He was pastor of Fagg's Manor, Chester County, Presbyterian Church from 1781 to 1793, when he removed to Mason County, Kentucky and thence to Ripley, Brown County, Ohio, where he died January 7, 1818, pastor of Red Oak Presbyterian Church. PICKERING—PICKEREN. From across the seas comes the following: William and Ann Pickering were in Philadelphia in 1801. What is known of their family or antecedents? William joined Old St. George's Methodist Church, February 28, 1791. Ann followed March 16. William was a shipwright, born "in foreign parts," circa 1766-7. Ann, possibly a Davis, born circa 1771, also in foreign parts. Their son James was born in 1805, at Liverpool, where both parents died. No connection has been discovered between the foregoing and the James and Jane Pickering, communicants of Christ Church in 1791. Daughter Mary Cleaver £20, provided she outlives her present husband John Cleaver. Executors: Wife Mary and son Uriah. The widow Mary renounces. Witnesses: Hezekiah Boone, John Hughes, James Hughes, John William.—Northumberland County, Pennsylvania, Registry of Wills, 1779-81, Liber I, f. 229.
