In the death of Mr. Inghram a widow is left to mourn the loss of a kind and affectionate husband and an orphan to feel the want of a moral and intellectual father.

Died - In Waynesburg on Saturday morning the 15<sup>th</sup> inst., Asa M. Knisely aged 14 years. The deceased came to his death by the kick of a horse which happened about 2 months before the time of his death.



Feb. 23, 1847

Died- On Jan. 29<sup>th</sup>, 1847, at his residence in Poland, Trumbell Co., Ohio, Mr. John McClelland, in the 84<sup>th</sup> year of his life. Some four or five years ago he had a paralytic stroke from which he never recovered, and, the effects of this, together with old age, brought him to the grave. Mr. McClelland was a native of Delaware, by early in his life removed to western Pa., Greene Co. His aged partner survives him. They had lived together more than a half century. Their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren amount in all to about 70.





## SERAPIS

The colors in this flag are red, white and blue, but the stripes are made up of three colors instead of two, and the stars are arranged differently.



In a letter to the King of Naples in 1778, Benjamin Franklin, Commissioner to France, described our nation's new flag as "having thirteen stripes alternating red, white and blue." In August of the following year, John Paul Jones sailed the Bon-Homme Richard to its fateful meeting with the Serapis. Although he won this most famous of the Revolutionary sea battles, Jones was forced to abandon his sinking Richard and transfer to the captured Serapis. The Serapis flew this flag as, battered but triumphant, she sailed into the friendly Dutch port of Texel.





# A Letter Sent Home to Friends

To William & Isabell Flenniken from Chancellor R. and Sarah Caldwell

Emerald August 28th 1865

Dear Friends.

I have been thinking for some time to write you A few lines. we are in very good health at this time. we have not had A letter from Greene Co. for some time we are always anxious to hear from there. I sa in the Republican they are still finding Oil on Dunkard but not A word about it in your nighbourhood. I suppose they are hunting for it yet. there is no oily talk about here. the most important topic here just now is some soldiers that are expected home about now. I like to live here very well. it is A pretty nice Country and very level only along the streams it is quite broken, and it is certainly very healthy. it appears like A very quiet orderly place and the neighbours very clever. Chancellor & Wm. has rented this farm for four years from next spring for \$300 dollars per year 213 acres & 150 acres cleared there is two orchards on it but not very many apples in them this year but there is plenty of peaches they are ripe now and very good if you have none just come down here some day and get some. they allow to go to raising stock but it is very hard to find about here just now. they are likely to have A great crop of Buckwheat here and also of Corn. Wheat was very poor. Chancellor wants to know whether they are boring on your farm for Oil and how many new holes are going down about there this summer he would like very much for William to come and see us and see the Country this fall or some time and whenever he does you must come along. we should like very much to see your pictures at least, if you would send them there is Methodist Meeting very convenient to us but we have not been to Presbyterian meeting yet it is 5 miles from here and the road is too rough to travel over there will be A Fair in Winchester the four last days of September. I fear they will not have any great attraction for every day. they have A very nice place to hold it their Hall is round Chancellor wants to know how your Sheep gets along and every thing in general and also how Mr. Durr & Red got along with their horse trade. write soon. yours truly
