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## First German Evangelical Lutheran Church of Houston Burial Records, 1855-1881

The original records of this church from 1851 to 1950 have been deposited with the Houston Metropolitan Research Center. The vital records from 1851 to 1978 have been microfilmed at least twice. Those films are available at Clayton Library and the Texas Room of the Houston Public Library, as well as through any LDS Library.

There are two sets of baptism records on the primary microfilm: 1847-1859, and 1851-1950. Confirmation records start in 1852, marriages in 1874, and burials about 1857. Records prior to 1918 are in German, and those prior to 1904 are in the old-style handwriting ("der alte Handschrift") as well.

The records prior to 1882 are the most difficult to read. Burial records prior to 1881 are entered in the back of the baptism book, and are presented here in the exact order shown in the original records, which is not strictly chronological. Some entries were apparently made months or even years after the event. Three people appear to have been entered twice. Unless otherwise noted, all burials prior to 14 October 1880 were conducted by Rev. Caspar BRAUN, the first pastor of this church. The amount of information given by Rev. Braun for each person varies widely. Many entries contain family relationships; most give ages; some include birthdates and immigration dates; a few describe the place of burial.

All burials from 30 Dec. 1880 through 30 Oct. 1881 (by Rev. Joseph A. BECKER) are recorded in table form on a single page, giving name, age, date of death, and cause of death for each one. The handwriting on this page is especially challenging. There follows a gap of 12 months until the next burial was recorded on 21 Oct. 1882, by Rev. Richard WASSER.

All records were first transcribed literally in German, and then translated into English. Some punctuation has been added, but periods following a numeral in the German are intended to be exactly as in the original. In German, a number followed by a period should indicate an ordinal number, e.g., "15." means "15th". However, Rev. Braun was not consistent with his dates, sometimes writing "den 15 Sept." (the 15 Sept.) and sometimes "den 15. Sept." (the 15th [of] Sept.). Consequently, when he gives ages, it is unclear whether "alt 15. Jahre" means "age 15 years" or "in his 15th year", i.e. age 14 years.

The date shown in the header and index is usually the death date, but not always, as some records have incomplete dates. Every attempt has been made to transcribe as accurately as possible, but some entries defied all efforts. Corrections are welcomed.

Selected additional information from church baptism, marriage, and confirmation records has been added in brackets (< >) where such information might clarify the burial entry. No attempt has been made to find all other references to these 154 people in the church records.

Because of the very difficult handwriting in the 1880-81 records, these were also compared to the City of Houston Death Records at Clayton Library, as transcribed by HGF volunteers several years ago, and reproduced here in braces, e.g. {HDR: }. Many spellings and a few dates are different from those in church records; the reader should consult both originals before deciding which, if either, is correct.

Assistance of the Houston Metropolitan Research Center in permitting review of the original church record books is gratefully acknowledged.



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## The Skinner Cemetery

*By Margaret Sexton Mathies, Excerpted from her book  
The Old Skinner Cemetery, Pilot Point, Denton County, Texas*

The Skinner Cemetery is listed as an abandoned cemetery, deserted and long ago left to the elements of nature and man's neglect. It is overgrown by deep underbrush which creates impenetrable barriers around the tall trees which grow unchecked throughout the grounds. The cemetery was donated to the town by Richard Skinner and is a three-acre plot located just at the edge of the city of Pilot Point. It probably began as a small community burying ground for the newcomers who had come to a western outpost of civilization from softer and more gentle areas to the north and east of Texas. The earliest burials in 1858 of Josiah Taylor and his five year old son may have been brought about by a long trek to Texas and difficulties in acclimatizing to a harsher environment.

The Skinner family had arrived in Pilot Point by 1856,<sup>1</sup> traveling by wagontrain overland from Marion County, Kentucky. Several families represented in the cemetery either traveled with them on the journey or learned from the same source about the offer of better land at cheaper prices than they could acquire in Kentucky. Other families whose names appear on tombstones arrived in Denton County by way of Missouri and Arkansas. A journey of nearly a thousand miles would never have been undertaken without the promise of a better life and the expectation that families would find not only land to establish farms and homes but also the opportunity for their children to grow and flourish. The stories told by the tombstones present an image of the community which grew up around them.

The earliest settlers, the ones who risked everything by pulling up stakes, selling out homesteads and leaving dear ones behind in a settled country to which they knew they would never return, had an amazing fortitude. Looking at the dates of birth and death, those early settlers were a hardy group who overcame the difficulties of the early years of the country and lived to what even now is considered a great age: Richard Skinner died at age 73, Lucinda Skinner age 85, J. D. Merchant Sr. age 76, Daniel Hill age 75, Nathaniel Wilson age 72, John Russell age 82, Daniel Wills age 88, Mary Graham age 81, Catherine Taylor age 80. Disease and disaster came to all of them, and yet they had the hardihood to withstand the onslaughts of time, surviving in many instances beyond the lives of their children.

Alongside these hardy pioneers, the tombstones also reflect the tragedies that beset even the young and strong. Childbirth took its toll of the young mothers at a very high rate, and youngsters from birth to three years were never safe from fevers, measles, whooping cough, and other infectious diseases that came and went with the seasons. Out of the 68 names in the cemetery, six are of young mothers who died in childbirth, and twelve are infants three years old or younger.

Epidemics of yellow fever were frequent dangers to the early Texas communities, and during the years of 1872 and 1873 the areas from Denison to Sherman were swept by the sickness and many deaths were recorded.<sup>2</sup> At least seven names in the Skinner Cemetery can most likely be attributed to the yellow fever epidemic: Pocahontas Turner, Isaac Inmon, Martha West, Mary West, Juda Wilson, Prissie Wilson, and Sarah Wilson. The Wilson sisters, Prissie and Sarah, died within two months of each other.

Cemetery records are of interest to genealogists not only because of the verification of dates of birth and death, but also because of the many clues available for making family connections. The information about the families in the Skinner Cemetery has been gathered from the 1860, 1870 and 1880 census records, the 1974 Denton County Historical Commission Cemetery Survey conducted by Hazel Shelton,<sup>3</sup> various family records such as correspondence or written recollections, and published Denton County histories. The original purpose of tracing the census records was to identify the families who came with the Skinners from Kentucky, but other family connections became apparent during the search.

The Skinner Cemetery was sold by John Skinner in November 1905 to the Skinner Cemetery Association.<sup>4</sup> Only one burial, that of Joe Mylo Phipps in 1928, is recorded after 1901. There are 68 names that can reliably be recorded as either still having markers in the cemetery or were listed in the 1974 Shelton survey. There are other "probable" names such as the Short daughters which more than likely could be included but cannot be verified. Unfortunately, some of the early markers were simple field stones without names inscribed, most of which have been lost through the years. There were probably about 200 graves in the cemetery by 1901. In 1987 a local church group cleared a wide swath of the cemetery using a bulldozer, and the actual placement of the broken stones can never be accurately determined. The path the bulldozer took can be clearly seen when looking at a map of the current location of stones – a large area through

the center has no permanent markers and a massive pile of rubble was left. There was one advantage in the cemetery being so overgrown with large trees and underbrush – a long line of original gravestones are still standing along the eastern fence line and out of the line of vision of someone working in the central part. That is also true of the Graham, Holford and Hughes gravesites near Debbie Lane, which have been left intact. Despite the abject appearance of the cemetery, its occupants should not be remembered as simply lost remnants of a time gone by. There is still a dignity, a lasting vestige of respect remaining in the quiet spaces surrounding the forgotten tombstones.

The Skinner Cemetery received an Official Texas Historical Marker on April 15, 1998. W. O. Skinner, retired Postmaster at Pilot Point, preserved the remaining tombstones in photographs and these can be seen in the book “The Old Skinner Cemetery” by Margaret Sexton Mathies, which is available at Clayton Library. The following information is all that is known about those who were buried in the cemetery.

**W. H. Alcorn**

Jan. 6, 1845 - Mar. 9, 1894

No census records were found for W. H. Alcorn. In the 1860 Denton County Census,<sup>5</sup> there was a James M. Alcorn, age 60, born in Tennessee with children born in Missouri, a Joseph F. Alcorn, age 22, born in Missouri, and L. Alcorn, age 37, born in Tennessee.

The tombstone for W. H. Alcorn, with a curved top, has an open Bible carved on it.

**Mary Augier**

1856(?) - April 27, 1883

Mary's tombstone is very ornate with a curved top, a wreath-like border around the sides of the front and a hand with the index finger pointing toward heaven. Mary was the wife of Pierre F. Augier, who was born in France. They were living in Rockwall County in 1880<sup>6</sup> and her mother, Clara Lainaice, and brother Isaac Lainaice were living with them. Although the handwritten name appears to be spelled “Lainaice” in the census records, it may have been “Lawrence.”

**N. C. Baldwin**

April 3, 1852 - May 20, 1898

In the 1880 Denton County Census<sup>7</sup> N. C. Baldwin, born in Tennessee, and wife Mary had two baby daughters: Fannie, age 2, and Emma, age 4 months. See below for Emma (Emelie). The graves of the Baldwin family (father, daughter, and son) were marked with slender square marble columns originally placed on a square base. The column for N. C. Baldwin has clasped hands in a recessed oval at the top and at the bottom are double scribed lines bordering what appears to be a band of oak leaves.

**Emelie Baldwin**

January 10, 1880 - June 6, 1881

Little Emma died at 18 months. Her tombstone is a graceful column capped with a round tiered finial. The top of the column has an ascending dove with a floral motif above; the base of the column has two horizontal scribed lines.

**J. H. Baldwin**

July 8, 1888 - August 3, 1888

The finial for this stone is gone. It also has the dove, floral motif, and two horizontal lines, and it is placed near what was a base for one of the family markers.

**Daniel N. Bates**

March 15, 1827 - November 23, 1886

The tombstone for Daniel N. Bates has disappeared, but it was recorded in the June 1974 cemetery survey taken by Hazel Shelton.

Daniel Bates was the son of Squire and "Polly" Nash Bates, and his wife Susana was the daughter of Lewis and Nancy Walston Raley.<sup>8</sup> In the 1860 and 1870<sup>9</sup> Denton County Census both Daniel and Susana are listed as being born in Kentucky, and it is interesting to note that in 1870 they were living in the household of L. Alexander Hill (this "household" was made up of the two adult Bates and their six children and L.A. and Louisa Hill, their infant daughter and three other adults). The Skinner, Bates, Nash, Walston and Raley families have extensive ties going back to Marion County, Kentucky,<sup>10</sup> and to Nelson County, Virginia, in 1810<sup>11</sup> and earlier and it appears they migrated to various locales as a group.

**Bluford Bell**

May 5, 1809 - January 27, 1863

A stone footmarker with the initials "B. B." is all that remains, but the stone that originally marked the grave of Bluford Bell was recorded in the Shelton 1974 survey. In the 1860 Denton County Census he is recorded as born in South Carolina with the occupation of wagonmaker. He was living in the household of Claiborne Merchant.

**(Molly Ann) Black**

September 27, 1860 - March 21, 1862

The stone for this child is also missing, but it was recorded in the 1974 survey. She was the daughter of Robert F., born in Alabama, and Louisa Black, born in Tennessee. In the 1860 Denton County Census, they were a young couple of 22 and 17 and Molly Ann was their first child, born shortly after the census was taken. Happily, in the 1870 Census they are shown with four other children.

**James C. Chastain**

June 1, 1876 - March 11, 1877

The only information about this child is from the inscription recorded in the 1974 survey; no stone remains. He was the child of S. H. and V. H. Chastain.

**N. M. C.**

A footmarker next to Polly Crites - no further information but most likely a member of the Crites family.

**C.**

Another footmarker, probably for Polly Crites.

**Polly (Mary A.) Crites**

July 1820 - September 29, 1877

Polly was the wife of Conard Crites and mother of at least eight children. According to the 1860 Denton County Census, all of the family including a three year old child were born in Missouri. This puts their location in Denton County sometime after 1857.

Her tombstone has fallen and is broken in half, but is still legible. The curved top is indented with a carved floral wreath, a small ornate flourish is beneath the inscription, and a heavy scribed line borders the entire inscription.

**R. Fortenberry**

December 21, 1821 - April 19, 1874

Oliver Fortenberry, his wife Harriet and daughter Mary are listed in the 1870 Denton County Census as coming from Arkansas. He was a farmer and, although the records don't indicate that he was a person of particular wealth, his grave is more elaborate and different from others in the Skinner Cemetery. Surrounded by a large limestone false crypt with sides as wide as a bench, the center is now open but at one time may have had a cover. Standing in the center of one end is the tombstone which has at top center a four-petal flower, either a rose or tobacco blossom, with flowers and leaves on each side. Just below the flower is a recessed circle containing an open "Holy Bible" with leaf ornamentation below, and the name printed in a curve beneath it. There is no record of any other family member being buried here.

**John T. French**

March 7, 1871 - November 16, 1892

John T. and Joseph C. were the sons of James L. and Ann E. French. The stone for John T., now fallen and buried in the ground, is a tall marble column with a softly pointed top which has indentations on each side. The stone carver mistakenly listed the mother's initials as "E. A."

**Joseph C. French**

March 28, 1873 - September 9, 1874

Joseph's stone has also fallen down, even though it is still attached to a large base. It has the traditional curved top and figure of a resting lamb, with the name lettered in a curve just below. Information in the 1880 Denton County Census<sup>12</sup> shows James L. French was born in Tennessee and Ann E. French was born in Missouri; all of their children were born in Texas.

**Minnie L. Gist**

January 2, 1870 - September 12, 1870

The tombstone for Minnie Gist has also disappeared. She was the daughter of Julian N. and Ruth Gist who, according to the 1860 Denton County Census, were born in Tennessee. Their two oldest children were also born in Tennessee, but the three younger children were born

in Texas which indicates the Gist family was in Texas and possibly Denton County by 1853. Julian was probably the “Jule Gist” mentioned as one of the “prominent stockmen” in Denton County in Ed. F. Bates “History and Reminiscences of Denton County.”

**James Graham**

April 5, 1810 - September 9, 1867

This James Graham’s grave is marked by a marble stone which has been bolted together and placed on a square flat base. Just below the pointed top are the words “Gone Home” with a stern hand pointing upward toward heaven. The name is printed in an upward curve with flourishes above, and a deep scribed line surrounds the inscription.

**James Graham**

April 5, 1808 - September 9, 1867

**Mary Graham**

June 14, 1808 - August 1, 1889

Husband and wife, James and Mary Graham share a stately granite marker in the shape of a pulpit with a closed Bible placed on it. The front has a bas-relief carving of five steps leading up to a large arch with a gate opening, presumably, into heaven. The figure of an anchor hangs just inside the gate and a curved scroll is just above the anchor. Below the pulpit is a square stone with the following inscription carved on it: “Their Bodies Are Buried in the Dust But Their Names Shall Live Forevermore.” A larger square base has “Graham” inscribed on it. The right side of the pulpit has the inscription for James Graham, and the left side has the inscription for Mary, wife of James Graham.

The Grahams came to Texas from Tennessee and were recorded in the 1860 Cooke County census.<sup>14</sup> A Jim Graham and J. C. Thomas owned an early grist mill a block south of the Pilot Point square.<sup>15</sup> This mill later became the Pilot Point Roller Mill Company.

At first it appears there is an error or duplication in the dates for the two James Grahams, but there are three distinct footmarkers clearly marked *JG*, *JG*, and *MG*. There are, indeed, two James Grahams with a common birthday of April 5 two years apart and who died on the same date, September 9, 1867. The Graham plot, on the far west side of the cemetery and facing the street, is well maintained.

## **E. W. G.**

A single footmarker - no identifying information is available.

## **Daniel Hill**

1809 - 1884

Daniel Hill was born in North Carolina, living with his son Lawson Alexander Hill in the 1870 Denton County census. His stone, standing on a square base, is of limestone with a curved top and a raised hand with index finger pointing toward heaven. The plaintive inscription "Gone But Not Forgotten" asks for remembrance even now.

## **Louisa C. Hill**

1840(?) - February 28, 1897

Louisa Hill and her husband Lawson Alexander Hill came to Texas from Missouri about 1860. Her simple limestone marker is still standing on a square base and has clasped hands at the top, signifying the connection between this world and the next, with the inscription "Our Darling One Hath Gone Before To Greet Us On the Blissful Shore." She was the daughter-in-law of Daniel Hill, above, who was living in her household in 1870.

## **William E. Hill**

May 27, 1880 - May 8, 1883

The son of Louisa and L. A. Hill, William was listed as "George" born May 1880, in the 1880 Denton County Census. Since the census was taken when the child was only a month old, perhaps the parents had not yet decided on a name. His stone is similar in appearance to his mother's, limestone with a curved top and a reclining lamb at the top. The inscription "Weep Not Papa and Mama for Me, For I Am Waiting in Heaven for Thee" is at the bottom of the stone.

## **Mathew Holford**

March 13, 1808 - November 1, 1869

## **Harriet Holford**

February 2, 1812 - August 2, 1870

Mathew Holford and his wife, Harriet, were listed in the 1860 Grayson County Census<sup>16</sup> as coming to Pilot Point from Tennessee. He was a minister, probably Baptist, at Elizabethtown. The Holford's stone, a large granite marker with a scrolled top and double base, is the only stone

in a large plot surrounded by a cement curb. This is the only curbed family plot in the Skinner Cemetery.

**Mary Hughes**

September 1872 - October 28, 1872

Little Mary, infant daughter of H. A. and Mary A. Hughes, has a very large monument for one so small. A limestone obelisk on a heavy base, the inscription is very plain with no other decoration.

**Mary A. Hughes**

1853 - October 19, 1872

Little Mary's mother, Mary A., died nine days before her daughter, probably from complications of childbirth. Her tombstone, also a limestone obelisk on a heavy base, has lost the top portion of the column. Near the center, an open bible is pictured surrounded by a deeply cut border, and it is overlaid with a figure of the cross and anchor.

H. A. Hughes is listed in the 1880 Grayson County census<sup>17</sup> with a wife, M. V., and two small daughters. His occupation is given as physician.

**Isaac Inmon**

January 10, 1809 - July 24, 1873

Recorded in the 1974 cemetery survey, there is no stone for Isaac Inmon and no other information is available.

**Lizzie B. Ives**

November 6, 1847 - September 10, 1875

This stone has also disappeared. No Ives family was found in census records, and no other information is available.

**Elisabeth R. McFarlane**

October 14, 1850 - November 20, 1871

The wife of J. L. McFarlane and the daughter of S. P. and Mary Brown, the age of Elisabeth McFarlane indicates she more than likely died in childbirth. Her stone, now almost buried with only the top third visible, appears to be poured cement and the faint inscription does not seem to be professional but rather done by an amateur hand.

J. L. McFarlane was the son of Angus W. and Mary Cutbirth McFarlane, who came to Texas about 1853 from Arkansas. Another son, Wash McFarlane, married Mollie Skinner, daughter of John and Jane Bracken Skinner and the granddaughter of Richard and Lucinda Skinner. A second daughter of John Skinner, Sarah Alice, married J. B. Cutbirth, who was living with the McFarlanes in 1860.

Elisabeth's parents, Samuel P. and Mary Brown, were living in Collin County in the 1860 Census.<sup>18</sup> Their six children, including Elisabeth, were all born in Texas. Samuel Brown was born in Virginia and Mary Brown was born in Missouri.

### **Merchant**

Child of Claiborne W. and Mary Francis Merchant, this is a broken stone with no dates or indication of the child's name. Claiborne and Mary Francis are listed with three daughters and one son in the 1870 Denton County census, and his occupation is listed as farmer and drygoods merchant. The 1880 Callahan County census<sup>19</sup> shows them with two daughters and four sons and his occupation as cattleraiser. His mother, Sarah, aged 75 and who was born in Tennessee, was living with them.

### **D. Merchant, Sr.**

August 24, 1800 - December 8, 1876

J. D. Merchant, Sr., was prominent in the affairs of Pilot Point for many years. He built the first brick building in the city, which is still standing and in use today on the northwest corner of the square. The 1870 Denton County census records indicate he was born in Tennessee. His grave is marked by a large limestone obelisk which is still standing and in good condition, but the inscription is very faint and difficult to read.

### **Ortez**

The only Spanish surname in the cemetery, the stone has disappeared and there is no information about the individual who was buried here.

**Joe Mylo Phipps**

April 16, 1928 - April 27, 1928

This infant appears to be the last person buried in the Skinner Cemetery. The stone is still standing on its base, and is very plain with only the inscription. No other information is available.

**Arie Belle Coleman Rea**

February 25, 1851 - May 22, 1879

The 1974 cemetery survey by Hazel Shelton records that Arie Belle was the wife of David Neil Rea and states there was no headstone. David N. Rea is listed in the 1880 Denton County Census with three small children ages nine, five and three. He was from Alabama and Arie Belle was from Indiana.

**Rufus L. Rudd**

June 12, 1842 - March 14, 1900

Mentioned in the 1974 cemetery survey, the stone for Rufus Rudd cannot be found in the cemetery. It doesn't appear that Rufus Rudd ever married; he is listed in the 1880 Denton County Census living with his mother, Sarah, and two spinster sisters. All were born in North Carolina.

**John Russell**

Jan. 26, 1797 - June 11, 1879

**Jane Russell**

April 4, 1816 - July 9, 1866

The Russell stone is a double memorial and has been broken in several places. The double curved top is embellished with deeply carved rounded flourishes over a thin banner spelling "Farewell" above clasped hands. The names and dates are carved in large letters, and below them in smaller script is written the inscription "Life is real, life is earnest, and the grave is not its goal. Dust thou art, to dust return was not spoken of the soul."

Unfortunately, no other information is available about the Russells. There is a John Russell living near the Skinners in Marion and Washington Counties, Kentucky, during the 1830 and 1840 census, but it is only speculation that this is the same Russell.

**S.**

A footmarker located on the far west side of the cemetery, near the road.

**Ida May Saling**

Sept. 7, 1877 - June 29, 1901

The tombstone for Ida May Saling is made of extremely heavy granite, which has fallen and is buried in the ground with only the top surface showing. The part that is buried appears to be heavily carved with vines and flowers. There is also a footmarker inscribed with **I. M. S.** A young woman of 24, Ida May probably died from complications of childbirth and her child, J. H. Saling, died six weeks later.

**H. S.**

A footmarker located next to the tombstone of Ida May Saling, it marks the grave of J\_\_\_\_\_ Saling.

**J\_\_\_\_\_ Saling**

May 20, 1901 - August 13, 1901

This stone was recorded in the 1974 survey, but only the footmarker exists today.

**James L. Shelton**

Jan. 5, 1863 - Feb. 15, 1863

This pretty tombstone, broken off its base, is of limestone with a curved top featuring a deep scribed line bordering oak leaves above a reclining lamb. The letters "James L." are raised, and the rest of the inscription is carved into the stone.

**J. G. Shelton**

Sept. 17, 1854 - Feb. 23, 1877

The top section of this stone is missing – only the name and dates remain. The bottom section has a broad, deep line surrounding the lettering. The two Sheltons buried here are probably from the same family, but there is no other information about them.

**Joel Short**

Feb. 20, 1821 - Jan. 28, 1875

**Elizabeth Short**

June 6, 1826 - Dec. 2, 1878

Elizabeth Short was the daughter of Lucinda and Richard Skinner. She and her husband, Joel, came to Texas from Kentucky about 1855 and were probably the first members of the family to migrate.<sup>20</sup> They had several children and one of them, Alvina, who died Nov. 3, 1876, was probably buried in the Skinner Cemetery next to her parents. A large sandstone base was found buried near the double stone of Elizabeth and Joel, and a single sandstone base was found next to it. More than likely it held the tombstone for Allie. Another of the Short daughters, Susan Belle, married Peter Crites, son of Pollie and Conard Crites. Susan Belle died during childbirth Jan. 14, 1873, and was buried at Pilot Point, and it seems probable her grave is also in the Skinner Cemetery. The Short family has a long connection with the Skinner family, and these ties can be found in the census and tax records of Kentucky and Virginia back to 1810.

**Lucinda Skinner**

Jan. 29, 1805 - June 28, 1890

**Richard Skinner**

1790 - Dec. 12, 1863

Lucinda Glasscock Skinner was born in Barren County, Kentucky, the daughter of Wharton and Nancy Glasscock. She married Richard Skinner in Washington County, Kentucky, June 10, 1824.<sup>21</sup> Their marriage produced fourteen children, one of whom died in infancy. According to Lucinda's obituary,<sup>22</sup> it was the desire of Lucinda and Richard to give each of their children a portion of land and that prompted the decision to move from Kentucky to Texas. They settled in Pilot Point about 1856, and the land for the Skinner Cemetery was contributed from their homeplace as a burial place for the community. Several of their sons served in the Confederate Army and one of them, Francis, was killed in the war. After Richard's death in 1863, Lucinda continued to live on the Skinner farm until shortly before her death. She was a fervent Baptist, and was an active member of the community for many years.

Richard Skinner, son of Burdit and Nancy Austin Skinner, was born in Virginia and lived in Nelson County, VA, until about 1817, when he moved to Washington County, Kentucky. His first purchase of land was in 1824,<sup>23</sup> shortly before his marriage to Lucinda, and through the years he added to his holdings. The decision to move to Texas was prompted by the promise of

plentiful land at low prices. The move was made by covered wagon, and at the time they arrived in Texas Pilot Point was a small settlement on the edge of the frontier.

Richard Skinner's tombstone, made of limestone with a curved top, is somewhat unusual in that his name is printed in flourishing curves, with nothing else inscribed other than the date of his death and his age, 73 years. Lucinda Skinner's tombstone, however, is very typical of the 1890's Victorian style. The same size as Richard's, it has a curved top with clasped hands underneath, her name and dates inscribed below, and a long verse inscribed in smaller letters filling the lower part of the stone.

**Eliza Stelzer**

July 31, 1825 - Nov. 18, 1875

**Albert S. Stelzer**

Mar. 8, 1853 - Jan. 28, 1874

This stone, located at the far northeast corner of the cemetery, is double-sided and very interesting in appearance. Broken in half, the lower section is in poor condition, but the top half is very clear. Made of limestone with a high arched curve, Eliza's side has "Saved by Grace" carved just below the curve, with a reclining lamb in a recessed oval. Albert, the son, has a raised border around the curve, "Gone Home" inscribed just below, and a hand with the index finger pointing toward heaven carved in a recessed circle underneath.

The 1870 Denton County census lists Martin Stelzer, born in Saxony, Germany, as a farmer and blacksmith. His wife Eliza was born in Virginia, and his son Albert S. was born in the Choctaw Indian Territory. Martin appears in the 1880 census with another wife, Jane.

**Catherine Taylor**

Nov. 17, 1820 - Aug. 18, 1900

**Josiah Taylor**

Jan. 23, 1814 - Jul. 30, 1858

**Josiah Taylor**

Died March 6, 1858

The three Taylor graves are enclosed in a small fenced area on the far south side of the cemetery. The burial in 1858 of the two Josiah Taylors, father and son, are the earliest recorded graves in the Skinner Cemetery. Catherine Taylor is shown in the 1870 Denton County census

living with another son, Andrew. Catherine Taylor was born in Kentucky, but her son Andrew was born in Missouri, and they probably came to Texas by the Arkansas route.

**Pocahontas Turner**

Jan. 9, 1830 - Jan. 7, 1873

The stone for Pocahontas Turner can no longer be found in the cemetery. She was born in Kentucky and is listed in the 1860 and 1870 census with James Turner, but it is unclear whether she was his daughter or his wife. We are assuming she was his daughter, because James Turner is listed in the 1830 Washington County, Kentucky, census<sup>24</sup> with a daughter under age 5. James Turner is listed as an attorney, born in Virginia, in the 1860 Denton County census. In 1870 the Turners were the proprietors of a private boarding house in Pilot Point.

James Turner was possibly a part of the group that migrated from Virginia to Kentucky to Texas with the Skinners.

**Bell Z. Vanderslice**

Feb. 8, 1866 - Dec. 16, 1882

**J. S. Vanderslice**

June 3, 1869 - Oct. 16, 1895

**Rebecca Vanderslice**

April 26, 1835 - March 31, 1895

Rebecca Matilda Vanderslice was the wife of John A. Vanderslice, who came to Texas from Alabama about 1860. There is a possibility that Ida May Saling was their daughter; the 1880 census lists their five children: Nancy, age 19; Josephine, age 18; Bell, age 15; Scott J. (probably J. S. above), age 11; and Ida, age 3, which is the right age for Ida May Saling. The Saling and Vanderslice graves are located in the same area in the far southeast side of the cemetery. The Vanderslice family was living next door to the N. C. Baldwin family in the 1880 census, their burial sites are also next to each other, and it is likely the two families were related.

Rebecca's tombstone has fallen and only the front surface is visible. The top is rounded with a hand pointing toward heaven carved just above the name. The footmarker with "R. M. V." carved in it is nearby. There is no stone for J. S. Vanderslice. The tombstone for the daughter, Bell, is still standing. It has a slightly curved top, with a deep line enclosing the inscription and a hand pointing toward heaven just below the center.

**Frances Annabel Wellborn**

July 14, 1811 - Dec. 4, 1893

**John C. Wellborn**

Feb. 20, 1893, Age 85 Years, 1 Month, 16 Days

**Leonia Wellborn**

June 18, 1893

These individuals were recorded in the 1974 survey with the notation that there were no headstones. One can only wonder why the year 1893 was such a devastating period for them. Frances was the wife of John C. and was born in Cayuga County, New York. Leonia was the wife of Thomas Wellborn and she was 23 at the time of her death. The John Wellborn family was among the early members of the First Christian Church in Pilot Point.<sup>15</sup>

**Martha J. West**

July 27, 1848 - Sept. 26, 1872

**Mary B. West**

June 20, 1871 - Sept. 28, 1872

These stones were listed in the 1974 survey but are no longer in the cemetery. In the 1860 Denton County census Mary's husband, Robert West, is listed as a young farmer from Indiana. His wife and child may have been victims of a yellow fever epidemic which raged through the area from Denison to Sherman during 1872 and 1873.

**Daniel Wills**

Oct. 16, 1786 - Feb. 5, 1874

Daniel Wills, age 83 and born in North Carolina, was living in the household of Conard Crites in the 1870 Denton County Census. He may have been the father of Mary A. "Polly" Crites. His stone is a simple one, with a rounded top and his name carved to follow the curve.

Sept. 1, 1813 - Oct. 19, 1885

**Cretia Wilson**

There were several Wilson families living in the Pilot Point area in the 1860s and 1870s, but no census records were found for Nathaniel Wilson. His tombstone is in very bad condition, broken in half and much of the lettering is faded. Made of limestone, it has a curved top, with clasped hands in a recessed circle just below. The tombstones for Juda and Cretia Wilson are matched in shape, with curved tops notched at each side. Juda's stone also has the clasped hands, while Cretia's stone has an ascending dove carved just below the top.

**Prissie Wilson**

Aug. 1, 1848 - Sept. 12, 1873

**Sarah E. Wilson**

Feb. 18, 1854 - July 15, 1873

The Wilson sisters, daughters of S. B. and M. A. Wilson, were probably victims of the yellow fever epidemic that threatened East Texas communities in 1872 and 1873. Juda Wilson, above, may have also died as a result of the epidemic. The tombstones for Prissie and Sarah are badly broken, but their design was simple and beautiful. Identical in size and shape, the top follows the contours of the carved rose and its leaves, and just below the rose is an ascending dove carrying a broken bough in its beak.


**E. Wilson**

This stone has only a small portion above the ground, and no definite identification can be made.


**Unknown**

**ALIEF CEMETERY**

The first permanent settlers in this area were Dr. John Magee and his wife, Alief, who came from Ellis County in 1896. The community originally was known as Dairy, but was renamed in 1897 for Mrs. Magee, the town's first postmistress. By 1899, there was a small but growing community here, with most families involved in ranching and farming.

In 1900, the need for a cemetery became evident, and this property was deeded for use as a graveyard by Francis I. Meston to Dr. John Magee, Newton Gentry, and Hardy Price. Many of the early settlers are buried here, including Alief Magee (1851-1899) and cotton farmer John D. Cook (1857-1954). About one-half of the approximately 100 graves are those of babies, pointing to the hardships resulting from childbirth and infant diseases.

The 1900 hurricane caused much property damage in Alief, and many families became discouraged and left the community. Most of them later returned to help fight the problem of area flooding, including organization of the first Harris County Flood Control District.

Although little evidence of the original community remains, the Alief cemetery stands as a reminder of its pioneer heritage. The graves are maintained by the Alief Cemetery Historical Association.
