So with those seeds and the aid of a computer to keep track, he was able to compile a number of both his wife's and his family lines. It was very enlightening to find so many "ancestors/cousins" that our families did not know before our research.

Matthew Rowland is one of those ancestors from whom he was able to prove descent for First Families of Ohio. He came to Stark Co, OH and located in what was to become Lawrence Tp in 1814 and laid off in lots the Town of Milan, later the western part of Canal Fulton, for sale. In 1815 his daughter became the second wife of Robert Cameron. This became his brick wall for a number of years. Not until a Holmes County Chapter newsletter abstract of a quitclaim deed did he find Mary Rowland's father in Stark County. Matthew died in 1822 with many of the lots unsold. This caused each of the children to sign the deeds of the lots as they were sold. By the mid 1830's most of the children and their families had migrated to Henry, Holmes, or Wood Counties in Ohio. One daughter remained in Stark County.

The program will show, with slides, how he found and recorded the Matthew Rowland family.

It was noted in checking the marriage of Henry Yant and Elizabeth McKinney that the Stark County Marriage records do not include in the index those couples who applied for the marriage license but for whom the record was not completed by a return by the minister. Thus many couples may have their names in the Marriage Books but there is no way to locate them if they did not follow through with a marriage or if the minister did not follow through with his report.

Ohio Vital Statistics

The following article was written by Charles Arp, Archives Library Division of The Ohio Historical Society and was contained in the Winter 1996 issue of <u>Preview</u>, Vol 5, No 1.

Vital statistics record the most important events in our lives: our births, our marriages, and our deaths. And these public documents are research materials most frequently referenced by the staff of the Ohio Historical Society's Archives/Library Division. Death certificate requests alone make up more than half of the twelve thousand mail inquiries replied to annually by the division's reference librarians. Other records may be more interesting, or more important historically, but no records are more often used than vital statistics.

There are several important dates researchers must keep in mind when using Ohio vital statistics. The first is 1867, the year in which the state first required public officials in each of its eighty-eight counties to maintain birth and death records. The second is December 1908, at which time a department of state government, the Bureau of Vital Statistics, first

began keeping birth and death records. The third is 1949, the year in which marriage records--kept by officials at the county level since 1803--were first maintained on a statewide basis by the Ohio Division of Vital Statistics.

Marriage records were among the first public documents created and maintained by county officials in the Northwest Territory, and the practice of recording marriages--originally undertaken to ensure the orderly validation of property rights in probate proceedings--continued at the county level after Ohio became a state in 1803.

There is no statewide index available for marriages that took place in Ohio before September 7, 1949. Those who are interested in researching marriages dated prior to that time need to know the county in which they occurred. Ohio's statewide marriage record file and index is located at the Division of Vital Statistics in Columbus (PO Box 15098, 35 East Chestnut Street 43215). The telephone number is (6714)466-2531.

The marriage record holdings of the Archives/Library Division are incomplete at best, with files for the counties of central Ohio among the most comprehensive. The division's Franklin County holdings, for example, date from 1803 through 1969. Marriage record files for counties in other regions of the state, however, are generally meager, particularly so for the twentieth century.

Marriage records dated before September 7, 1949, and birth and death records dated before December 20, 1908, are still considered county records and may be held at the office of origin, at the Ohio Historical Center in Columbus, or at a member repository of the Ohio Network of American History Research Centers. Uncertainty surrounding the exact location of these records is one of the most common and vexing problems facing genealogists who pursue family history research in Ohio.

At some time in the future, the birth record files that are now maintained by the Ohio Division of Vital Statistics may be transferred to the custody of the Ohio Historical Society. The historical society, which serves as the State Archives of Ohio, currently holds death records dating from December 1, (Continued on page 14)

1908, through December 31, 1944. Last October the Division of Vital Statistics transferred an eight-year series of death records dating from January 1, 1937, through December 31, 1944, to the Ohio Historical Center. The transfer includes more than six hundred thousand individual certificates bound in 2,548 volumes. It is expected that the records, which are indexed and cover the entire state, will be open to researchers by January 1996.

In order to make these frequently used records more widely available and to preserve the information they contain, the Archives/Library Division recently arranged to have both the index and the death certificates microfilmed by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The LDS Church, working through the Genealogical Society of Utah, microfilms select series of vital statistics for free and then provides a copy of the film to the custodian of the original files. The work is done all over the world--with records having been filmed even in the iron curtain countries of Europe before the fall of communism. The microfilm is sent to the LDS Family History Library in Salt Lake City where it is available to the public. It is also loaned on request to LDS family history centers found throughout the Most users of the microfilmed United States. genealogical records are not members of the LDS Church.

Those who film the vital statistics are LDS missionaries, usually a husband and wife team. They are taught microfilming procedures and are supervised by a micrographics professional employed by the Genealogical Society of Utah. The Ohio Historical Society has had a long and fruitful relationship with the Genealogical Society of Utah dating back to 1959. Over the past two years, five LDS missionary teams have refilmed more than two million death certificates, work made necessary by the poor quality of the original microfilm file.

The Ohio Historical Society, working in cooperation with the Genealogical Society of Utah and the Ohio Division of Vital Statistics, is ensuring that these family history resources are preserved and made available to the public.

Famous Men in Early Canton

Joshua Gibbs came to Canton in 1823, via Cleveland from his native city of Trenton, NJ. He first lived in Cleveland where he worked at a forge. He went to that city after he had completed his apprenticeship in the blacksmith, cooper and woodworking trades in Trenton and New York. At the age of 19, Gibbs traveled south to Canton and found work with George Fogle, who had a cooper shop south of the square in our city. He had a dream of having his own agricultural implement company.

In 1829, he married Barbara Schaefer and during the years that followed they had ten children. Shortly after their marriage, Gibbs opened his first blacksmith shop. Here in his spare time he used his mechanical genius to develop a better plow than any on the market. He experimented endlessly and in 1836 obtained a patent on the Gibbs Bar Share Plow. The new plow was made of metal and had a greatly improved mouldboard shape. It was an immediate hit with farmers throughout Ohio, Michigan, Illinois and Indiana. It was the first plow manufactured west of the Allegheny Mountains. To publicize his plow, Gibbs entered many plowing competitions and won many championships.

In 1856, Joshua Gibbs retired from business at the age of 52. His son Lewis took over the company and formed a partnership with his two brothers, Martin and William. After seven years, the firm was discontinued and Lewis joined John Bucher and others in founding Bucher and Gibbs Plow Company. Bucher and Gibbs was the biggest plow company until the early 1880's. It employed about 75 people and turned out \$ 1 20,000 worth of plows yearly. In 1891, Gibbs left the company to devote full time to his Gibbs Lawn Rake Company that he owned with his sons, Elmer and Alvin. This company was the forerunner of Gibbs Manufacturing Company.

Mr Gibbs died on December 15, 1875 at the age of 72. He had fulfilled his dream and made a lasting contribution to the industrial growth of Canton.

Out-Of-Africa (Cont)

Tishkoff said the amount of variation in the pattern is a measure of how long the DNA sequence has existed in a population. It also is a rough measure of time, since it takes many generations for a specific population to develop a mixed pattern of DNA sequence. For this reason, she said, the rich variety in patterns found in sub-Saharan Africa suggests that anatomically modern humans existed there much longer than in rest of the world.

"This pattern of variation also suggests that the common ancestry of the non-African populations is quite recent," Tishkoff said. She estimated that the migration from Africa was no earlier than 100,000 years ago and could be as recent as 70,000.

Mark Stoneking, a Pennsylvania State researcher who also is studying human evolution by analyzing gene patterns, said the study by Tishkoff "is an important step" in trying to understand the migration history of the early anatomically modern humans. "Their findings are entirely consistent with the out-of-Africa theory," he said.

This theory is that modern humans first evolved in Africa and then moved into rest of the world, replacing a primitive human like creature, such as Neanderthal Man, that had evolved in Africa perhaps 2 million years earlier and had migrated into Asia and Europe.

Some researchers, however, contend that there may have been a parallel evolution, in which modern humans arose from primitive ancestors both in Africa and in Asia. Stoneking said the Tishkoff findings support the idea that non-Africans sprang from a single genetic subset in Africa. "Those findings are most easily explained by an African origin," he said.

Such Captain would outrank all other Captains without a Brevet, thus giving him a slight edge on future promotions.

Sutler: A man who followed a regiment to sell necessary items to the soldiers. They were unofficial arrangements by each regimental commander until Congress made sutlers official on 19 Mar 1862. Replaced by the Post Exchange after the Civil War.

Zouave: A special type of Infantry copied from a French North African regiment. Zouaves were noted for their precision drill, fast marching pace and gaudy uniforms.

Sappers and Pioneers: Specialized forms of Engineer Troops.

Ohio Death Certificates

The July 1995 Tree Climber had a full page article on Ohio Death Certificates. Most of the information is still correct but there have been some changes.

As previously reported the State of Ohio Department of Health turned over to the Ohio Historical Society all Death Records from 1908 to 31 Dec 1944 (this was previously from 1908 to 31 Dec 1936). They now have 12 indexes to search as follows: 1908, 1909, 1910, 1911, 1912, 1913-17, 1918-22, 1923-27, 1928-32, 1933-37, 1938-40, and 1941-44. They will search only two indexes per request and you have to pick the indexes. The cost for an uncertified copy is \$3.18 for Ohio residents (includes Ohio sales tax) and \$3.00 for non-residents. If you want a certified copy, send two checks: One for \$3.18 (or \$3.00) made out to the Ohio Historical Society and

another for \$7.00 for certifica-tion by the state made out to Treasury, State of Ohio.

If you go in person to the Ohio Historical Society you can find the Death Certificate by yourself and make a copy for 25 cents which includes state sales tax.

The cost of an uncertified Death Certificate is 3 cents plus a SASE. One SASE can cover 5 certificates. Although the usual rule is send no cash by mail, they will accept 3 pennies taped to a card inside the envelope.

There is no change in the cost of a certified copy which remains \$7.00. This price is established by law and is the same no matter if you obtain one from your local health department. Make out the check to Treasury State of Ohio.

If you call the Ohio Department of Health on (614) 466-2531 an answering machine will automatically give you the details of obtaining vital records including address. However, they do not mention the 3 cent price for an uncertified copy. If you stay on the line after the automatic message, a person comes on the line and you can then obtain prices for uncertified copies. Your editor verified the 3 cent price in a phone call.

Please note the 3 cent price for uncertified copies applies to Birth Certificates also. All Birth Certificates in the state from 1908 to present day are kept at the Ohio Department of Health in Columbus, Ohio.

Some local Health Departments have changed their price for an uncertified copy of birth and death records:

City of Canton now charges \$1.00. City of Massillon now charges \$.25 City of Alliance still charges \$1.50 Stark County still charges \$.25 All charge \$7.00 for a certified copy.

The Forts of Ohio

Fort Amanda: Built in 18121 on the Auglaize River near old Ottawa Indian town.

<u>Fort Ancient:</u> Located on the high bluffs on the Little Miami River in Warren County. It was built by a prehistoric tribe supposedly the Mound Builders. It is one of the largest pre-historic forts in America.

Fort Ball: Built by General William Henry Harrison during the War of 1812 on the Sandusky River at the site on Tiffin.

Fort Defiance: Built by General Anthony Wayne in 1794 at the junction of the Auglaize and Maumee Rivers.

<u>Fort Deposit:</u> Built by General Anthony Wayne in 1794 on the north bank of the Maumee River, and used as a deposit for supplies.

Fort Findlay: Built in 1812 on Blanchard's Fort in Hancock County.

Fort Finney: Built in 1785 by General Richard Butler on a journey down the Ohio River, it was the first work for human habitation built between the Miamis. The fort was abandoned by 1789, the troops going to the Indiana side of the Ohio opposite Louisville where a small work was also erected bn likewise called Fort Finney.

Fort Gower: A stockade built by Lord Dunmore on the Hocking River in 1774.

Fort Greenville: Built on the site of Greenville in 1793 by General Anthony Wayne.

<u>Fort Hamilton:</u> Built by General Arthur St Clair in 1791. It stood on the great Miami River at the present site of Hamilton.

Fort Harmar: Located on the west bank of the Muskingum River at Marietta. Built in 1785 by Major John Doughty.

<u>Fort Industry:</u> Built by Wayne's troops and stood on the Maumee River at the present site of Toledo.

Fort Jefferson: Built by General St Clair in 1791 about 50 miles north of Fort Hamilton, just west of the present site of Greenville.

Fort Junandat: a French trading post built in 1754 on Sandusky River It was abandoned at the end of the French-Indian War.

<u>Fort Laurens:</u> Built by General McIntosh in 1778. The fort stood below Sandy Creek on the Tuscarawas River near the present site of Bolivar.

<u>Fort Loramie:</u> An English trading post built in 1750. It was destroyed by General George Rogers Clark. General Lane built another fort at this location and called it Fort Alliance.

Fort McArthur: Built in 1812 located on the Scioto River in Hardin County.

Fort Meigs: Built in 1812-1813 on the Maumee River opposite the rapids by General William Henry Harrison.

<u>Fort Miami:</u> May have been first fort built in 1680 by Canadians. Located on Maumee River near Maumee. It was the site of the headquarters of British General Proctor during the seige of Fort Meigs during the War of 1812.

Fort Piqua: A stockade built for storage purposes by General Anthony Wayne a short distance north of Piqua.

<u>Fort Recovery:</u> Built by troops of General Anthony Wayne in 1793. It stood on the west bank of the Wabash River.

Fort St Clair: Built a short distance north of the present town of Eaton in 1791 by Major John S Gano.

Fort St Marys: Built by General Anthony Wayne's Army in 1794 where the town of St Marys now stands.

Fort Sandusky: A French trading post built in 1730 on Sandusky River in Erie County, near Sandusky.

Fort Seneca: Built by General Harrison in 1812 on the Sandusky River a short distance from Fort Stevenson.

<u>Fort Stevenson:</u> Stood on the Sandusky River on the present site of Fremont and was built in 1812.

<u>Fort Steuben:</u> Built on the present site of Stuebenville in 1789 and was one of the first outposts in the northwest territory.

<u>Fort Washington:</u> Built in what is now Cincinnati in 1789 by Major John Doughty, the commander of a body of troops sent by General Harmar from Fort Harmar with discretionary power to locate a fort in the Miami country. It became an important military headquarters.

Soundex at Western Reserve

On page 109 of the September 1996 Tree Climber we listed the Soundex for the 1900, 1910. and 1920 censuses at Western Reserve Historical Society. This information was determined from a letter written by WRHS soliciting funds for purchase of additional Soundex film.

We have now learned that 5,268 rolls of Soundex film were ordered by WRHS to beat a substantial price increase. All of the US Federal Population census microfilm has been available for some time and when the new order is processed and paid for, the library will also have all of the Soundex available for 1880 and 1900.

In 1910 only 21 states were indexed and WRHS will have Soundex for: Kentucky, Michigan, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

In 1920 all states were indexed and WRHS will have Soundex for: Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, Vermont and West Virginia.

This information supersedes the information in the October Tree Climber. However, additional donations for Soundex microfilm are still solicited. Film purchased from the National Archives, Washington, DC has increased in price recently.

haps with the orderly who stood before their tents, or the private who held their stirrups."

A widespread and healthy sentiment which the soldier encountered on his return regarded his savings, those snug little sums that most of the men found in their pockets as the result of the long delay in paying the armies. The men must not be fleeced out of these, so everybody had decided,--they must be persuaded to invest them. A favorite investment with many soldiers was the seven-thirties, a national loan issued in sums from \$50 upward, and bearing interest at 71/2%. The seven-thirties were advertised in every town and at every country corner. Agents for them traveled the North over, subscriptions were taken at night, every device possible was practiced for putting them in the way of workingmen and soldiers. Many soldiers did take advantage of the loan, though a greater number used their money more boldly. They sought the oil regions of Pennsylvania, the silver mines of Colorado, the gold mines of Idaho, the cornfields of Kansas, the scenes of any one of the tremendous developments of national resources which had taken in the four years they had been fighting, hoping there to "make a strike" which would give them wealth.

These then were the outlets into which the returning legions flowed. That they disappeared so promptly and quietly was due primarily to the manliness of the men themselves, their sturdy independence, their unconsciousness of their own desserts, their healthy desire for work. But there was another factor in their assimilation which should not be forgotten. It never could have taken place without the cooperation of the people at home. It was they who had by gigantic sacrifices furnished the money for the war. It was their energy which had, at the same time, developed the West, increased imports, opened new industries. It was they who foresaw the danger in the floods of men which the disbanding of the volunteers would cause, and prepared for them, opening to them their old positions, calling them to new enterprises. It was they who said to every civilian, You must step aside until the soldier is served; to the soldier, You must work, and here is the place. The citizens of the North deserve, indeed, as much credit for the rapid assimilation of the volunteer army in 1865 as the War Department for its orderly disbandment.

Manliness, vigor, foresight efficiency explain the success of the gigantic undertaking. The motive power was the hallowing flood of solemn and tender emotions which swept over the country at the sight of the returning soldiers. Men remembered them as they had gone forth--gay, fresh, and youthful. They saw them now stern, bronzed, mature. Every one of these returning men recalled, too, others that had gone out with him, but would never return recalled terrible days after great battles, defeats, slaughter, long waiting for victory. With the bitter memories came the deep thankfulness that now finally it was all over. There would be no more battles, no more prisons, no more lists of dead and wounded. The war was over, the cause won. There was too great and too reverent thanksgiving in the North in 1865 for men to neglect the interests of the boys in blue.

The men were quick to feel the spirit of the welcome. They realized the sincerity of the enthusiasm and the helpfulness which met them on every hand. They saw themselves the honored guests of the North, and their pride and self-respect were aroused. They came at once, too, under the sanctifying influence of reunion with friends and families.

As they marched into a town they saw again and again a woman rush from a cheering crowd to cling sobbing to a husband, a child bound out crying, "Father! Father!" a comrade spring from the ranks to clasp a mother. It was the sight of wives weeping with joy, of mothers thanking God for their sons, which all the summer and fall stirred the hearts of the returning soldiers. For the sake of these sweet things more that all else, these men, in whom love of danger and adventure had become a strong and compelling passion, hung up their guns and cheerfully took up the steady grind of earning their daily bread. The article, <u>Disbanding the Union Army</u>, was published in *McClure's Magazine* in March of 1901. It was written by Ida M Tarbell, a staff writer for *McClure's*. She is best known as a muck-raker who wrote *The History of the Standard Oil Company* which was one of the first of the muck-raking books. In fact, the break-up of the Standard Oil Company subsequently was a direct result of the material contained in the book. When she and several of the other staffers of *McClure's* quit and started *The American Magazine*, they sounded a death knell for *McClure's*.

Explanation of Illegitimacy

There were many reasons for illegitimacy:

- 1. Wars. In war times girls were raped by soldiers.
- 2. The parents did not agree with the choice of mate because of his social class, or lack of property.
- 3. There were times when the daughter didn't want to marry the man that the family had chosen and could perhaps get family consent by having a child by the man of her choice.
- 4. There were religious reasons. There is one case where the girl was Protestant and the boy Catholic. She had six children with him but they weren't allowed to get married. The village she lived in was pure Protestant and her parents were very prominent in the community and therefore he didn't get permission to live there.

Graveside Plantings Have Meaning

Many 18th century cemeteries had very significant religious meanings, according to Donna Lynne Benson of Chagrin Falls, OH. Some hynnals called Christ the Rose of Sharon. Sometimes plants were planted to try to cure whatever the person died of. For example, Hawthorn is associated with high blood pressure and angina. The tulip poplar with dysentery and malaria. An oak signified eternal life and steadfastness. Moss is maternal love. Dr Benson has a degree in anthropology and historic archaeology. She takes many hours researching old cemeteries of the Church of the Brethren, many in Adams County, OH and northern Kentucky. Many small cemeteries have been lost over the years, but sometimes their plantings hold a clue to their culture.

Naturalization

The first naturalization law in the United States was passed by Congress in 1790. This law gave certain courts the right to naturalize aliens. Under this law an alien could apply for citizenship after being in this country for two years. Before this time, a person always remained a citizen of his native land, no matter where he lived. It was not until 1870, that Great Britain finally recognized the right of an individual to leave the country and become the citizen of another country.

The 1795 Federal law allowed a free white person to apply for citizenship provided he had:

- (1) Resided in the U S at least five years.
- (2) Declared his intent to become a citizen at least three years previously.
- (3) Resided in the state or territory where his final papers were granted for at least a year.

<u>Prior to 1906</u>: Naturalization could take place in any court of record authorized by state or federal law. As a result many federal, state, county and municipal courts had the power to naturalize.

In 1906 The Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization was established by the Federal Government; and took over the responsibility of granting citizenship. Requirements for Naturalization were changed as follows:

- (1) Five years residence in country.
- (2) One year in State of residency.
- (3) Minimum of two years residence in U S before declar ing intent.

Naturalization records can consist of four series:

1. <u>Declaration of intent</u>--first step in the citizenship process. This involved renouncing allegiance to a former sovereign and declaring intent to become an American citizen.

Prior to 1906 the records usually included:

- (a) Applicant's name.
- (b) Country of birth or allegiance.
- (c) Date of application.
- (d) Applicant's signature.
- (e) Possible date of arrival and port of entry.

After 1906, records became more detailed and included:

- (a) Name and Age.
- (b) Occupation.
- © Personal description.
- (d) Date and place of birth.
- (e) Citizenship.
- (f) Present and foreign address.
- (g) Name of vessel and port of embarkation.
- (h) US port and arrival date.

- (I) Applicant's signature.
- 2. <u>Petition</u> -- formal application for citizenship. (These records were generally not used in the 19th Century.) This application contains:
- (a) Applicant's name and personal description.
- (b) Occupation and marital status.
- (c) Date and place of birth.
- (d) Citizenship information.
- (e) Date of emigration.
- (f) Ports of embarkation and arrival.
- (g) Names, dates, and place of birth & residences of children.
- (h) Date U S residence began.
- (i) Time of residence in State.
- (i) Any name change
- (k) Possible copies of Declaration of Intention and Certification of Arrival.
- 3. <u>Depositions</u> -- sworn statements of applicants' witnesses as to character and residency of the applicant. Witnesses could be a neighbor or a relative.
- 4. Final Papers -- actual grant of citizenship privileges.
- (a) New citizen received a copy.
- (b) Duplicate kept in court record.
- 5. Other Naturalization may be found in the National Archives.
- 6. Many of the late 19th Century and the 20th Century naturalizations from the U S District Courts in Ohio are kept at the National Archives Branch in Chicago.

The following consent was found with the marriage license application of F H Bagley and Josephine Seney, in the Seneca County Probate Court marriage records. It was dated 11 October 1858. The bride-to-be was under 18 years of age.

"As her guardian my consent is required by law for the reason, as you are doubtless aware—a minor cannot make a binding contract. But it is equally true that, in many cases, minors are as competent to judge for themselves, as at any subsequent period of their lives. And believing that, my sister has sufficient judgement and direction to decide this question for herself, her choice is with my consent. I trust that your union may be long, happy, and useful."

What Can Atlases Tell Me?

For many genealogists locating the address of an ancestor can be a major accomplishment. Specific details about the house and neighborhood is often lost to history and beyond the reach of most researchers. Below is some of the information that can be found in atlases. A good place to start any land/building search is your local library. Atlases and city/county directories should be available. Sanborn Fire Maps can be most helpful

Specifics To Be Learned:

Street addresses for both original and renumbered systems

Legal descriptions for subdivision name and lot number or township, range and part of a section Measurements copied or calculated, street corner to building or lot or acres

Counts for number of lots and buildings from corners of streets and alleys

Size of building, dimensions, shape number of stories, setback

Construction: brick, frame, stone, concrete, metal Roof: tine, composition, shingles

Features: porches, elevators, stairwells

Labels: dwelling, tenement, shop, business name

What the Neighborhood was like:

Buildings: churches, schools, firehouses, car barns, saloons, shops

Businesses: big compounds show many details Transportation: railroads, canals, livery stables, street car lines

Water for firefighting: wells, cisterns, fire plugs Other: farms, creeks, rivers, quarries, cemeteries

Who has owned this land and building

Maps and atlases: owner names by lot or just on larger lots/farms

How To Compute The Birthday Of An Ancestor

Taken from an article in <u>Guernsey Roots and Branches</u>, Nov 1995. The article refers to the March 1976 issue of <u>Genealogical Helper</u> which is published by Everton which provided a method called the "8870 formula."

Before about 1870, it was not unusual to find age inscribed on a tombstone rather than the date. Many times the date of death was followed by a statement of age given in years, months and days instead of a date of birth. It's not difficult to figure this date using simple math. Here are three methods.

- 1. If you have a computer with a genealogical program it may calculate it for you. Personal Ancestral File requires you to put the death date in as the second date, then the age in years, months and days. Simply press F1 (Calculate) and the birth date appears as the first date.
- 2. Traditional method: List the death date of May 6, 1889 on the top line by year, month expressed as a number, and day.

Death date 1889 5 6 Age: 71 7 9

Before you can subtract you have to borrow (a) 30 days from the 5 months, making it 4 months and 36 days; (b) borrow 12 months from the year making 4 + 12 = 16 months; (c) adjust the year to 1888 as a result of the borrowing; and (d) then subtract.

You then have: 1888 16 36

71 7 9

1817 9 27 or Sep 27 1817

3. The 8870 formula: Simply write the death date as before converting months and years into two digit numbers by adding a zero. Then subtract the age mathematically, making no adjustments of any kind. From your answer subtract 8870 to find the correct date of birth.

Age:	<u>710709</u>
Subtract:	18179797
Subtract 8870	8870

Date of birth: 18170927 or Sep 27 1817

Granted the computer is the easiest way, you may sometimes have to do it manually. The last way is much easier and faster.

Out On A Limb

What with these terrific winds blowing all night. It's difficult for a night owl like me to get any sleep out on this limb. While trying to get back to sleep, my musing took me to dear Aunt Jane who wanted me to write a book to trace the ancestry and tell the story of our paternal Edwards family.

At the time, Aunt Jane's idea appealed to me. I could envision a prodigious tome issuing forth from the large memory banks of our family history. That was before I'd immersed myself in our family history. Now, twenty years later, my best vision of the Edwards Family History is a brief monograph. What happened? How could my vision be changed so drastically? The problem, I suspect, is that we all possess an overinflated sense of the importance and/or depth of our family's history.

Never fear! One can still write that family history with the use of genealogy software. In an article entitled, "No monkey business in this genealogy software." Terrence L Day writing under the head of "The Family Tree" from what publication I do not know...tells how.

Rex Clement of Auburn, California has perfected the software necessary to accomplish this. It is designed to translate from Personal Ancestral File, Ancestral Quest, or Family Origins software into narrative form for publication as a book. Clement's product is called Gen-Book. You will need Word Perfect or Microsoft Word and an IBM-compatible personal computer. Day, the reviewer says, "...I can't imagine publishing a genealogy will ever get easier unless you're wealthy enough to hire professionals to do it..."

Day says that "Gen Book" "doesn't take all the pain out of publishing a genealogy, but it minimizes the toil."

The reviewer admits that he has not used the new software, because his research isn't "...ripe enough." Then goes on to say that he has experimented extensively"...and am, frankly, awed by the software's performance.

Day gives the following as the five greatest advantages are:

- Not having to type the genealogical data.
- Being able to tailor the book to your needs and wishes via a comprehensive default system.
- Indexing is automatically accomplished in your word processing application as the final step in the project.
- You don't need to learn book formatting schemes...
- · You can use Gen-Book to aid research.

Clement says many of his customers report sending pages with blanks of missing information to relatives gets a much

better response than just asking for the data.

If The Creek Don't Rise

What is the origin and significance of the expression, "if the creek don't rise?" Surprise! It doesn't mean a creek in the usual sense - a stream smaller than a river and larger than a brook or a branch. The word refers to the Creek Indians. Lloyd Bockstruck, program presenter at the Kentucky Genealogical Seminar, explained the origin. Part of his presentation was describing the pattern of migration from the eastern seaboard colonies to the Mississippi Valley states. In the South, the Creek Indians were vigorous in defending their land from being taken by the white settlers. So, for the pioneers moving west into the Alabama and Mississippi, there was always the possibility that the Creek might "rise" up against them.

Thus the expression arose; the pioneers would say that they would do something in the future if the Lord's willin' and the Creek don't rise.

What Does That Date Mean?

When reading old newspapers, letters, or manuscripts, the references to dates can be very confusing. Terms are found such as Monday instant or the 20th ULT, terms which are no longer in use today. These all had specific meanings which were generally accepted. Perhaps this list will help.

Monday instant - if used, usually means today
The 10th instant - the 10th of the present month
The 20th ultimo - the 20th of the last month
Monday last - the most recent Monday
Tuesday next - the nearest Tuesday to follow
December last - the most recent December, even though
this has been in the previous year.

While the terms next and last are written out, the term ultimo is often written ULT while instant is designated INST. It is important when interpreting these to note the date on the document being read as this is the key. Our First National Election

Our first presidential election was held 7 Jan 1789. The total number of electorial votes, apportioned by the constitution to the 13 original states, was 91. The number cast was 69, leaving 22 votes to be accounted for as follows: North Carolina and Rhode Island not having ratified the constitution when the first was held were debarred from voting, which accounts for 10 votes. The New York legislature could not agree on the manner of choosing electors, which accounts for 8 more. The remaining four were caused by vacancies.

According to the constitution each elector was allowed to vote for two candidates for president. The candidate receiving the largest number of votes to be president and the one next highest to be vice president, 34 electors voted for Washington and Adams. The remaining 35 voted for Washington, but their votes were divided among 10 candidates as their other choice, making the total stand, Washington 69, Adams 34, scattering 35.

No president since Washington has received the total vote of the electoral college. Monroe at his second election received all the electoral votes but one. One elector thought no other president should receive the honor that Washington had received, therefore voted for a candidate in opposition to Monroe.

In two states, Maryland and Virginia, the electors were chosen by the direct vote of the people. In Massachusetts the people elected two as electors at large and selected 24 names from which the legislature was to choose 8. In all the other states the electors were chosen by the several legislaters.

By 21 Jun 1788, 9 states had ratified the constitution being requisite number to make it effective. On 13 Sep 1788 the Confederate Congress, (being our national congress from 1781 to 1789 passed a law, making the first Wednesday in Jan 1789, the date for the states to choose presidential electors; the first Wednesday in February the date for the electors to vote and the first Wednesday in March the date for the assembling of Congress. The election for Representatives in many places was protracted. The New Jersey Legislature specified time for the closing, consequently the voting continued for 3 weeks, and the polls would not have been closed had not the governor of the state fixed a date after which no returns would be received. Connecticut chose 3 candidates for representative in each district at the first election These 3 names were published and a second election held to choose one from the three, the one receiving a majority to be elected. This called for repeated elections. Connecticut still retains many features of this law. Much the same manner of choosing representatives prevailed in Massachusetts.

The first house of representatives was to consist of 59 members thus requiring 30 for a quorum. It was 30 Mar before enough congressmen had arrived to make a quorum. On the arrival of the 30th member, the house proceeded at once to organize. The president was chosen from Virginia, the vice-president from Massachusetts and New York had secured the seat of government, therefore the speaker of the house was chosen from Pennsylvania. On 6 April enough senators had arrived to make a quorum of that body. They organized at once and the two houses met, counted the electoral vote and notified Washington and Adams of their election. On 30 April, Washington arrived at the seat of government and inaugurated at noon of that day. The chief justice of New York administered the oath of office. Thus our present form of government began 30 April 1789. Source: Fairfield Trace, Summer 1998.

Ohio Birth, Death and Marriage Records

Many requests are received from researchers asking for a "certificate" of birth, death or marriage. These are not available for early Ohio records. This is best explained by an article by Jocelyn Fox Wilms in the Winter 1994 OGS Report, p 181.

"In Ohio no certificates were issued for births and deaths until 20 December 1908. Before that date, there were 'returns' of births and deaths and they were just that, returns (to the courthouse).

"In 1856 Ohio enacted a statute that required the registration of births and deaths by the Clerk of Courts. *Some* Ohio (Continued on page 96)

What can you do about this very real danger? You can have each piece of film tested or do it yourself with a special "pen" from an archival products company. Your best bet with old film, however, is to have new copies made on modern film. Then, the old film should be destroyed carefully because nitric acid fumes are highly toxic.

As an example of what could happen, that 1890 census we miss so much was destroyed by a fire caused by such old film. The National Archives now stores its old film in steel drums immersed in water.

Don't let old film destroy your treasures, your house and even yourself. Take care of this hazard today.

Joseph Bush was born in Columbiana Co, OH 16 Jun 1828, and was one of 4 children born to George and Catherine (Miller) Bush, natives of Germany and PA respectively. They moved to Stark Co, OH in 1830 and there resided till their death. In 1853 Joseph moved to IN and lived in both DeKalb Co and Whitley Co. On 11 Mar 1852 he married (1) Barbara Auer who died in 1872 and married (2) Catherine Wolfert who has borne him 6 children: Amos, Sarah, Albert, Phoebe A, Wilson and Minerva J.

Sylvanus Koontz was born in Stark Co, 25 May 1844, the son of Baltzer and Susannah (Whistler) Koontz, natives of MD and PA respectively. When 9 he moved with his prents to Whitley Co, IN. He served in the Civil War in Co I, 54 INVI and Co G, 152 INVI. He attended Ohio Medical College and practiced in Forest where he lives. On 15 Mar 1874 he married (1) Marilly J Hales (1843-26 Apr 1876); on 28 Nov 1878 he married (2) Adelaid M Kilpatrick of Summit Co, OH, dtr of Hugh and Mary B (Gaylord) Kilpatrick. They had 1 child, Jessie. Baltzer Koontz, Sr was born in MD and married Catharine Harman. They had 7 boys and 2 girls. Baltzer Koontz, Jr was born in Franklin Co, MD 8 Nov 1793; married Catharine Whistler, dtr of Andrew and Catharine Whistler of Lancaster Co, PA. They had 10 boys and 4 girls.

Robert L Pence, born in Stark Co, OH on 2 Jun 1835, was one of 7 children of William and

Nancy (Black) Pence, who were natives of PA and Ireland respectively. On 22 Feb 1855 he married (1) Mary A Ummel, of Columbiana Co, OH. They had 7 children, but only 2 lived, William E and Hiram M. On 20 Mar 1867 Robert married (2) Magdalen Biery, of Columbiana Co, OH by whom he had 6 children: Norman H, Cora E, Corwin, Denver N, Charles E, and Harvey E.

B F Putt, MD is the son of John W and Mary Putt. His father was born in Washington Co. MD 24 Mar 1819, the son of Benjamin and Barbara Putt. They moved to Stark Co, OH in 1826, and settled in Massillon. Benjamin was born in 1756 and was of Holland descent. He served in the Revolutionary War. He settled in Bucks Co, PA and married Barbara Lawmen; moved to Washington Co. MD and in 1826 to Stark Co. OH where he died in 1852. John W was the 4th son and married in OH 1 Jan 1841 Mary Wiest, who was born 1 Jan 1819 in Huntingdon Co, PA, dtr of Jacob and Catharine Wiest, who emigrated from Germany to Cumberland Co, PA about 1805 and moved in 1827 to Massillon, OH. In 1853 John moved to Allen Co, IN. He had 8 children: Sarah, Harvey A, Caroline, William, John, Benjamin F, Rosana and Charlie. Benjamin F attended Western College in Ft Wayne, IN. He lost 3 fingers from his left hand by the explosion of a gun and it was then he began the study of medicine. He entered a drug store at Nine Mile, Allen Co as druggist and practiced medicine until 1876, when the Medical College at Ft Wayne was organized. On 17 Apr 1878 he married Lillian E Barger, dtr of Elias and Mary Barger, of Delaware Co, IN. They have 1 son, Harold F born 23 Sep 1880.

Maerod Schimbeckler was born in Switzerland 15 Jan 1815, one of 7 children born to Frederick and Benedicta Schimbeckler. In 1849 he came to US and worked as a carpenter in Stark Co, OH where he married on 13 May 1849 Mary Auer, a native of Germany. In 1854 they moved to Well Co, IN. They had 13 children of whom 9 were living: Mary A Walters, Fred, Leh (sic), Clark, Susan Kiefer, Frank, Katie, Lizzie, Augustus and Emma. Mrs Schimbeckler died in Oct 1866 and Maerod married in 1870, Katherine Kaufman, a native of Germany. She died in 1873.

Henry Vogeley was born in Canton Schaffhausen, Switzerland 20 Mar 1836, one of 6 children born to Jacob and Anna (Wurtenberger) Vogeley. At age 24 Henry came to this country, landing in New York in May 1860 and came directly to Stark Co, OH. He soon bought land and became a farmer. On 23 Jul 1863 he married Catharine Smith in Stark Co. In 1870 he visited the land of his birth and upon his return moved to Whitley Co, IN.

Henry Knight, Jr was born in Stark Co, OH 12 Mar 1831, son of Henry and Mary Knight. The mother died in Stark Co and the father came to IN in 1841. In 1851 Henry Jr married Nancy Witham, dtr of Elisha Witham of OH. Mrs Knight died in Mar 1874 leaving 9 children: Cornelius, Sarah J, Mary, Martha, James W, William Eliza, Clara and George.

James McKown was born near Trenton, NJ 25 Jun 1818, the son of Henry and Elizabeth McKown, natives of Ireland and NJ, who died in Stark Co, OH. James spent his boyhood in Columbiana and Stark Cos, OH. He bought land in Hancock Co, OH. On 20 Jun 1848 he married in Hancock Co Lydia Brenner, a native of Stark Co, OH and dtr of George Benner, a native of Germany. They had 11 children: George, Amanda, Mary A, Melissa, Huldah, Luke, Celeste, Oscar, Minerva, Charles and Jacob.

Castle Garden

(Written by Robert Sminkey and presented at the Genealogy Conference on Lake Erie. It has appeared in a number of newsletters including Genealogy Bits & Bytes, Parma-Cuyahoga, and Medina County Story.)

The land on which Castle Clinton now stands was originally an island one hundred feet off the tip of Manhattan, New York City, New York. The United States build the fortress in 1808-1811 to prepare for war with England, but its guns have never been fired in anger. The fortress was named Castle Clinton in honor of DeWitt Clinton, city mayor and state governor after the War of 1812. In 1824 it was renamed Castle Garden and opened for public ceremonies, demonstrations and entertainment. Samuel F B Morse demonstrated his wireless telegraph here and P T Barnum's "Swedish Nightingale," Jenny Lind, made her American debut here in 1850.

On 2 Aug 1855, Castle Garden, under lease to the State of New York, was opened as an immigrant landing depot and the castle became in Immigration center. At that point, processing immigrants was still the city's responsibility. Only a short time before, Castle Garden had been joined to the mainland by fill and fenced off from the rest of the Battery (southern tip of Manhattan). For the first time the bewildered immigrants were protected from the unsavory characters who had roamed the open wharves at will to take advantage of gullible newcomers.

Here, generally, reliable information about boarding houses, travel routes and fares could be obtained. Needed medical attention and an honest currency exchange were provided as well as a chance for employment. Between 1855 and 1889, more than eight million immigrants--two out of every three persons immigrating to the united States in this period--passed through the Garden.

After 1882 as the number of immigrants gradually increased, more buildings were erected outside the Garden. Brick replaced the wooden fences. Then, on 18 Apr 1890, the last immigrants went through Castle Garden. With control shifted to the United States Superintendent of Immigration, the Barge Office became a temporary landing depot, pending opening of the newer, more commodious center on Ellis Island (located one mile from Castle Garden in Upper New York Bay near the Statue of Liberty near New Jersey) on 1 January 1892.

Castle Clinton was once again altered, this time to become the New York City Aquarium. When the Aquarium opened its doors on 10 Dec 1896, some 30,000 people poured in to see the specimens that came from the waters around New York. The Aquarium lasted until 1941 when the doors were closed for good.

In 1946 the federal government opened it to the public as a national landmark. Inside is a circular courtyard and a small museum dedicated to the history and many lives of the massive structure.

New Archives Branch

His remains were brought to Canton and buried at Westlawn Cemetery. (OR = 14 Jan 1863),

I received a letter signed by Sharon Taylor asking me to pay \$5.00 now against a charge of \$29.50 + \$3.88 shipping + \$1.98 sales tax for a total of \$35.36. They say they have searched 170 million names all over the world (they list the countries). Less than 6 in every 10 million people share the name Wig. To me this calculates out at 102 people. The irony in this is that they did not search Norway where my ancestors came from and where I have met many people named Wig (not all related to me).

I believe one thing they say: "This is the only publication of its kind in the entire world." And thank goodness there is only one. I notice a disclaimer that they now include: "No direct geneal-ogical connection to your family or to your ancestry is implied or intended." That gets them off the hook. But if there is no connection to my ancestry, why would I want the book?

Previous sales pitches by Beatrice Bahley, Elizabeth Ross and Sharon Taylor (not all by Halberts) have raked in the money from people expecting to get a product directly relating to their own families.

Here is what the Will-Grundy IL Genealogical Society says in their Newsletter under "Mail Warning: One of our members recently received one of those letters offering a 'remarkable new book' about his family name. We have been cautioned that publications of this sort are often not what they appear to be. If they come from Ohio, be especially wary." This is the reputation that Ohio has

The writer's great-grandfather, Thomas Edwards, was a successful businessman in Barberton, Ohio. there Thomas operated his small hotel, the Edwards House, along with a livery stable. I find a paper trail of court actions filed against livery customers who, most likely, failed to pay their feed bill. Phyllis Taylor, a librarian who works in that community, has kindly sent me shards of Thomas's life with clippings from newspapers, etc. Always, I am happy to receive them. Then, one day, came a clipping reporting Thomas had been arrested. For what? It didn't say. I made a mental note to run down the lead. That was several years ago. Hubers in Europe

Submitted by Chapter Member John H Coyne whose mother was Minnie Huber dtr of Philip Huber, born in Baden-Baden, Germany who came to America in 1873 and Elizabeth Lack, born in Switzerland and came to America in 1854. They were married in 1880.

Families bearing the name of Huber will generally be found to originate from those parts of German speaking countries where Hube or hufe was a unit to measure farm land, i.e. in southern Germany and in German parts of Switzerland. In Switzerland a hub, huob or huebe used to be a plot of land about 48 acres. In the middle ages a person possessing and working a hube or farm was called huber, i.e. farmer, and sometimes this characterization became the name of such farmer's family. This explains the relative frequency of the name Huber used by families with no interrelation whatsoever. In Switzerland records of Hubers date back more than 850 years. The name is still very common among Swiss and German.

Because of The Thirty Years' War (1618-1648) many Hubers were driven from their Swiss mountain homes and fled to Germany, France and other European countries. Of all classes of people, farmers were ones who suffered the worst consequences of these civil and religious disturbances of the 17th century.

The Hubers have always been men of high principle and were ready to give their lives in defense of what they considered right. A few of those who suffered martyrdom for the sake of religion or civil rights were:

1507 - Ulrich Huber - beheaded in Holland

1529 - Wolfgang Bandhuber, a minister of Passau

1542 - Hans Huber of Waserburg, Bavaria - burned at the stake

1559 - Wolfgang Huber of Lutzenburg, Germany - perished by the sword.

1629 - Sarach Huber - tortured in Moravia
