Many are down and broken. The inscriptions on some cannot be read." (Note several years after Mr. and Mrs. Tipton visited the graves, the gravestones disappeared and there is no sign of a burial ground there. The land is being farmed.)

THE INSCRIPTIONS ARE:

Adams, Maria, wife of George, died May 29, 1866; aged 50 years (stone down and broken).

Allen, Harriet, consort of B. F., born January 2, 1822, died July 21, 1845 (down).

Cade, Evaline, born January 2, 1836, died January 29, 1855.

Hall, The Widow Hall, Her first husband, Halstead; died December 2, 1854.

Halstead - Balance of letters are not distinct.

Rose, James, died June 14, 1841; aged 39 years, 4 months, 11 days.

Terwilliger, Infant Daughter of Jacob and Elizabeth Terwilliger.

Wiggins, Sarah, daughter of Philip and Sarah, died 1832; aged 4 years, 1 month, 8 days.

HARRIS GRAVEYARD

The old burial ground of the B. W. Harris land has been abandoned. There are no longer any stones to tell who was buried there, and the fence that enclosed the lot has been removed.

"There is an old abandoned burial ground on the late James Walston farm located a short distance east of Williamsport. No care has been taken of this. The stones that are marked are in a pile by the fence. A few of the graves can be located by the rough boulder stones. The following are the inscriptions found on the marked stones: Walston, Josiah, died November 2, 1857; aged 79 years, 2 months, 12 days.

Helwagen, _____, son of C. B. and S. Helwagen; died April 28, _____; aged 10 months

_____, died August 16, 1860; aged 1 year, 4 days.

"The last two stones are so defaced as to make it impossible to read the names."

ABANDONED CEMETERIES

"Evidence of fifteen burials on the D. K. Yates farm. No care has been taken of the burial ground on the D. R. Yates land. The stones, all but two are down, lying flat on the ground or in piles. Many of the stones are broken, and

parts are missing. No fence encloses the lot. The following inscriptions were copied from the stones remaining" wrote T. H. Tipton who with his wife visited in 1910.

Akley, Samuel, died August 7, 1840; aged 26 years, 3 months, 7 days. Weep not for me, My Daughter dear; I am not dead, but sleeping here.

Brown, Nancy, daughter of P. and N.; aged 1 year, 6 months (no date).

Brown, Jeremiah, died August 23, 1855 (stone broken, parts gone).

Brown, Peter, died 1822; aged 11 years, 11 months (defaced).

Hiles, Francis M., son of Jacob and Mary J., died May 6, 1865; aged 3 years, 2 months, 2 days.

Simon, Joseph, died June 16, 1841; aged 59 years, 6 months, 4 days.

Simon, Charles J., died June 23, 1838; aged 25 years, 1 month, 21 days.

Simon, James K., died August 30, 1838; aged 24 years (defaced).

Williams, Sally, daughter of Theophilus, died February 25, 1829, in the 24th year of her age.

Williams, Trustin B., son of Theophilus and Sallie, died July 26, 1827; aged 2 years, 1 month, 5 days.

Yates, Infant son of D. R. and N. B.; died April 14, 1863.



FROM THE PIGEONHOLE

When Circleville was laid out in 1810 the two main streets that intersected at the Court House Square were both named Main Street: North Main, South Main, East Main and West Main. This designation continued for some time and the numbering of businesses and homes on Main Street, east and west, started at the Canal and went east to the corporation limits at the Lancaster Pike. The numbering of Main Street, north and south, started at Hargus Creek and went to the southern city limits.

The north-south street name was changed to Court Street about the time the second courthouse was built in 1845. The numbering remained the same until sometime

between 1895 and 1900 when the numbering system as we know it today was installed. At this time the numbering started at Court and Main and went all four directions with the additional designation of East Main, West Main, North Court and South Court.

These two methods of numbering have caused much confusion when trying to pinpoint a particular business or residence as a number, such as, 120 Main Street was much closer to the Canal than to Court Street.

Discovery of these facts have aided the research and documentation of many of the articles that have appeared in the *Quarterly*.
