## MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS FROM THE WESTERN HERALD

As far as we know, <u>The Western Herald</u> published September 3, 1831 was the first newspaper published in Shelby County, Ohio. The publisher was Thomas Smith, who has been described as something of an eccentric. The story goes that Smith walked to Cincinnati and then carried home to Sidney on his back the necessary paper for printing the newspaper.

The newspaper consisted largely of political and other news, most of which had been gleaned from other newspapers printed in Ohio and the East. The few scattered items mentioning residents of Sidney and the neighboring counties are presented here. These items were copied and contributed by Doris Stephens.

Saturday, September 3, 1831

DIED: On Hogg creek, Allen County, Ohio, on Friday, 26th ult. Mr. John McCOY, late from Maryland, aged about 30.

SHELBY COUNTY COURT OF COMMON PLEAS: Notice is hereby given, that Administrators of Madison PERSINGER, late of said county, deceased, filed their account for settlement at the next term of this court. James WELLS, Clerk, Sidney, August 29th, 1831.

Saturday, September 10, 1831

MARRIED: On Wednesday the 31st ult by Rev. James COE, Mr. Samuel CLARK to Miss Sarah, daughter of Mr. John CROZIER, both of Shelby County.

MARRIED: In this town, on Thursday evening last by J. FRANCIS, Esq. Mr. Charles MAULT, formerly of Richmond, Virginia, to Miss Elizabeth HUBBELL, daughter of Mr. Hezekiah HUBBELL.

DIED: At Wapaghkonnetta, Allen co. Ohio, about the 1st ult, BLACK-HOOF, one of the Shawnese tribe of Indians, aged about 114 years. He was well known throughout the western country as a formidable enemy in war, although the latter part of his warfaring life was devoted to the American cause. He was at St. Clair's, Harmer's, and Crawford's defeats, and perhaps, at the time of his death, was the last man living who was at Braddock's defeat. (<u>Pigua Gaz</u>.)

(This issue contains a lengthy account of a meeting held at the courthouse to consider "the utility of the extension of the Miami Canal".) Mr. MANNING was about 40 years of age, an industrious and enterprising citizen, and has left a wife, several children and many relations to lament his awful and untimely death. ## SHELBY COUNTY ROADS

The rich earth, shaded by heavy woods, were avenues of mud and even after they were corduroyed with logs, travel was difficult.

Pioneers used the sturdiest of farm wagons to go to church, to market and for pleasure outings and joy rides. Even the tradional "spring wagons" were too light as this county was being established.

If grain was hauled to Cincinnati or Sandusky, the trip took more than a week. After the grain was sold (only the lowest price was obtained), expenditures were limited to the scantest of necessities.

In 1865 a toll turnpike was built from Sidney to Palestine (now Tawawa) in Green township. The latter part of the 1860's saw the passage of a state law permitting the building of free turnpikes to be paid for by taxing lands two miles each side of the pikes & to be paid in yearly installments.

This started pike building and a boom in real estate. In 1913 there were 300 miles of county roads, costing nearly two million dollars. Shelby county residents, in 1913, were described as "joy riders" in their automobiles, raising the dust at a speed of 20 miles an hour!

CORDUROY ROADS were constructed by men and boys of the neighborhood with their axes and oxen. First they laid brush on the mud, and then logs and rails on top, and then shoveled mud over the top as pavement.

CANAL FEEDER: The Sidney canal feeder from Lockington to Port Jefferson is 14 miles long and cost \$391,258. (From THE SIDNEY DAILY NEWS 12 Feb 1891)



This book contains petitions to sell "land" or "real estate" to get money to pay debts; for living expenses; to invest in something with a better rate of interest, etc. Most of the land is in Shelby County, Ohio but if not, the other location is given.

The request to be allowed to sell land was made by the administrator, executor, guardian or trustee. If initiated by the guardian against his wards, a temporary guardian was appointed by the court to guard the interests of the minors during this time.

Appraisors were appointed by the court and were "judicious and disinterested men of the vicinity" and were to "actually view the premise and cause a just valuation and appraisement".

Land was to be sold for no less than 2/3 of the appraised value with 1/3 cash in hand; 1/3 due in a specified time (usually 9 months or 1 year) and the final 1/3 due in a specified time (usually 18 months or 2 years) from the date of the sale. "Deferred payments to bear interest from date of sale and be secured by a mortgage on the premise."

Most of the information given in this book could be found in other records such as estate or guardianship files, deeds, etc.

Spelling of names and places are shown as read. Minors aged 14, 16 & 19 years in one of the petitions were referred to as "infants of tender years".

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

Named in honor of General Isaac Shelby, a noted officer of the American Revolution and the first governor of the state of Kentucky, Shelby County was created April 1, 1819 from the northern part of Miami County and had a population of about 2000 people.

In the description of land FR=Fraction of; pt= part of; MRS=McPherson Section (in southern part of Jackson Tp.; Grayson Tp. became known as Washington Tp. & Dingmansburg is the part of Sidney that is east of the Great Miami River.

Where lands have been listed as Resident tax and only a tittle bond I am of opinion it is such a title as authorizes the person holding to interet it for taxation for he has an equitable interest acletish. I would therefore in that case not alter the lands thus listed. I consider a tittle bond good evedence of ownership.



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# DIVORCE ACTIONS SHELBY COUNTY, OHIO

# 1819 TO 1900

With few exceptions, which have been noted, the divorce actions listed herein passed through the Shelby County Court. Information found in the court news columns of the SIDNEY JOURNAL has been included. Most of the actions finalized in divorce decrees, a few were continued and not reentered and some were dismissed. Others were filed but never brought before the court. The disposition of all actions has been reported as accurately as possible in this record.

Abbreviations used are: ch, child; chrn, children; deft, defendant: m. married, pltf, plaintiff; res, residence. The person filing the action is the plaintiff, the other the defendant. Example: Jane Doe vs John Doe: Jane pltf, John deft.

ADAMS, Sarah vs Robert Adams: Feb 1867. Deft guilty of neglect of duty, divorce granted & sole custody of Theodore Augustus Adams to pltf.

ALLEN, Mary M. vs James C. Allen: Jan 1895. Injunction against deft to restrain him from disposing of any property. Jan 1896. Deft guilty of gross neglect of duty, divorce granted, custody of 2 chrn to pltf. Mary nee Wren, daughter of Benjamin Wren.

ALLISON, Emma vs Charles Allison: May 1878. Action for divorce denied.

AMRIN, Viva vs Harry D. Amrin: Apr 1896. Couple m. 16 Oct 1887 in Flora, IL, deft guilty of gross neglect of duty, divorce granted & custody of ch to pltf.

ANDERSON, Anna E. vs Abner Anderson: May 1882. Deft guilty of gross neglect of duty, divorce granted.

ANDERSON, James A. vs Catherine Elizabeth Anderson: Apr 1898. Couple m. 4 Mar 1881. Deft eloped to Galion with Harry L. Wilson, now in KY with her sister, guilty of neglect of duty, cruelty & adultery, divorce granted. (James A. Anderson killed by train in July 1898.)

ANDERSON, William vs Hattie Anderson: Sept 1895. Couple m. Apr 1889. Deft quilty of extreme cruelty & gross neglect of duty, divorce granted.

APPLE, Finley vs Sarah Jane Apple: Apr 1854. Action dismissed.

APPLE, Sarah Jane vs Finley Apple: Apr 1855. Couple m. 8 Mar 1849, separated Apr 1850 when deft abandoned pltf & went to pay respects to lady in Brown Co., OH, divorce granted.

APPLEGATE, Sarah J. vs William H. Applegate: May 1863. Deft absent more than 3 years, divorce granted, custody of Alonzo Applegate to pltf & maiden name, Sarah J. Williams, restored.

ARGABRIGHT, Jemima vs Preston Argabright: Nov 1843. Deft non-resident of state, did not appear, guilty of wilful absence, divorce granted.

ARTINGSTALL, Deborah vs Benjamin F. Artingstall: Feb 1869. Deft guilty of adultery, divorce granted & pltf restored to maiden name. (Not given.)

BABCOCK, Nancy J. vs Salathiel Babcock: Sept 1882. Deft guilty of adultery, divorce granted.

BAILEY, Charles A. vs Harriet M. Bailey: Oct 1894. Couple m. 15 Sept 1885, deft charged with cruelty, died before case came to court, action abated.

BAKER, Andrew vs Elizabeth J. Baker: Jan 1863. Deft absent more than 3 years, divorce granted. BAKER, Harvey N. vs Mary S. Baker: Sept 1887. Deft went home to her father more than 3 years ago, divorce granted. BAKER, H.W. vs Martha E. Baker: Oct 1883. Deft guilty of adultery. Divorce granted. BAKER, Mary vs Peter Baker: Feb 1897. Injunction against deft to restrain him from selling any property. BAKER, Mollie vs James Baker: Apr 1886. Deft guilty of gross neglect of duty & frequent absence, divorce granted & pltf restored to maiden name, Mollie Pope. BALDWIN, Isabel vs Eli Baldwin: June 1874. Alimony only. BARLEY, Joseph vs Sarah R. Barley: Apr 1880. Case dismissed. BARNES, Elijah vs Rebecca Barnes: May 1848. Fraud found in marriage contract, divorce granted. BARNHART, Valentine vs Mary Barnhart: June 1840. Couple m. 1 Jan 1837 in Stark Co., OH, divorce granted & pltf restored to maiden name, Mary Shull. BARRIGER, Catherine E. vs Byron Barriger: Dec 1898. 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

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
